2	section 34-15-04, and subsection 3 of section 34-15-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,
3	relating to the new hire registry for child support; to provide a penalty; and to provide an
4	effective date.for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 34-15 of the North Dakota
5	Century Code, relating to new hire reporting of independent contractors; and to provide an
6	effective date.

8	——SEC	CTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 34-15-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
9	amended and reenacted as follows:		
10	34- 1	15-01. Definitions.	
11	— As t	used in this chapter:	
12	1.	"Contractor" means an individual hired to provide services for or on behalf of an	
13		employer in the course of the employer's trade or business, if the aggregate payment	
14		for the services is sufficient for the employer to be required to file an internal revenue	
15		service form 1099-MISC or substantially equivalent form and report the payment on	
16		the form as nonemployee compensation.	
17	<u> 2.</u>	"Date of hire" means the date services for remuneration were first performed by the	
18		employee or contractor.	
19	<u> 2.3.</u>	"Department" means the department of human services.	
20	-3.<u>4.</u>	"Employee" means an individual who would be determined to be an employee under	
21		chapter 24 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended [26 U.S.C. 3401	
22		et seq.], but does not include an employee of a federal or state agency performing	
23		intelligence or counterintelligence functions, if the head of the agency has determined	
24		that reporting under this chapter, with respect to that employee, could endanger the	

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transmit a report conforming to subsection 1 to that state. An employer whothat reports-

- pursuant to this subsection mustshall notify the secretary of the United States department of health and human services, in writing, of the state so designated.
- 3. Any department, agency, or instrumentality of the United States shall transmit a report, conforming to subsection 1, to the national directory of new hires established pursuant to section 453 of the Social Security Act [42 U.S.C. 653].
- 4. a. Except as provided in subdivision b, a report required under this section must be made no later than twenty days after the date the employer hires the employee or contractor.
- b. If the employer transmits reports magnetically or electronically, a report required under this section may be made by two monthly transmissions, if necessary, not less than twelve nor more than sixteen days apart.
 - 5. An employer is not required to report a contractor under this section if the services are provided in response to an emergency or if the services are not expected to be provided on a recurring basis.
- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 34-15-04 of the North Dakota Century

 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 3. An employer that employs <u>or hires</u> more than twenty-four employees <u>or contractors</u> at any time must<u>shall</u> report new hires through an electronic method provided by the department. An employer that does not comply with this subsection is deemed to have failed to report new hires under section 34-15-05. The department may waive, upon a showing of good cause, the requirement to report new hires electronically.
- SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 34-15-05 of the North Dakota Century

 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 3. An employer whothat, by agreement between the employer and employee or between the employer and contractor, fails to file a timely, complete, and correct report required under this chapter or files a false or incomplete report is liable for a civil money penalty of two hundred fifty dollars for each failure to report or each false or incomplete report.
 - SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on January 1, 2020.
- **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 34-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

1	Reporting of independent contractors.
2	The provisions of this chapter apply to an independent contractor if the aggregate payment
3	for the services performed by the independent contractor is sufficient for the payor to be
4	required to file an internal revenue service form 1099 or substantially equivalent form and report
5	the payment on the form as nonemployee compensation.
6	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on January 1, 2020.
