- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to optional career and technical education high school curriculum; and to
- 3 amend and reenact section 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 4 minimum requirements for high school graduation.

## 5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is

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- Except as provided in section 15.1-21-02.3, section 2 of this Act, and subsection 2, the

- b. Three units of mathematics, which may include one unit of computer science
  approved by the superintendent of public instruction;

    - (c) One unit of physics; or
  - (2) (a) One unit of biology;
