- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-18-10 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to allowing individuals who do not have a teaching license to teach noncore subjects
- 3 upon meeting certain criteria.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-18-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-18-10. Specialty areas Teacher qualification.
- 8 Notwithstanding the requirements of this chapter:
 - An individual may teach art, business education, computer education, a foreign language, music, physical education, special education, and technology education at any grade level from kindergarten through grade eight, provided the individual:
 - a. Is licensed to teach by the education standards and practices board;
 - Is approved to teach in that area by the education standards and practices board;
 and
 - c. Meets all requirements set forth in rule by the superintendent of public instruction.
 - 2. An individual may teach Native American languages provided the individual is an eminence-credentialed teacher.
 - 3. An individual may teach in the areas of trade, industry, technical occupations, or health occupations, provided the individual has been issued a license to teach in such areas by the education standards and practices board.
 - 4. An individual may teach any subject without a license issued by the board except mathematics, science, language arts, or social studies, if:
 - a. The individual teaches as a community expert in a geographical location in which a teacher shortage or critical need exists, as determined by the board in

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1	consultation with the superintendent of public instruction, upon written request by
2	the board of a school district to the board; and
3	<u>b.</u> <u>The individual:</u>
4	(1) Completes at least two thousand hours of relevant work experience as a
5	teacher in the subject area to be taught within the preceding five years;
6	(2) Completes coursework in the subject area to be taught, as determined by
7	the board;
8	(3) Achieves a passing score on all required licensure examinations in the
9	subject area to be taught, as determined by the board; or
10	(4) Demonstrates necessary teaching experience in a field for which there is no
11	license.
12	5. The board may authorize an individual to teach under subsection 4 for one year at a
13	time. The board may renew the one-year authorization up to three times. An individual
14	may teach part-time in any subject, except elementary education, mathematics,
15	science, language arts, and social studies, if the individual has a permit issued by the
16	board, has a high school diploma, and:
17	a. Possesses at least two thousand hours of relevant work experience in the
18	preceding five years in the subject area to be taught;
19	b. Possesses a certificate, license, or degree in the subject area to be taught; or
20	c. Achieves a passing score on the Praxis content test.
21	5. The board of a school district may authorize an individual to teach part-time under
22	subsection 4 for one year,up to a maximum of three years, if:
23	a. The administrator of a school within the district submits a written request to the
24	education standards and practices board which indicates the administrator is
25	unable to locate a qualified applicant and requests the education standards and
26	practices board issue a permit;
27	b. The individual successfully completes a background check conducted by the
28	education standards and practices board; and
29	c. The education standards and practices board issues a permit to the individual.
