"SECTION 17. SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER PROGRAM GRANTS - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. Subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$3,000,000 for substance use disorder treatment grants. The department of human services shall develop an implementation plan for the distribution of the grant funding. The executive director of the department of human services shall appoint a committee that includes substance use disorder providers to advise the department on the development of the implementation plan. The implementation plan shall provide for the following:

- A licensed substance abuse treatment program may apply for a competitive substance use disorder treatment voucher system grant.
- 2. To receive a grant, a licensed substance abuse treatment program must:

- a. Submit an application in the form and manner prescribed by the department;
- b. Enter a grant agreement with the department;
- Use grant funds for a licensed substance abuse treatment program with fewer than seventeen beds in an underserved area, as determined by the department, in the state's substance abuse treatment system;
- d. Use the grant funds to support the provision of substance use disorder treatment in underserved areas of the state's substance abuse treatment system;
- e. Provide and disclose information needed to comply with the department's data collection requirements; and
- f. Operate in compliance with grant requirements.
- The department, within legislative appropriations, may distribute up to three grants under this section to licensed substance abuse treatment programs.
- 4. The department may recapture grant funds distributed to a licensed program found by the department to be out of compliance with the requirements established by the grant program.

Before January 1, 2022, the department shall report to the legislative management regarding the plan to distribute substance use disorder treatment grants."

## STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

## This amendment:

- Increases funding for the substance use disorder program from \$15 million to \$17 million.
- Adjusts the funding source for the program to provide that \$14 million is from the general fund and \$3 million is from federal funds.
- Provides for \$3 million of program funding to be used for substance use disorder treatment grants.
- Provides for the department to appoint a committee that includes substance use disorder providers to advise the department on the distribution of substance use disorder treatment grants.
- Removes sections added by the House relating to substance use disorder voucher treatment grants and the amount of substance use disorder voucher funding that may be used for residential services.
