3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 29-26-22.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- If, after a lapse of two years from the filing of a judgment, the board of county
 commissioners determines the judgment cannot be collected in full, the board of
 county commissioners has authority tomay compromise and settle any judgment for
 fines or costs arising from criminal proceedings which are payable to the county
 treasury after a lapse of two years from the filing thereof, if in the opinion of said board
 said judgment cannot be collected in fullstate treasurer.
 - The county's compromise or settlement may include a request to the district court to convert any amount still owed to a civil judgment.
 - 3. Upon receipt of a certified copy of the board's action, the state's attorney of saidthe county where the judgment was filed shall in accordance therewith make and file a partial or total satisfaction of saidthe judgment as attorney for the county.
 - 4. Upon In the absence of a compromise or settlement, or after one year has passed following the date of a compromise or settlement, the county may contract with a private debt collection company to collect any remaining balance. The county shall deposit any additional revenue collected under this subsection in the county general fund.
