- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 40-21-01 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to qualified electors in city elections. for an Act to create and enact a new section to
- 3 <u>chapter 11-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to special elections for property</u>
- 4 owners in a proposed extraterritorial zoning area.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9	<u><u><u>1.</u> Every resident of a municipalitycity and any resident of the extraterritorial zoning</u></u>		
10	jurisdiction of the city who is qualified to vote therein at general elections may vote at		
11	all municipalcity elections held therein. Whenby that city.		
12	<u><u>2.</u> Except as provided in subsection 3, when elections are held by wards or precincts, a</u>		
13	personan individual may not vote in any place other than the ward or precinct of which		
14	the personindividual is a resident.		
15	<u>— 3. An individual who is a resident of the extraterritorial zoning jurisdiction of the city is</u>		
16	entitled to vote in the ward or precinct to which that area of the jurisdiction has been		
17	designated to vote by the governing body of the city.		
18	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 11-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
19	and enacted as follows:		
20	Special election - Zoning.		
21	1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the board of county commissioners shall		
22	call a special election to allow owners of property in a proposed extraterritorial zone,		
23	as provided in section 40-47-01.1, to vote on the proposed extension of extraterritorial

1		zoning authority. The outcome of the vote is binding on the city seeking to extend the
2		extraterritorial zone.
3	2.	The board of county commissioners shall provide notice of the proposed change and
4		date of the special election through certified mail to each property owner that would be
5		impacted by the proposed change.
6	3.	An election relating to a proposal to extend extraterritorial zoning authority over the
7		same area may not be held more often than once in any twelve-month period.
