- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-06.5 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to duties of the designated state entity regarding independent living
- 3 council and independent living centers and services; to amend and reenact sections
- 4 50-06.5-01, 50-06.5-02, 50-06.5-03, 50-06.5-04, 50-06.5-06, 50-06.5-07, and 50-06.5-08 of the
- 5 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the independent living council and independent living
- 6 centers and services; and to repeal section 50-06.5-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 7 relating to the state plan for independent living centers and services.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-06.5-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 11 **50-06.5-01. Definitions.**
- 12 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 13 1. "Center for independent living" means a consumer-controlled, community-based,
- 14 cross-disability, nonresidential, private, nonprofit agency that is designed and operated
- within a local community by individuals with disabilities disability, that provides which
- can provide an array of independent living services and programs, and that does not
- offer permanent housing among its services and complies with the standards and
- assurances in accordance with section 796f-4 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973,
- 19 <u>as amended [Pub. L. 93-112; 29 U.S.C. 701 et seq.]</u>.
- 20 2. "Consumer control" means power and authority vested in individuals with disabilitiesa
- 21 <u>disability</u> and, when applied to a center for independent living, means at least
- 22 <u>fifty-one more than fifty percent of the principal governing board, and management,</u>
- 23 and staff are individuals with disabilities a disability.
- 3. "Council" means the statewide independent living council.

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- "Designated state <u>agencyentity</u>" means the vocational rehabilitation division of the
   department of human services <u>as defined in the state plan for independent living.</u>
- 3 5. "Director" means the director of the designated state agencyentity.
- 6. "Disability" means a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life activities of an individual, a record of a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life activities of an individual, or being regarded as having a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life activities.
  - 7. "Independent living core services" means information and referral services; independent living skills training; peer counseling, and including cross-disability peer counseling; individual and systems advocacy; services that facilitate the transition of an individual with a significant disability from nursing home and other institutions to home and community-based residence, with the requisite supports and services; to provide assistance to an individual with a significant disability who is at risk of entering an institution so the individual may remain in the community; and to facilitate the transition of youth who are individuals with a significant disability, who were eligible for an individualized education program and who have completed their postsecondary education or otherwise left school, to postsecondary life or have reached the age of eighteen and are still receiving services in accordance with an individualized education program and have not completed their postsecondary education.
- 21 8.7. "Independent living services" includes independent living core services and other services and assistance that may include:
  - a. Counseling services, including psychological, psychotherapeutic, and related services;
  - b. Services related to securing housing or shelter;
  - c. Assistive technology;
  - d. Interpreter and reader services;
- 28 e. Personal assistance services, including attendant care and training of personnel

27	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06.5-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

31	governing operations of the council. The council shall meet at least quarterly.

- The council must be composed of members who provide statewide representation,
   who represent a broad range of individuals with disabilities, and who are
   knowledgeable about the independent living philosophy and centers for independent living services and programs.
  - 4. A member of the council may not serve more than two consecutive three-year terms. The two consecutive three-year term limit does not include the term of a member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring before the expiration of the term for which appointed or the reduced terms of service of the members initially appointed to provide for the expiration of terms on a staggered basis as specified by the appointing authority. Any vacancy occurring in the membership of the council must be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. A vacancy does not affect the power of the remaining members to execute the duties of the council At least fifty percent of the directors of the centers for independent living serving the state, or a designee if unable to meet the residency requirements of the state, must be members.
  - **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-06.5-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
    - 50-06.5-04. Duties of the statewide independent living council.
- 18 The council shall:
  - 1. Jointly develop and submit, in conjunction with the designated state agency, the state plan as required.
  - 2. Monitor, review, and evaluate the implementation of the state plan.
- 22 3. Coordinate activities with councils that address the needs of specific disability
   23 populations and issues under other federal and state law.
  - 4. Prepare reports and make recommendations, as necessary, to the governor, legislative assembly, and designated state agency fulfill the duties as set forth in section 796d of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended [Pub. L. 93-112; 29 U.S.C. 701 et seq.] which include developing, monitoring, implementing the state plan for independent living; developing or assisting in the development of required state and federal reports; recordkeeping; coordinating with other state entities that provide similar or complementary services; and preparing, in conjunction with the designated state entity, a plan for the provision of resources needed to carry out the

L. 93-112; 5 29 U.S.C. 701 et seq.] to ensure that all programs and activities are planned, 6 conducted, administered, and evaluated in a manner consistent with the purposes of 7 this chapter. 8 2. The standards are: 9 The center shall promote and practice the independent living philosophy of: 10 Consumer control of the center, regarding decisionmaking, service delivery, 11 management, and establishment of the policy and direction of the center; 12 <del>(2)</del> Self-help and self-advocacy; 13 Development of peer relations and peer role models; and (3)14 Equal access of individuals with disabilities to society and to all services. 15 programs, activities, resources, and facilities whether public or private and 16 regardless of the funding source. 17 <del>b.</del> The center shall provide services to individuals with a range of disabilities. The 18 center shall provide services on a cross-disability basis for individuals with-19 different types of disabilities, including individuals with disabilities who are 20 members of populations that are unserved or underserved. Eligibility for services 21 at any center for independent living may not be based on the presence of any 22 one or more specific disabilities. 23 The center shall facilitate the development and achievement of independent С. 24 living goals selected by individuals who seek that assistance by the center. 25 <del>d.</del> The center shall work to increase the availability and improve the quality of 26 community options for independent living to facilitate the development and 27 achievement of independent living goals by individuals with disabilities. 28 The center shall provide independent living core services and, as appropriate, a e. 29 combination of any other independent living services.

The center shall conduct activities to increase the capacity of communities within

the service area of the center to meet the needs of individuals with disabilities.

1 The center shall conduct resource development activities to obtain funding from <del>g.</del> 2 sources other than that available under this chapter. 3 <del>3.</del> The applicant shall provide, as the council may require, satisfactory assurance that: 4 The applicant is an eligible agency. a. 5 The center will be designed and operated within local communities by individuals b. 6 with disabilities a disability, including an assurance that the center will have a 7 board that is the principal governing body of the center and a majority of that 8 board will be composed of individuals with disabilities a significant disability. 9 The applicant will comply with the standards and assurances set forth in this C. 10 section. 11 d. The applicant will establish clear priorities through annual and three-year 12 programs and financial planning objectives for the center, including overall goals 13 or mission for the center, a work plan for achieving the goals or mission, specific 14 objectives, services priorities, and types of services to be provided along with a 15 description that demonstrates how the proposed activities of the applicant are 16 consistent with the most recent three-year state plan for independent living. 17 The applicant will use sound organization, personnel assignment practices, e. 18 including taking affirmative action to employ and advance in employment 19 qualified individuals with disabilities significant disability on the same terms and 20 conditions required with respect to the employment of individuals with 21 disabilitiesa disability under section 503796m of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 22 1973, as amended, and the federal Americans with Disabilities Act. 23 The applicant will ensure that the majority of its staff, and individuals on its staff in f. 24 decisionmaking positions, are individuals with disabilities a significant disability. 25 The applicant will practice sound fiscal management, including making g. 26 arrangements for an annual independent fiscal audit or review. 27 h. The applicant will conduct annual self-evaluations, prepare an annual report, and 28 maintain records, adequate to measure performance with respect to the 29 standards containing information regarding, at least: 30 The extent to which the center is in compliance with the standards and 31 assurances.

1 The numbers and types of individuals with disabilities a significant disability (2) 2 receiving services through the center. 3 (3) The types of services provided through the center and the number of 4 individuals with disabilities a significant disability receiving each type of 5 service. 6 (4) The source and amounts of funding for the operation of the center. 7 The number of individuals with disabilities a significant disability who are 8 employed by, and the number who are in management and decisionmaking 9 positions in the center. 10 (6) The comparison, when appropriate, of the activities of the center in prior 11 years, with the activities of the center in the most recent year. 12 Individuals with severe disabilities a significant disability who are seeking services 13 from the center will be notified by the center of the existence of the availability of 14 the client assistance program and a way to contact that program. 15 j. Aggressive outreach, regarding services provided through the center, will be 16 conducted in an effort to reach populations of individuals with disabilities thata 17 disability which are unserved or underserved by programs under this chapter, 18 especially minority groups and urban and rural populations. 19 Staff at centers for independent living will receive training on how to serve the k. 20 unserved and underserved populations, including minority groups and urban and 21 rural populations. 22 The center will submit to the council a copy of its approved grant-23 applicationannual report and the annual audit or review required under 24 subdivision g. 25 The center will prepare and submit a report to the designated state agencyentity, m. 26 at the end of each fiscal year, that contains the information described in 27 subdivision h and information regarding the extent to which the center is in-28 compliance with the standards set forth in subsection 2. 29 Each individual receiving independent living services will have an independent 30 living plan if that individual requests one.

   set forth in the state plan for independent living.
- 3. Shall ensure the council receives necessary and sufficient resources needed to fulfill
   4 the council's statutory duties and authorities under section 796d of the federal
   5 Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended [Pub. L. 93-112; 29 U.S.C. 701 et seq.],
   6 consistent with the state plan for independent living and in a manner consistent with
   7 state and federal regulations.
- 8 <u>4. Shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations.</u>
- 5. Shall sign the state plan for independent living signifying agreement to execute the
   responsibilities of the designated state entity identified in section 796c of the federal
   Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended [Pub. L. 93-112; 29 U.S.C. 701 et seq.].
- Shall assist the council in the development of the plan for the provision of resources,
   including personnel necessary to carry out the functions of the council.
- **SECTION 9. REPEAL.** Section 50-06.5-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
