- wholesaler fees; to provide for a report; to provide a continuing appropriation; to provide for a 5

- Exception Drug importation.

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- 10 This chapter does not prohibit a manufacturer of a drug approved by the federal drug 11
- administration from importing a version of the approved drug sold in foreign countries pursuant 12
- to section 801 of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act [21 U.S.C. 384]. 13

Wholesale prescription drug importation program.
