ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1001

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the legislative branch

2 of state government; to amend and reenact sections 54-03-20 and 54-35-10 of the North

3 Dakota Century Code, relating to legislative compensation; to provide for a legislative

4 management study; to provide a report; to provide for application, transfer, and cancellation of

5 unexpended appropriations; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from the insurance
regulatory trust fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the legislative branch of state government
for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the legislative branch of state government, for the
fiscal period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2025, as follows:

The 2023-25 biennium one-time funding amounts are not part of the entity's base budget for the 2025-27 biennium. The legislative council shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.

20 SECTION 4. EXEMPTION - TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director 21 of the office of management and budget shall transfer appropriation authority between line items 22 of the legislative management and legislative council as may be requested by the chairman of 23 the legislative management or the director of the legislative council upon the finding by the 24 chairman or the director that the nature of studies and duties assigned to the legislative 25 management or legislative council requires the transfers in properly carrying on the legislative 26 management's and legislative council's functions and duties. The director of the office of 27 management and budget shall similarly make transfers of appropriation authority between the 28 line items for the sixty-eighth and sixty-ninth legislative assemblies, upon request by the 29 chairman of the legislative management or the director of the legislative council upon the finding 30 by the chairman or director that the transfers are required for the legislative assembly to carry 31 on its functions and duties.

1 (1) A member of the legislative assembly may elect to be reimbursed for less 2 than the amount to which the legislator is entitled under this subsection by 3 claiming the lesser amount on a voucher submitted with the receipt required 4 by section 44-08-04. 5 The legislative management may establish guidelines that may result in a (2) 6 reduced maximum reimbursement for a single dwelling in which two or more 7 legislators share lodging and the total rent for that dwelling exceeds the 8 amount to which a legislator is entitled under subdivision a. 9 3. a. Members of the legislative assembly who receive reimbursement for lodging are 10 also entitled to reimbursement for travel for not to exceed one round trip taken 11 during any calendar week, or portion of a week, the legislative assembly is in 12 session, between their residences and the place of meeting of the legislative 13 assembly, at the rate provided for state employees with the additional limitation 14 that reimbursement for travel by common carrier may be only at the cost of coach 15 fare and may not exceed one and one-half times the amount the member would 16 be entitled to receive as mileage reimbursement for travel by motor vehicle. 17 b. A member of the legislative assembly who does not receive reimbursement for 18 lodging and whose place of residence in the legislative district that the member 19 represents is not within the city of Bismarck is entitled to reimbursement at the 20 rate provided for state employees for necessary travel for not to exceed one 21 round trip taken per day between the residence and the place of meeting of the 22 legislative assembly when it is in session and may receive reimbursement for 23 lodging at the place of meeting of the legislative assembly as provided in section 24 44-08-04 for each calendar day for which round trip travel reimbursement is not 25 claimed, provided that the total reimbursement may not exceed the maximum 26 monthly reimbursement allowed under subdivision a of subsection 2. 27 4. The amount to which each legislator is entitled must be paid following the 28 organizational session in December and each month upon submission of a voucher 29 and appropriate documentation during a regular or special session, consistent with 30 section 26 of article XI of the constitution of North Dakota.

1 If during a special session, the legislative assembly adjourns for more than three days, 5. 2 a member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive compensation during those 3 days only while in attendance at a standing committee if the legislator is a member of 4 that committee, a majority or minority leader, or a legislator who is not on that 5 committee but who has the approval of a majority or minority leader to attend. 6 6. A day, or portion of a day, spent in traveling to or returning from an organizational, 7 special, or regular session or a legislative committee meeting must be included as a 8 calendar day during a legislative session or as a day of a legislative committee 9 meeting for the purposes of this section. 10 7. a. In addition, each member is entitled to receive during the term for which the 11 member was elected, as compensation for the execution of public duties during 12 the biennium, the sum of five hundred twenty-sixfifty-eight dollars through 13 June 30, 20222024, and five hundred thirty-seveneighty dollars thereafter per 14 month, paid monthly. 15 b. If a member dies or resigns from office during the member's term, the member 16 may be paid only the allowances provided for in this section for the period for 17 which the member was actually a member. 18 C. The majority and minority leaders of the house and senate and the chairman of 19 the legislative management, if the chairman is not a majority or minority leader, 20 are each entitled to receive as compensation, in addition to any other 21 compensation or expense reimbursement provided by law, the sum of three-22 hundred seventy-sevenfour hundred dollars through June 30, 20222024, and 23 three hundred eighty-five four hundred sixteen dollars thereafter per month during 24 the biennium for their execution of public duties. 25 8. Attendance at any organizational, special, or regular session of the legislative 26 assembly by any member is a conclusive presumption of entitlement as set out in this 27 section and compensation and expense allowances must be excluded from gross 28 income for income tax purposes to the extent permitted for federal income tax 29 purposes under section 127 of the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 [Pub. L. 97-34; 30 95 Stat. 202; 26 U.S.C. 162(i)].

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19.Before each regular legislative session, the legislative management shall make2recommendations and submit any necessary legislation to adjust legislative3compensation amounts.

4 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 54-35-10. Compensation of members and leadership.

- The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of
 the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in
 attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate
 of one hundred eighty-ninetwo hundred one dollars through June 30, 20222024, and
 one hundred ninety-threetwo hundred nine dollars thereafter per day and must also be
 paid for expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their
 official duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.
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 2. In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the
 15 legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
 16 spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
 17 and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to
 18 receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
- 19 management or of the committee which the person chairs.

20 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - IMPACT OF TERM LIMITS ON THE

21 **LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** During the 2023-24 interim, the legislative management shall

22 consider studying the impact of term limits on the manner in which the legislative assembly

23 conducts business. The study must include an assessment of the desirability of providing

24 increased educational opportunities for legislative members due to shortened tenures in the

25 legislative assembly, increasing the number of legislative council policy staff available to assist

- 26 new members, and holding legislative sessions on an annual basis. The legislative
- 27 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation
- 28 required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.

SECTION 9. EMERGENCY. Sections 1 through 5 of this Act are declared to be an
 emergency measure.
