#### 2. VCSU Land Purchase:

Purchase of land authorized. The state board of higher education, acting for and through Valley City State University, is authorized to purchase two parcels of land in Barnes county, described as (lot description here), from the Valley City State University Foundation for the use and betterment of Valley City State University, with local funds hereby appropriated for such purchase in the amount of \$309,000.

#### Parcel 1: 237 6th St. SE

The South Half of the East One-third of Lot One, in Block Four, of Andrus and Sifton's Addition to the City of Valley City, Barnes County, North Dakota, according to the certified plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the County Recorder in and for said County and State.

### Parcel 2: 225 6th St. SE

The South One Hundred feet of the West One-third of the East Half and the East One-third of the West Half of Lot One, in Block Four, in Andrus and Sifton's Addition to the City of Valley City, Barnes County, North Dakota, according to the certified plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for said County and State.

#### 3. Title IX Amendment

**AMENDMENT.** Subsection 1 of section 15-10-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

# 44-04-18.28. Title IX records at state universities and colleges exempt confidential.

Any record related to a complaint or investigation under title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 [Pub. L. 92-318; 20 U.S.C. 1681 et seq.] at an institution under the control of the state board of higher education which contains personally identifiable information about a party to the complaint is an exempt a confidential record, subject to exceptions set forth in federal law. For purposes of this section, "personally identifiable information" means information that directly identifies an individual, and information that, alone or in combination with other information, is linked or linkable to an individual and would allow a reasonable person who lacks knowledge of the relevant circumstances to identify the individual.

# 4. UND Technology Accelerator Refinancing

On 1/28/2021 the SBHE authorized UND to request permission from the 2021 Legislative Assembly to pursue refinancing options for the Technology Accelerator Building bank loan.

UND has a loan with Bremer Bank to finance the purchase of UND's Technology Accelerator building, which was formerly known as the Research Enterprise and Commercialization (REAC) building. The purchase & original financing was authorized by the 63<sup>rd</sup> Legislative Assembly in 2013 Senate Bill 2003, Section 23.

The original \$9.8 million, 10-year loan was initiated in September 2013 with a fixed interest rate of 5.38% per annum and a balloon payment of \$7,376.579 due October 1, 2023. Payments are made monthly

resulting in annual expenditure of \$718,013. The balance of the loan as of December 1, 2020 was \$8,152,323.

If the refinancing is approved by the legislature, UND will solicit, through a request for proposal, a partner to assist with the marketing and negotiation of the refinancing. This will ensure UND maximizes its exposure to potential lenders and refinances the existing loan at the best possible rate. The terms of the loan will be determined based on the interest rate and keeping the annual debt service at or above the current amount but is expected to be between 16 and 20 years.

Without refinancing the loan, UND would need to have \$7,376,579 available in cash by October 1, 2023 to pay off the existing loan.
