## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

## 6 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - ONLINE TAX PORTAL - ONE-TIME FUNDING. 7 There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not 8 otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$424,000, or so much of the sum as may be 9 necessary, to the tax commissioner for the purpose of developing an online portal or 10 promulgating online access for electronically accessible statewide property information-11 and property tax information based on county geographic information system data and 12 electronic property information, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending-13 June 30, 2025. Of the funding provided in this section, \$130,000 is considered a 14 one-time funding item. 15 The online portal must: 16 Integrate with a computer-assisted mass appraisal system. 17 Use a consistent format to display property and property tax information for all-18 properties. 19 Include any available pictures or sketches associated with each property. 20 Provide access to property tax estimates based on data from a computer-21 assisted mass appraisal system. 22 Have options to keep exempt and confidential information from being publicly 23 accessible.

Allow users to perform basic and advanced searches of property and property taxinformation, including search options for comparable sales and by propertyclassification for residential, commercial, and agriculture properties.

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY. During the 2023-24 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the integration of an online portal or promulgating online access for electronically accessible statewide property information and property tax information based on county geographic information system data and electronic property information. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.
