Chairman Headland members of the committee for the record my name is David Richter District

1 Williston.

HB 1350 provides an exception to section 21-03-07 of North Dakota Center Court which

establishes 60% of the electors voting as the threshold for approval for a school district to issue

bonds.

This bill is modeled on section 57 -15- 14 North Dakota Century Code voter approval of excess

levies by school districts paragraphs A and B. If the total population of a school district is over

4000 population the excess levy is approved by a majority of the electoral voters, if the district is

under 4000 total population the excess levy is approved by 55% of the electors voting.

On page 1 line 7 of this bill subsection 7 Paragraph A 1 if a district population is between 4000

and less than 20,000 it would require 57% of electors voting to approve the school bond.

Subsection 7 Paragraph A 2 approval of a school bond would require 55% of electors voting if

the district population is 20,000 or higher. There would be no change for school districts under

4000 total population.
