## HOUSE BILL NO. 1071

(At the request of the Board of Massage)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-25 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a massage therapist's use of prescription medication in a massage;
- 3 and to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 43-25-05, subsection 2 of section 43-25-07,
- 4 subsections 2 and 4 of section 43-25-09, section 43-25-14, and subsection 1 of section
- 5 43-25-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to regulations of the practice of massage6 therapy.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 43-25-05 of the North Dakota Century
9	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 10 1. The governor shall appoint a board of massage therapy, to consist of five members.
- 11a.Three members of the board must be massage therapists who are licensed in12good standing in this state and annually work at least five hundred hours-13practicing massage in this state and have done so for at least the previous three14years. These members must be appointed for terms of three years, staggered so15that the term of one member expires each year.
- 16 One member of the board must be a consumer member. To qualify as a b. 17 consumer member an individual may not be or have been a massage therapist, 18 may not have an immediate family member who is a massage therapist, may not 19 be an owner of or have any affiliation with a massage school, may not be a 20 current or past member of any other health care licensing entity, may not have a 21 fiduciary obligation to a facility rendering health care services, may not have a 22 financial interest in the rendering of health care services, and may not have a 23 direct and substantial financial interest in massage therapy. This member must

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1			be appointed for a two-year term, staggered so that the term expires with a			
2			licensed board member but not with the instructor board member.			
3		C.	One member of the board must be a current or former massage therapy			
4			instructor of a massage therapy program that meets the standards set by the			
5			board. This member must be appointed for a term of two years, staggered so that			
6			the term expires with a licensed board member but not with the consumer board			
7			member.			
8		d.	Each member of the board holds office until that member's successor is			
9			appointed and qualified. Any member appointed to a term beginning after			
10			June 30, 2013, may only serve for a total of sixtwo consecutive yearsfull terms,			
11			after which that member may not be reappointed unless a period of three years			
12			has passed since that member last served on the board.			
13	SEC	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 43-25-07 of the North Dakota Century				
14	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:					
15	2.	Any	applicant failing to obtain licensure within one year of the initial license or			
16		relie	cense application is entitled to reapply within six months after notification that the			
17		app	lication was rejected, upon payment of a fee of fifty dollars or a lesser amount			
18		established by the board. Two applications exhaust the privilege under the original				
19		applicationAn applicant shall complete an application within six months of initial filing.				
20		If the applicant does not complete the application within six months, the board may				
21		destroy the application and any supporting records. The application fee provided for in				
22	section 43-25-08 is not eligible for refund. The board may extend the six month					
23		<u>con</u>	npletion deadline for an applicant providing proof of medical or other hardship			
24		ren	dering the applicant unable to meet the deadline.			
25	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsections 2 and 4 of section 43-25-09 of the North Dakota					
26	Century	Cod	e is amended and reenacted as follows:			
27	2.	Exc	cept as otherwise provided under this subsection, twenty-four hours of continuing			
28		edu	ication, or equivalent college credits <u>relating to massage</u> , submitted every two			
29		yea	rs is required for renewal of the license. Of the twenty-four hours, twelve hours			
30		mu	st be classroom, hands-on hours. For the first renewal after becoming licensed in			
31		this	state, a minimum of three hours of the required twenty-four hours must be ethics			

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1 education. If an applicant for renewal is in good standing and has been actively-2 practicing massagea therapist for the fifteen years immediately preceding the renewal, 3 six hours of continuing education, or equivalent college credits relating to massage, 4 submitted every two years is required for renewal of the license. If an applicant for 5 renewal is in good standing and has been actively practicing massagea therapist for 6 the twenty-five years immediately preceding the renewal, three hours of continuing 7 education, or equivalent college credits relating to practice of massage, submitted 8 every two years is required for renewal of the license. The board may accept 9 continuing education attained by remote means. No more than ten hours of a 10 licensee's renewal hours may be by remote means. To qualify as continuing 11 education, the remote education must be board-approved for content and suitability as 12 defined in this chapter. 13 Licensees with odd-numbered licenses shall report required continuing education a. 14 on or before February twenty-eighth of each odd-numbered year and pay a 15 required renewal fee of two hundred dollars or a lesser amount established by 16 the board. 17 Licensees with even-numbered licenses shall report required continuing b. 18 education on or before February twenty-eighth of each even-numbered year and 19 pay a required renewal fee of two hundred dollars or a lesser amount established 20 by the board. 21 Licensed individuals during their initial licensure period are not required to report C. 22 hours of continuing education. Thereafter, the licensees shall report continuing 23 education pursuant to subdivisions a and b. 24 d. The board may grant an individual waiver based on health issues or other good 25 cause deemed sufficient by the board. 26 4. A holder of an expired license may within two years from the date of its expiration have 27 the license renewed upon payment of the required renewal fee and a penalty fee of 28 fifty dollars. The board may require a new certificate of physical examination and 29 evidence of completion of any required continued educational hours.

30 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is

31 amended and reenacted as follows:

13		a.	Is licensed in good standing in any other state, territory, or jurisdiction of the		
14			United States;		
15		b.	Actively practiced Was licensed for at least two of the last three years;		
16		C.	Graduated from a school of massage or massage therapy program approved by		
17			the board which may be proven by presentation of a diploma or credentials;		
18		d.	Passed an examination acceptable to the board;		
19		e.	A massage license granted to the applicant in any other state, territory, or		
20			jurisdiction is not subject to suspension, revocation, or otherwise restricted in any		
21			manner for disciplinary purposes; and

25	In performing massage, a massage therapist may not use, apply, or dispense any				
26	medication or device that requires a prescription, including any usable marijuana authorized				
27	under chapter 19-24.1.
