## HOUSE BILL NO. 1136 (Representatives Klemin, Karls, Meier, D. Ruby, Satrom, Steiner, Vetter) (Senators Dwyer, Erbele, Kannianen, Larson, Luick)

AN ACT to create and enact a new section to chapter 14-02.4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the exercise of religion.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 14-02.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## Exercise of religion.

- 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a state or local government entity may not:
  - a. <u>Substantially burden a person's exercise of religion unless applying the burden to that</u> person's exercise of religion in a particular situation is essential to further a compelling governmental interest and is the least restrictive means of furthering that compelling government interest;
  - <u>b.</u> <u>Treat religious conduct more restrictively than any secular conduct of reasonably</u> <u>comparable risk; or</u>
  - c. <u>Treat religious conduct more restrictively than any comparable secular conduct because</u> of alleged economic need or benefit.
- 2. <u>A person claiming to be aggrieved by a violation of this section may assert that violation as a claim or defense in a judicial proceeding and obtain appropriate relief, including costs and reasonable attorney's fees.</u>
