- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the adoption of a restraint and seclusion policy by school districts, the
- 3 prohibition of seclusion, the collection of data, and the reporting of incidents of restraint and
- 4 seclusion; and to provide an appropriation.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows:
- 8 School districts - Restraint and seclusion policy - Reports.
- 9 As used in this section:

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- 10 "Chemical restraint" means medication that is not a standard treatment for an a. 11 individual's medical or psychological condition which is used to control the 12 behavior or restrict the movement of an individual.
- 13 "Mechanical restraint" means the use of any device or equipment to restrict the <u>b.</u> 14 movement of an individual.
  - "Physical escort" means the temporary touching or holding of the hand, wrist, <u>C.</u> arm, shoulder, or back for the purpose of directing an individual to walk to a designated location.
- 18 "Physical restraint" means the use of the body of an individual to restrict or <u>d.</u> 19 immobilize another individual from moving the individual's torso, arms, legs, or 20 head. The term does not include a temporary touching or holding of the hand, 21 wrist, arm, shoulder, or back for the purpose of directing or escorting an individual 22 to walk to a designated location.
- 23 "Restraint" means a chemical restraint, mechanical restraint, physical restraint, or e. 24

2			or a	rea from which the individual is physically prevented from leaving. The term			
3			does not include a time out.				
4		<u>g.</u>	"Time out" means the monitored separation of an individual in an unlocked				
5			setting implemented for the purpose of calming the individual.				
6	<u>2.</u>	<u>Bef</u>	fore July 1, 2020, each school district shall adopt a policy regarding the use of				
7		res	straint and seclusion methods by school district personnel.				
8		<u>a.</u>	<u>A sc</u>	chool district policy must be in writing and insure:			
9			<u>(1)</u>	Any use of physical restraint or seclusion does not occur, except when there			
10				is a threat of imminent danger of serious physical harm to a student, school			
11				personnel, or others; and			
12			<u>(2)</u>	Any use of physical restraint or seclusion that occurs due to a threat of			
13				imminent danger of serious physical harm, occurs in a manner that protects			
14				the safety of all individuals present.			
15		<u>b.</u>	<u>A sc</u>	chool district policy must include the definitions of seclusion, physical restraint,			
16			che	mical restraint, and mechanical restraint as defined in this section, or as			
17			<u>defi</u>	ned in the United States department of education office for civil rights.			
18		<u>C.</u>	A school district policy must:				
19			<u>(1)</u>	Prohibit seclusion in schools;			
20			<u>(2)</u>	Prohibit the use of restraint methods known to be life threatening, including			
21				use of physical restraint in a manner that restricts an individual's breathing			
22				or harms the individual;			
23			<u>(3)</u>	Prohibit the use of prone or supine restraints;			
24			<u>(4)</u>	Prohibit the use of mechanical or chemical restraints;			
25			<u>(5)</u>	Prohibit the use of physical restraints used for punishment, noncompliance,			
26				or discipline;			
27			<u>(6)</u>	Prohibit physical restraint or physical escort known to be contraindicated			
28				based on an individual's disability, health care needs, or medical or			
29				psychiatric condition;			
30			<u>(7)</u>	Require school district personnel to be certified and trained at least annually			
31				in the safe and effective use of physical restraints and effective alternatives

4	(8)	Require parents be notified no later than the end of the school day following

6	<u>(9)</u>	Require each incidence of physical restraint or seclusion be documented in					
7		writir	ng and collection of data for:				
8		<u>(a)</u>	Preventing future need for the use of restraint; and				
9		<u>(b)</u>	Creating a record for consideration when developing plans to address				
10			the needs of students and staff training;				
11	(10)	<u>Requ</u>	uire data collected be reported to the superintendent of public				
12		<u>instr</u>	uction. The superintendent shall make the data available to the public;				
13	<u>(11)</u>	<u>Requ</u>	uire each district to file a copy of the policy with the superintendent of				
14		<u>publi</u>	c instruction, which shall be publicly available; and				
15	<u>(12)</u>	<u>Requ</u>	uire each school district to report every incident of restraint and				
16		<u>secl</u>	usion to the United States department of education office for civil rights.				
17	SECTION 2. A	PPRO	<b>DPRIATION.</b> There is appropriated out of any moneys in the foundation				
18	aid stabilization fur	nd in t	he state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$500,000, or				
19	so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of public instruction for the						
20	purpose of training school district personnel on the district restraint and seclusion policy,						
21	including training on the prohibition of seclusion, the prevention of physical restraint, and the						
22	safe use of physical restraints, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30,						
23	2021.
