- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-02 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to intervention by the superintendent of public instruction for a
- 3 chronically low-performing school or school district; and to provide a report.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

6 and enacted as follows:

## 7 Intervention for chronically low-performing schools - Report.

- 8 <u>1.</u> <u>As used in this section, unless context otherwise requires:</u>
- 9a."Chronically-low performing district" means a school district for which auditing10and monitoring has revealed a consistent mishandling of processes, reporting, or
- 11 <u>funds resulting in inadequate educational services for the school district's</u>
- students and has had chronically low-performing schools within the school
  district.
- b. "Chronically low-performing school" means a school identified by the state for
  comprehensive support and improvement in accordance with the Every Student
  Succeeds Act [Pub. L. 114-95; 114 Stat. 1177; 20 U.S.C. 28 et seq.] for more

- 18 c. <u>"Inadequate educational services" include a lack of annual progress in academic</u>
  19 <u>achievement, student engagement, resource allocation, teacher effectiveness,</u>
  20 <u>chronic absenteeism, and persistent subgroup opportunity gaps.</u>
- 21 <u>2.</u> <u>The superintendent of public instruction shall intervene directly when a public school is</u>
- 22 <u>a chronically low-performing school and when a school district is a chronically</u>
- 23 <u>low-performing school district. The superintendent of public instruction shall conduct</u>
- 24 <u>an assessment and a review of past interventions of a chronically low-performing</u>

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1		school or school district to identify areas of insufficient performance and develop an		
2		improvement plan. An improvement plan under this section may include a directive		
3		from the superintendent of public instruction requiring:		
4		<u>a.</u>	Funds to be held in escrow for the school or school district or spent as	
5			designated by the superintendent of public instruction.	
6		<u>b.</u>	School or school district annexation, consolidation, or closure.	
7		<u>C.</u>	Changes to curriculum, training, instruction, assessment, or the school calendar	
8			in the school or school district.	
9		<u>d.</u>	Reassignment or hiring of school or school district staff to fill roles associated	
10			with school or school district needs.	
11	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	superintendent of public instruction annually shall report to the state board of	
12		<u>pub</u>	lic school education, the education standing committees of the legislative	
13		ass	embly during a legislative session, and an interim committee of the legislative	
14		mar	nagement when the legislative assembly is not in a legislative session regarding	
15		<u>the</u>	implementation of this section.
