Other proposed changes:

- 2 Create a DHS working group that includes substance use disorder providers to develop a program to establish residential substance use disorder programs utilizing up to \$3 million of legacy fund earnings for substance use disorder residential programs in regions 1 and 8 which are eligible to utilize traditional Medicaid and Medicaid Expansion funding.
- *3 Provide for DHS to seek approval from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to allow substance use disorder programs to serve as qualified entities for the purpose of Medicaid presumptive eligibility under the traditional Medicaid and Medicaid Expansion programs. Require DHS to provide a report to the Legislative Management regarding the status of the approval and the adoption of administrative rules relating to the change.
- *4 Provide for community-based providers of ASAM level 2.5 services be increased to the same rate as hospital-based ASAM level 2.5 service providers within the Medicaid Expansion program.
- 5 Establish a moratorium for the 2021-23 biennium on residential substance use disorder providers that are not currently licensed in the state or have not been approved for voucher residential services.
- *6 Require DHS to apply for a Medicaid waiver to allow individuals between 21 and 65 years of age to be served in an institution for mental disease and be eligible for Medicaid funding. This may permit Medicaid payments for patients that receive treatment at the State Hospital.
- 7 Remove provisions added by the House to limit the amount of funding that may be distributed to residential substance use disorder service providers.
- *8 Declare items 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 to be an emergency measure.
