- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 57-51.1 and chapter 65-05.3 of
- 2 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a health and human services stabilization fund and
- 3 a paid family medical leave program; to amend and reenact sections 15-10-48 and 15-10-49 of
- 4 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to matching grants for institutions under the control of
- 5 the state board of higher education; to provide an appropriation; to provide for transfers; to
- 6 provide statements of legislative intent; and to declare an emergency.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-10-48 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 15-10-48. Advancement of academics - Matching grants - University of North Dakota and North Dakota state university.

- 1. a. Subject to legislative appropriations, each biennium during the period beginning July first of each odd-numbered year and ending December thirty-first of each even-numbered year, the state board of higher education shall award one dollar in matching grants for every two dollars raised by the institutional foundations of the university of North Dakota and North Dakota state university for projects dedicated exclusively to the advancement of academics.
  - b. To be eligible for a matching grant, an institution must demonstrate that:
    - (1) Its foundation has raised at least fifty thousand dollars in cash or monetary pledges for a qualifying project; and
    - (2) The project has been approved by the grant review committee established in section 15-10-51.
  - c. The board may award <del>up to two hundred thousand dollars in</del> matching grants to each institution <u>based on total completed credit-hours as determined under</u>

4	SEC	<b>TION 3.</b> A new section to chapter 57-51.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
5	and ena	cted as follows:
6	<u>Hea</u>	Ith and human services stabilization fund - Deposits - Continuing appropriation.
7	<u>1.</u>	There is established a special fund in the state treasury to be known as the health and
8		human services stabilization fund. All moneys deposited in the health and human
9		services stabilization fund are available for the purposes identified in this section.
10	<u>2.</u>	Moneys in the health and human services stabilization fund are appropriated and may
11		be expended only upon order of the governor to offset reductions in state general fund
12		appropriations for the state department of health and the department of human
13		services, which were made by executive action pursuant to law, due to a revenue
14		shortage.
15	<u>3.</u>	Whenever the balance of the health and human services stabilization fund exceeds
16		fifteen percent of the general fund appropriation for the state department of health and
17		the department of human services, for the most recently completed biennium, as
18		determined by the office of management and budget, the legislative assembly may
19		appropriate or transfer any excess for health-related and human services-related
20		purposes, as provided by law.
21	SEC	<b>TION 4.</b> Chapter 65-05.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as
22	follows:	
23	<u>65-0</u>	5.3-01. Definitions.
24	<u>As ι</u>	sed in this chapter:
25	<u>1.</u>	"Eligible employee" means an employee who works for a single employer at least
26		twenty-five hours per week.
27	<u>2.</u>	"Employee" means an individual, regardless of age, who performs part-time or
28		full-time services for an employer for remuneration. The term does not include
29		independent contractors as determined under the common-law test.
30	<u>3.</u>	"Employer" means a person within the state which engages the services of employees
31		for remuneration. The term includes:

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1		a. The state and its political subdivisions.			
2		b. A public and quasi-public corporation in the state.			
3		c. A partnership, limited liability company, association, and private corporation,			
4		including a public service corporation.			
5	<u>4.</u>	"Family member" includes a child, stepchild, sibling, spouse, parent, grandparent, and			
6		grandchild.			
7	<u>5.</u>	"Fund" means the paid family medical leave fund.			
8	<u>65-</u>	05.3-02. Paid family medical leave program - Administration.			
9	<u>The</u>	director shall establish a division to administer a mandatory paid family medical leave			
10	program	under this chapter. The organization shall adopt rules to administer the program under			
11	this chapter.				
12	65-05.3-03. Paid family medical leave fund.				
13	The	paid family medical leave fund is created within the workforce safety and insurance			
14	fund, to which the organization shall deposit all moneys received from employers and				
15	employees for contributions into the paid family medical leave program. The moneys in the fund				
16	may onl	y be expended to pay for wages of an eligible employee under the program.

18	The	paid family medical leave program must:			
19	<u>1.</u>	Require an employer with more than forty-nine eligible employees and an eligible			
20		employee of that employer each to contribute to the fund two cents for every ten			
21		dollars of wages earned for the benefit of eligible employees on leave for personal			
22		medical reasons or to care for a family member;			
23	<u>2.</u>	Allow an employer who employs fewer than fifty eligible employees, and who does not			
24		qualify as an employer under subsection 1, to participate in the program;			
25	<u>3.</u>	Allow an eligible employee to take leave for personal medical reasons or to care for a			
26		family member if the eligible employee has been employed for at least twelve			
27		consecutive months with the same employer and the employee has accrued at least			
28		one thousand hours of service in the twelve months before taking leave;			
29	4	Provide for sixty-six percent of an eligible employee's wages, up to a maximum of four			

thousand dollars per month;

1	5. Provide up to twelve calendar weeks of coverage per calendar year for an eligib	<u>ole</u>				
2	employee on leave under the program.

1 otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, 2 which the office of management and budget shall transfer to the North Dakota workforce safety 3 and insurance paid family medical leave fund for the purpose of administering a paid family 4 medical leave program, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending 5 June 30, 2021. Workforce safety and insurance shall repay to the general fund any funds spent 6 under this section over a period not to exceed twenty years. It is the intent of the sixty-sixth 7 legislative assembly that the funds transferred be derived from legacy fund earnings transferred 8 to the general fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. 9 SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER TO HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES 10 STABILIZATION FUND - INTENT. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund 11 in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$100,000,000, or so much of the 12 sum as may be necessary, which the office of management and budget shall transfer to the 13 health and human services stabilization fund, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and 14 ending June 30, 2021. It is the intent of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the funds 15 transferred be derived from legacy fund earnings transferred to the general fund during the 16 biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. 17 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - SOURCE OF FUNDS. It is the intent of the 18 sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the funds appropriated in section 5 of this Act be derived 19 from earnings on moneys in the legacy fund transferred to the general fund during the biennium 20 beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. 21 SECTION 9. CAREER ACADEMIES - MATCHING FUNDS. Subdivision 3 of section 5 of 22 this Act includes funding for career academies. The department of career and technical 23 education shall require two dollars of matching funds from nonstate sources for each one dollar 24 of career academies funding from the general fund provided for a project. 25 **SECTION 10. EMERGENCY.** Sections 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 8, and 9 of this Act are declared to be
