- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to regulation of onsite wastewater treatment system installers; to amend and
- 3 reenact section 23-35-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the onsite wastewater
- 4 recycling treatment technologies guide, permits for installation of an onsite wastewater
- 5 treatment system, and investigation of onsite wastewater treatment systems; to repeal section
- 6 23-35-02.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the onsite wastewater recycling
- 7 technical committee; to provide a penalty; and to provide an effective date.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-35-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 23-35-02.2. <u>Public health units to adoptAdoption of</u> onsite wastewater recycling treatment <u>technologies</u> guide <u>- Issuance of permit for onsite wastewater treatment</u> system installation Inspection Penalty.
 - 1. Each public health unit and board of health shall adopt, administer, and enforce the statewide technical guide for onsite wastewater recycling treatment technologies and sewage distribution technologies established by the onsite wastewater recycling technical committee board.
 - In accordance with the statewide technical guide for onsite wastewater recycling
 treatment technologies, a public health unit or board of health shall issue a permit for
 installation of an onsite wastewater treatment system.
- 3. A person may not install an onsite wastewater treatment system without a permit
 issued under this section. If the public health unit or board of health denies a permit
 under this section, the denial must be in writing and accompanied by findings of fact
 supporting the decision to deny the permit.

- 4. A public health unit and board of health may inspect a newly constructed onsite
 wastewater treatment system. If, upon inspection the public health unit or board of
 health determines any part of the system is not constructed in accordance with the
 minimum standards of the statewide technical guide, the permit applicant or installer,
 or both, shall correct the defects. A system may not be placed in service until all
 defects have been corrected.
- 5. A public health unit and board of health shall receive and investigate a report of
 unsanitary conditions in existence at an onsite wastewater system site or that any
 construction or work regulated under this section is dangerous; unsafe; unsanitary; a
 nuisance; a risk to life, health, or property; or otherwise in violation of the statewide
 technical guide.
- 12 <u>6.</u> The public health unit or board of health may charge a fee, not to exceed one hundred

 dollars, for issuance of a permit, conducting an inspection, reviewing a plan,

 evaluating a site, filing a variance request, and filing an appeal under this section.
 - 7. Violation of the statewide technical guide for onsite wastewater recycling treatment technologies is an infraction for each violation. Each day a violation continues is considered a separate offense.
- SECTION 2. A new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

- 21 As used in this chapter:
- 1. "Board" means the onsite wastewater board.
- 23 2. "Board of health" has the meaning provided under section 23-35-01.
- 24 3. "Licensee" means an installer issued a license under this chapter.
- 25 4. "Public health unit" has the meaning provided under section 23-35-01.
- 26 <u>5.</u> "Regulatory authority" means a public health unit or board of health.
- 27 **Board Appointment.**
- Beginning on the effective date of this Act, the onsite wastewater board is comprised
 of the onsite wastewater recycling technical committee established under section
- 30 <u>23-35-02.3.</u>

1	<u>2.</u>	2. Beginning August 1, 2024, the governor shall replace the members of the board with	
2		five licensees. The terms of office of the initial members must be staggered so no	
3		more than two terms expire on the thirty-first day of July of each year and thereafter	
4		the term of each member is three years. Each member shall qualify by taking the oath	
5		required of civil officers and shall hold office until a successor is appointed. The	
6		governor shall replace a vacancy on the board by appointment for the unexpired term.	
7		The governor may remove a member from the board upon a showing of good cause.	
8	Board powers and duties.		
9	<u>1.</u>	The board shall:	
10		a. Adopt rules to implement this chapter, including setting education and experience	
11		qualifications for licensure and continuing education requirements for licensure	
12		renewal.	
13		b. Issue a license to a qualified applicant who pays the required fee.	
14		c. Elect from its membership a presiding officer and a secretary.	
15	<u>2.</u>	The board may hire an executive director or other staff to assist the board with	
16		administration of this chapter.	
17	Application.		
18	This chapter applies to the installation of all onsite wastewater treatment systems within the		
19	state.		
20	<u>Licensure required - Penalty.</u>		
21	Beginning January 1, 2025, a person may not engage in installing an onsite wastewater		
22	treatment system unless licensed by the board. A violation of this section is an infraction.		
23	Exemptions.		
24	The board shall establish by rule exemptions to the licensure requirements of this chapter		
25	which address installations for new construction. The rules adopted under this section may		
26	distinguish between the type of system being installed and may require a property owner to		
27	attend a board-approved training as a condition to perform the work.		
28	<u>Licensure - Fees.</u>		
29	<u>The</u>	board shall issue the following licenses to a qualified applicant who pays the required	
30	fee:

1 An apprentice installer license, which qualifies the licensee to work under a level one, 2 two, or three license holder. The fee for licensure and license renewal as an 3 apprentice installer is twenty-five dollars per year. 4 A level one installer license, which qualifies the licensee to install a septic tank and 2. 5 conventional trench system. The fee for licensure and license renewal as a level one 6 installer is two hundred twenty-five dollars per year. 7 A level two installer license, which qualifies the licensee to install multiple tanks, 3. 8 mounds, at-grades, beds, and pressurized systems with pumps. The fee for licensure 9 and license renewal as a level two installer is two hundred twenty-five dollars per year. 10 A level three master level installer license, which qualifies the licensee to install 11 commercial systems, industrial systems, and systems that accept more than two 12 thousand five hundred gallons [9463.53 liters] per day. The fee for licensure and 13 license renewal as a level three master level installer is two hundred twenty-five 14 dollars per year. 15 Licensure of out-of-state installers. 16 The board shall issue a license to an applicant who is licensed as an installer by an out-of-17 state jurisdiction if the applicant is in good standing in the out-of-state jurisdiction. 18 Regulatory authority. 19 A licensed installer shall comply with the statewide technical guide for onsite wastewater 20 recycling treatment technologies adopted by the regulatory authority when installing an onsite 21 wastewater treatment system. 22 Disciplinary actions. 23 Installation of an onsite wastewater treatment system by a licensee in violation of this 24 chapter or rules adopted by the board is cause for revocation of, suspension of, or refusal to 25 renew a license. Disciplinary actions must be conducted in accordance with chapter 28-32. 26 Statewide technical guide. 27 <u>1.</u> The board shall develop and publish a statewide guide for onsite wastewater recycling 28 treatment technologies for adoption by regulatory authorities under section 23-35-02.2. 29 At a minimum, the statewide technical guide for onsite wastewater recycling treatment 30 technologies must address:

A standardized onsite wastewater treatment system permit form.

9	<u>g.</u>	Circumstances under which special systems of treatment and disposal may be

11	<u>h.</u>	Circumstances under which the regulatory authority may issue a variance.

17	SECTION 3. REPEAL. Section 23-35-02.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.			
18	SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 1 of this Act becomes effective January 1, 2025,			
19	and section 3	of this Act becomes effective August 1, 2024.
