- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 43-11-27.2 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the practice of advanced skin care; to amend and reenact sections 43-11-01,
- 3 43-11-20, and 43-11-28 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation of the
- 4 practice of advanced skin care by the state board of cosmetology; to provide for application;
- 5 and to provide an effective date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 **43-11-01. Definitions.**

- 10 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- 11 1. <u>"Advanced skin care" means the practice of microdermabrasion, dermaplaning, or</u>
- 12 <u>collagen induction therapy.</u>
- 13 <u>2.</u> "Board" means the state board of cosmetology.
- 14 2.3. "Booth space" means that part of a licensed salon thatwhich is operated independently
 15 by an individual licensed under this chapter.
- 16 <u>3.4.</u> "Cosmetologist" means an individual licensed under this chapter to practice
 17 cosmetology.
- 18 4.<u>5.</u> "Cosmetology" means any one or a combination of practices generally and usually
- 19 performed by and known as the occupation of beauty culturists or cosmeticians or
- 20 cosmetologists or hairdressers, or of any other personindividual holding out as
- 21 practicing cosmetology by whatever designation and within the meaning of this
- 22 chapter and in and upon whatever place or premises; and in particular cosmetology.
- 23 <u>The term</u> includes the following or any one or a combination of practices: arranging

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1		a. <u>Arranging</u> , dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching,					
2		coloring, or similar work, upon the hair of any person by any means or with hands					
3		or mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances, or by the use of cosmetic					
4		preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams, or otherwise, massaging,					
5		cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, or exercising, performing;					
6		b. Performing noninvasive hair removal, beautifying, or similar work on the body,					
7		manipulation;					
8		c. Manipulating of eyelashes, or manicuring the nails of any person;					
9		d. Performing skin care; or					
10		e. Manicuring.					
11	<u>5.6.</u>	"Cosmetology salon" includes that part of any building in which the occupation of a					
12		cosmetologist is practiced.					
13	6.<u>7.</u>	"Esthetician" means a person who isan individual licensed by the board to engage in					
14		the practice of skin care.					
15	7.<u>8.</u>	"Homebound" means any personindividual who is ill, disabled, or otherwise unable to					
16		travel to a salon.					
17	<u>8.9.</u>	"Instructor" means any person of the age ofan individual who is at least eighteen years					
18		or moreof age, who is a licensed cosmetologist, who teaches cosmetology or any					
19		practices taught in a duly registered school of cosmetology, and who has met the					
20		requirements of section 43-11-27 and has applied for and received an instructor's					
21		license.					
22	9.<u>10.</u>	"Invasive care" means anya procedure, other than advanced skin care, that invades					
23		the live tissue of the dermis, including:					
24		a. Laser use; and					
25		b. Chemical peels using:					
26		(1) Thirty percent or higher concentration of alpha hydroxy acid;					
27		(2) Twenty percent or higher concentration of beta hydroxy acid;					
28		(3) Two percent or higher concentration of resorcinol;					
29		(4) Fifteen percent or higher concentration of trichloroacetic acid (TCA); or					
30		(5) Fifteen percent or higher concentration of phenol.

"Manicuring" means the cleansing, cutting, shaping, beautifying, or massaging of 2 thean individual's hands, feet, or nails of any person. 3 11.<u>12.</u> "Manicurist" means a person who isan individual licensed by the board to engage in 4 the practice of manicuring. 5 12.<u>13.</u> "Master cosmetologist" means any personan individual who has met the requirements 6 of section 43-11-26 and has applied for and received a managing cosmetologist 7 license. 8 13.14. "School of cosmetology" means an establishment operated for the purpose of teaching 9 cosmetology. 10 14.15. "Skin care" means the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, 11 creams, or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, performing 12 noninvasive hair removal, beautifying, or similar work on the body of any personan 13 individual. The term includes advanced skin care. The term does not include invasive 14 care. 15 15.<u>16.</u> "Student" means any person who isan individual engaged in the learning or acquiring 16 of any or all the practices of cosmetology and while so learning or acquiring, performs 17 or assists in any of the practices of cosmetology in anya school registered or licensed 18 and under the immediate supervision of an instructor licensed as such under this-19 chapter. 20 16.17. "Student instructor" means a cosmetologist who is receiving instruction in teacher's 21 training in a duly registered school of cosmetology. 22 17.18. "Tuition" means the total cost of a person's an individual's cosmetology studies, and. 23 The term does not include books or demonstration kits. 24 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is 25 amended and reenacted as follows: 26 43-11-20. Student practice. 27 A student certified under this chapter, while attending a school of cosmetology, may assist 28 in any of the practices of cosmetology if under the immediate direction and supervision of a-29 licensedan instructor. The student may not assist in the practice of advanced skin care unless 30 the supervising instructor is certified under section 43-11-27.2 to practice advanced skin care.

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1 SECTION 3. Section 43-11-27.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted

8	<u>2.</u>	The board shall determine the qualifications for certification to practice advanced skin							
9		care and annual certification fees. The qualifications established by the t	<u>y the board under</u>						
10		this section for initial certification must include completion of forty hours of education							
11		or continuing education directly related to the practice of advanced skin care and for							
12		recertification, annual completion of thirty hours of continuing education directly rel							
13		to the practice of advanced skin care.							
14	<u>3.</u>	A certificate issued under this section is valid through December thirty-first of the year							
15		of issuance. If a certificate holder under this section fails to timely renew the certificate,							
16		the individual may not practice advanced skin care until the individual is recertified. If a							
17		certificate holder under this section fails to recertify within one year from the date of							
18		expiration of the certificate, the individual is subject to initial certification	before the						
19		individual may practice advanced skin care.							
20	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-28 of the North Dakota Century Code is

20	<u>3.</u>	The board shall sponsor an educational program for licenseholders to carry out the							
21		purposes of protecting the public health and safety and maintaining capable and							
22		skilled cosmetologists, manicurists, estheticians, and instructors. The board shall use							
23		such portion of the renewal fees as the board may determine for the purpose of							
24		providing the educational program.							
25	SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE - APPLICATION. This Act becomes effective January 1,								
26	2021. The state board of cosmetology shall implement the provisions of this Act for advanced								
27	skin care certification years beginning after December 31, 2020.
