- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 50-31 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to licensure of an opioid treatment medication unit and fees; and to
- 3 amend and reenact section 50-31-01 and subsection 1 of section 50-31-05 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to the definition of medication unit and the licensure of substance abuse
- 5 treatment programs.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 50-31-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 **50-31-01. Definitions.**
- 10 1. "Department" means the department of human services.
- 11 2. "Medication unit" means a facility established as part of, but geographically separate
- from, an opioid treatment program, from which a licensed practitioner dispenses or
- 13 <u>administers an opioid treatment medication or collects samples for drug testing or</u>
- 14 <u>analysis.</u>
- 15 <u>3.</u> "Opioid treatment program" means a program through which medication is dispensed
- in the treatment of opioid addiction.
- 17 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 1 of section 50-31-05 of the North Dakota Century
- 18 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 1. The department is authorized tomay issue licenses to operate substance abuse treatment programs, for a period of twothree years, which are found to comply with the
- 21 provisions of this chapter and rules adopted by the department.
- **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 50-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 23 and enacted as follows:

7	<u>2.</u>	The d	department may license a medication unit. A separate license is required for each	
8		locati	on at which a medication unit is operated under this section.	
9	<u>3.</u>	The d	lepartment shall adopt rules relating to licensing and monitoring a medication	
10		<u>unit, i</u>	ncluding rules for:	
11		<u>a.</u> §	Standards for approval and maintenance of licensure;	
12		<u>b.</u> <u>/</u>	Assessment of need for a medication unit in the proposed location, including	
13		<u>(</u>	community engagement; and	
14		<u>c.</u> §	Standards of patient care.	
15	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 50-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
16	and enacted as follows:			
17	<u>Fees - Rules.</u>			
18	An applicant for licensure under this chapter shall submit a one hundred fifty dollar			
19	nonrefundable fee with the application. The department shall establish fees in amounts			
20	necessary to compensate the department for administration and enforcement of this chapter.			
21	The department shall adopt rules as necessary to implement this section. All fees collected			
22	under this section must be paid to the department and must be used to defray the cost of			
23	administering and enforcing this chapter.
