- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 39-06-03 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to who may not receive an operator's license; to amend and reenact
- 3 section 39-01-01, subsection 2 of section 39-06-02, sections 39-06-03.1 and 39-06-07.1,
- 4 subsection 5 of section 39-06-14, and section 39-06-19 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 5 relating to motor vehicle definitions, nondriver photo identification cards, operator's license
- 6 applications, and expiration of operator's licenses; and to declare an emergency.

#### 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-01-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

### 10 **39-01-01. Definitions.**

- 11 In this title, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- "Appropriate licensed addiction treatment program" means an addiction treatment
   program conducted by an addiction facility licensed by the department of health and
   human services or conducted by a licensed individual specifically trained in addiction
   treatment.
- 16 2. "Authorized emergency vehicles":

#### a. "Class A" authorized emergency vehicles means:

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- (1) Vehicles of a governmentally owned fire department.
- 19(2)Vehicles when operated by or under the control of a police officer having20authority to enforce the provisions of this title or by a salaried employee of a21municipal police department within the municipality or by a sheriff or deputy22sheriff not including special deputy sheriffs, or by the director of the23department of corrections and rehabilitation and the director's authorized

30	b. "	ss B" authorized emergency ve	chicles means wreckers and such other
31	e	rgency vehicles as are authori	zed by the local authorities.

1		c. "C	class C" authorized emergency vehicles means:
2		(1	Vehicles used by the state division of homeland security or local division of
3			emergency management organizations.
4		(2	Vehicles used by volunteer firefighters while performing their assigned
5			disaster and emergency responsibilities.
6		(3	Vehicles, other than ambulances, used by emergency medical services
7			personnel.
8		(4	Vehicles used by volunteer search and rescue personnel if performing an
9			emergency operation or duty upon the request of a state entity, political
10			subdivision, or volunteer fire department. A volunteer organization may
11			classify a personal vehicle as a class C emergency vehicle if needed to
12			assist in a search and rescue operation in accordance with this paragraph.
13			As used in this paragraph, "search and rescue" means deployment,
14			coordination, and use of available resources and personnel in locating,
15			relieving the distress, and preserving the life of and removing an individual
16			who is missing, trapped, or lost in the backcountry, remote areas, or waters
17			of the state. The term includes water and dive rescue.
18	3.	"Bicycl	e" means every device propelled solely by human power upon which any
19		person	may ride, having two tandem wheels or two parallel wheels and one forward or
20		rearwa	rd wheel. The term includes an electric bicycle.
21	4.	"Bus" r	neans every motor vehicle designed for carrying more than ten passengers and
22		used fo	r the transportation of persons, and every motor vehicle, other than a taxicab,
23		design	ed and used for the transportation of persons for compensation. Provided,
24		every r	notor vehicle designed for carrying not more than fifteen persons and used for a
25		ridesha	ring arrangement, as defined in section 8-02-07, is not a "bus".
26	5.	"Busine	ess district" means the territory contiguous to a highway when fifty percent or
27		more o	f the frontage thereon for a distance of three hundred feet [91.44 meters] or
28		more is	occupied by buildings in use for business.
29	6.	"Camp	ing trailer" means a vehicular portable unit mounted on wheels and constructed
30		with co	llapsible partial side walls that fold for towing by another vehicle and unfold at

- the campsite to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel
   use.
- 7. "Cancellation" means a license is annulled and terminated because of an error or
  defect or because the licensee is no longer entitled to the operator's license, but the
  cancellation of a license is without prejudice and application for a new license may be
  made at any time after the cancellation.
- 8. "Child restraint system" means a specifically designed device, built-in seating system,
  or belt-positioning booster that meets the federal motor vehicle safety standards and is
  permanently affixed to a motor vehicle, is affixed to the vehicle by a safety belt or
  universal attachment system, or is combined with a federally compliant safety belt
  system.
- 9. "Commercial freighting" means the carriage of things other than passengers, for hire,
  except that such term does not include:
- 14 a. The carriage of things other than passengers within the limits of the same city;
- b. Carriage by local dray lines of baggage or goods to or from a railroad station from
  or to places in such city or in the immediate vicinity thereof, in this state, and not
  to exceed two miles [3.22 kilometers] from the corporate or recognized limits of
  said city; or
- c. Hauling done by farmers for their neighbors in transporting agricultural products
   to or from market.
- 21 10. "Commercial passenger transportation" means the carriage of passengers for hire,
  22 except that the term does not include:
- 23 a. The carriage of passengers within the limits of a city.
- b. The carriage by local buslines of passengers to or from a railroad station from or
  to places within any city or within two miles [3.22 kilometers] of the limits of the
  city.
- c. The carriage of passengers under a ridesharing arrangement, as defined in
  section 8-02-07.
- 11. "Commissioner" means the director of the department of transportation of this state,
  acting directly or through authorized agents as provided by section 24-02-01.3.

- 12. "Controlled-access highway" means every highway, street, or roadway in respect to
   which owners or occupants of abutting lands and other persons have no legal right of
   access to or from the same except at such points only and in such manner as may be
   determined by the public authority having jurisdiction over such highway, street, or
   roadway.
- 6 13. "Conviction" means a final order or judgment or conviction by the North Dakota
  7 supreme court, any lower court having jurisdiction, a tribal court, or a court in another
  8 state if an appeal is not pending and the time for filing a notice of appeal has elapsed.
  9 Subject to the filing of an appeal, the term includes:
- 10 a. An imposed and suspended sentence;
- b. A deferred imposition of sentence under subsection 4 of section 12.1-32-02; or
- c. A forfeiture of bail or collateral deposited to secure a defendant's appearance in
  court and the forfeiture has not been vacated.
- 14 14. "Crosswalk" means that part of a roadway at an intersection included within the
  15 connections of the lateral lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway
  16 measured from the curbs, or, in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the
  17 traversable roadway; or any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere
  18 distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines or other markings on the surface.
- 19 15. "Dealer" means every person, partnership, corporation, or limited liability company
  engaged in the business of buying, selling, or exchanging motor vehicles, or who
  advertises, or holds out to the public as engaged in the buying, selling, or exchanging
  of motor vehicles, or who engages in the buying of motor vehicles for resale. Any
  person, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, or association doing
  business in several cities or in several locations within a city must be considered a
  separate dealer in each such location.
- 26 16. "Department" means the department of transportation of this state as provided by27 section 24-02-01.1.
- 28 17. "Director" means the director of the department of transportation of this state as
  29 provided by section 24-02-01.3.
- 30 18. "Driver" means every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.

1	19.	"Electric bicycle" means a bicycle equipped with fully operable pedals, a saddle or
2		seat for the rider, and an electric motor of seven hundred fifty or fewer watts which
3		meets the requirements of one of the following three classes:
4		a. A class 1 electric bicycle if the motor provides assistance only when the individual
5		is pedaling and the motor ceases to provide assistance when a speed of twenty
6		miles [32 kilometers] per hour is achieved.
7		b. A class 2 electric bicycle if the motor is capable of propelling the bicycle without
8		the individual pedaling and the motor ceases to provide assistance when a speed
9		of twenty miles [32 kilometers] per hour is achieved.
10		c. A class 3 electric bicycle if the motor provides assistance only when the individual
11		is pedaling and the motor ceases to provide assistance when a speed of
12		twenty-eight miles [45 kilometers] per hour is achieved.
13	20.	"Electronic communication device" means an electronic device, including a wireless
14		telephone, personal digital assistant, a portable or mobile computer or other device,
15		and video display equipment. The term does not include a global positioning system or
16		navigation system or a device that is physically or electronically integrated into the
17		motor vehicle.
18	21.	"Essential parts" means all integral and body parts of a vehicle of a type required to be
19		registered hereunder, the removal, alteration, or substitution of which would tend to
20		conceal the identity of the vehicle or substantially alter its appearance, model, type, or
21		mode of operation and includes all integral parts and body parts, the removal,
22		alteration, or substitution of which will tend to conceal the identity or substantially alter
23		the appearance of the vehicle.
24	22.	"Explosives" means any chemical compound or mechanical mixture that is commonly
25		used or intended for the purpose of producing an explosion and which contains any
26		oxidizing and combustive units or other ingredients in such proportions, quantities, or
27		packing that an ignition by fire, by friction, by concussion, by percussion, or by
28		detonator of any part of the compound or mixture may cause such a sudden
29		generation of highly heated gases that the resultant gaseous pressures are capable of
30		producing destructive effects on contiguous objects or by destroying life or limb.

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1	23.	"Farm tractor" includes every motor vehicle designed and used primarily as a farm
2		implement for drawing plows, moving machines, and other implements of husbandry.
3	24.	"Farm trailer" includes those trailers and semitrailers towed by a bona fide resident
4		farmer hauling the farmer's own agricultural, horticultural, dairy, and other farm
5		products if the gross weight, not including the towing vehicle, does not exceed
6		twenty-four thousand pounds [10886.22 kilograms].
7	25.	"Fifth-wheel travel trailer" means a vehicular unit mounted on wheels, designed to
8		provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use, of such size
9		or weight as not to require a special highway movement permit and designed to be
10		towed by a motorized vehicle that contains a towing mechanism that is mounted
11		above or forward of the tow vehicle's rear axle.
12	26.	"Flammable liquid" means any liquid which has a flash point of seventy degrees
13		Fahrenheit [21.11 degrees Celsius], or less, as determined by a tagliabue or
14		equivalent closed-cup test device.
15	27.	"Foreign vehicle" means every motor vehicle which is brought into this state other than
16		in the ordinary course of business by or through a manufacturer or dealer and which
17		has not been registered in this state.
18	28.	"Gross weight" means the weight of a vehicle without load plus the weight of any load
19		thereon.
20	29.	"Guest" means and includes a person who accepts a ride in any vehicle without giving
21		compensation therefor.
22	30.	"Highway" means the entire width between the boundary lines of every way publicly
23		maintained when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of
24		vehicular travel and of every way privately maintained within a mobile home park,
25		trailer park, or campground containing five or more lots for occupancy by mobile
26		homes, travel trailers, or tents when any part thereof is open for purposes of vehicular
27		travel.
28	31.	"House car" or "motor home" means a motor vehicle which has been reconstructed or
29		manufactured primarily for private use as a temporary or recreational dwelling and
30		having at least four of the following permanently installed systems:
31		a. Cooking facilities.

1		b. Icebox or mechanical refrigerator.
2		c. Potable water supply including plumbing and a sink with faucet either
3		self-contained or with connections for an external source, or both.
4		d. Self-contained toilet or a toilet connected to a plumbing system with connection
5		for external water disposal, or both.
6		e. Heating or air-conditioning system, or both, separate from the vehicle engine or
7		the vehicle engine electrical system.
8		f. A 110-115 volt alternating current electrical system separate from the vehicle
9		engine electrical system either with its own power supply or with a connection for
10		an external source, or both, or a liquefied petroleum system and supply.
11	32.	"Implement of husbandry" means every vehicle designed and adapted exclusively for
12		agricultural, horticultural, or livestock raising operations or for lifting or carrying an
13		implement of husbandry and in either case not subject to registration if used upon the
14		highway.
15	33.	"Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the
16		lateral curb lines, or, if none, then the lateral boundary lines of the roadways of two
17		highways which join one another at, or approximately at, right angles, or the area
18		within which vehicles traveling upon different highways joining at any other angle may
19		come in conflict. Where a highway includes two roadways thirty feet [9.14 meters] or
20		more apart, then every crossing of each roadway of such divided highway by an
21		intersecting highway must be regarded as a separate intersection. In the event such
22		intersecting highway also includes two roadways thirty feet [9.14 meters] or more
23		apart, then every crossing of two roadways of such highways must be regarded as a
24		separate intersection.
25	34.	"Intoxicating liquor" means and includes any beverage containing alcohol.
26	35.	"Judgment" means any judgment which has become final by expiration without appeal
27		of the time within which an appeal might have been perfected, or by final affirmation
28		on appeal, rendered by a court of competent jurisdiction of any state of the United
29		States, upon a claim for relief arising out of ownership, maintenance, or use of any
30		motor vehicle, for damages, including damages for care and loss of services, because
31		of bodily injury to or death of any person, or for damages because of injury to or

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1		destruction of property, including the loss of use thereof, or upon a claim for relief on
2		an agreement of settlement for such damages.
3	36.	"Lawful presence" or "lawfully present" means lawful presence or lawfully present as
4		defined under the Immigration and Nationality Act [8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.]. The terms
5		do not include:
6		a. An individual who is subject to deportation from the United States; or
7		b. An individual who is not otherwise lawfully present.
8	<u>37.</u>	"Legal owner" means a person who holds the legal title to a vehicle.
9	<del>37.<u>38.</u></del>	"Licensed health care provider" means doctor of medicine, doctor of osteopathy,
10		doctor of chiropractic, optometrist, psychologist, advanced practice registered nurse,
11		or physician assistant who is licensed, certified, or registered in accordance with laws
12		and regulations in this or another state.
13	<del>38.<u>39.</u></del>	"Lienholder" means a person holding a security interest in a vehicle.
14	<del>39.<u>40.</u></del>	"Local authorities" includes every county, municipal, and other local board or body
15		having authority to adopt local police regulations under the constitution and laws of
16		this state.
17	<del>40.<u>41.</u></del>	"Mail" means to deposit mail properly addressed and with postage prepaid with the
18		United States postal service.
19	<u>41.42.</u>	"Manifest injustice" means a specific finding by the court that the imposition of
20		sentence is unreasonably harsh or shocking to the conscience of a reasonable
21		person, with due consideration of the totality of circumstances.
22	<u>42.43.</u>	"Manufactured home" means a structure, transportable in one or more sections, that,
23		in the traveling mode, is eight body feet [2.44 meters] or more in width or forty body
24		feet [12.19 meters] or more in length, or, when erected onsite, is three hundred twenty
25		square feet [29.73 square meters] or more, and which is built on a permanent chassis
26		and designed to be used as a dwelling with or without a permanent foundation when
27		connected to the required utilities, and includes the plumbing, heating, air-conditioning,
28		and electrical systems contained therein. The term includes any structure that meets
29		all of the requirements of this subsection except the size requirements and with
30		respect to whether the manufacturer voluntarily files a certification required by the

United States secretary of housing and urban development and complies with the
 standards established under title 42 of the United States Code.

3 43.44. "Manufacturer" means any person who manufactures, assembles, or imports and sells
4 new motor vehicles to new motor vehicle dealers for resale in the state; but such term
5 does not include a person who assembles or specially builds interior equipment on a
6 completed vehicle supplied by another manufacturer, distributor, or supplier.

7 44.45. "Metal tires" includes all tires the surface of which in contact with the highway is wholly
8 or partly of metal or other hard, nonresilient material except that this provision does
9 not apply to pneumatic tires.

10 45.46. "Mobile home" means a structure, either single or multisectional, which is built on a
11 permanent chassis, ordinarily designed for human living quarters, either on a
12 temporary or permanent basis, owned or used as a residence or place of business of
13 the owner or occupant, which is either attached to utility services or is twenty-seven
14 feet [8.23 meters] or more in length.

15 46.47. "Modular unit" includes every factory fabricated transportable building unit designed to
16 be incorporated with similar units at a building site into a modular structure to be used
17 for residential, commercial, educational, or industrial purposes.

18 47.48. "Motor vehicle" includes every vehicle that is self-propelled, every vehicle that is
19 propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operated
20 upon rails, and, for purposes of motor vehicle registration, title registration, and
21 operator's licenses, motorized bicycles. The term does not include a snowmobile as
22 defined in section 39-24-01 or an electric bicycle.

48.49. "Motorcycle" means every motor vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the
rider and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground,
but excluding implements of husbandry. The term does not include an electric bicycle.

49:50. "Motorized bicycle" means a vehicle equipped with two or three wheels, foot pedals to
permit muscular propulsion or footrests for use by the operator, a power source
providing up to a maximum of two brake horsepower having a maximum piston or
rotor displacement of 3.05 cubic inches [49.98 milliliters] if a combustion engine is
used, which will propel the vehicle, unassisted, at a speed not to exceed thirty miles
[48.28 kilometers] per hour on a level road surface, and a power drive system that

1		functions directly or automatically only, not requiring clutching or shifting by the
2		operator after the drive system is engaged, and the vehicle may not have a width
3		greater than thirty-two inches [81.28 centimeters]. The term does not include an
4		electric bicycle.
5	<del>50.<u>51.</u></del>	"Motor-powered recreational vehicle" means a motorcycle, unconventional vehicle, or
6		off-highway vehicle as defined in section 39-29-01, or a snowmobile as defined in
7		section 39-24-01. The term does not include an electric bicycle.
8	<del>51.<u>52.</u></del>	"Nonresident" means any person who is not a resident of this state.
9	<del>52.<u>53.</u></del>	"Nonresident's operating privilege" means the privilege conferred upon a nonresident
10		by the laws of this state pertaining to the operation by such person of a motor vehicle
11		or the use of a vehicle owned by such person, in this state.

- 12 <u>53.54.</u> "Official traffic-control devices" means all signs, signals, markings, and devices not
  13 inconsistent with this title placed or erected by authority of a public body or official
  14 having jurisdiction, for the purpose of regulating, warning, or guiding traffic.
- 15 <u>54.55.</u> "Operator" means every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a motor
  16 vehicle upon a highway or who is exercising control over or steering a vehicle being
  17 towed by a motor vehicle.
- 18 <u>55.56.</u> "Operator's license", "driver's license", or "license to operate a motor vehicle" means
  any operator's or driver's license or any other license or permit to operate a motor
  vehicle issued under, or granted by, the laws of this state, including:
- 21 a. Any temporary license or instruction permit;
- b. The privilege of any person to drive a motor vehicle whether such person holds a
  valid license; or
- 24 c. Any nonresident's operating privilege as defined in this section.
- 56.57. "Owner" means a person, other than a lienholder, having the property in or title to a
  vehicle. The term includes a person entitled to the use and possession of a vehicle
  subject to a security interest in another person, but excludes a lessee under a lease
  not intended as security.
- 57.58. "Park", when prohibited, means the standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not,
  otherwise than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or
  unloading.

- 1 <u>58.59.</u> "Passenger motor vehicle" means every motor vehicle designed principally for the
- transportation of persons and includes vehicles which utilize a truck chassis, but have
  a seating capacity for four or more passengers.
- 4 <del>59.</del>60. "Pedestrian" means any person afoot.
- 60.61. "Person" includes every natural person, firm, copartnership, association, corporation,
  or limited liability company.

7 61.62. "Pneumatic tires" includes all tires inflated with compressed air.

- 8 62.63. "Pole trailer" means every vehicle without motive power designed to be drawn by
  9 another vehicle and attached to the towing vehicle by means of a reach, or pole, or by
  10 being boomed or otherwise secured to the towing vehicle, and ordinarily used for
  11 transporting long or irregularly shaped loads such as poles, pipes, or structural
  12 members capable, generally, of sustaining themselves as beams between the
  13 supporting connections.
- 14 <u>63.64.</u> "Police officer" means every officer authorized to direct or regulate traffic or to make
  arrests for violations of traffic regulations.
- 16 64.65. "Primary source identity document" means documentary evidence of an individual's
  17 name, date of birth, and legal presence required in chapters 39-06 and 39-06.2 related
  18 to the issuance of permits, licenses, and nondriver photo identification cards, and
  19 retained in the driver record.
- 20 <u>65.66.</u> "Private road or driveway" means every way or place in private ownership and used
  21 for vehicular travel by the owner and those having express or implied permission from
  22 the owner, but not by other persons.
- 23 "Proof of financial responsibility" means proof of ability to respond in damages for <del>66.<u>67.</u></del> 24 liability, on account of accidents occurring after the effective date of the proof, arising 25 out of the ownership, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle, in the amount of 26 twenty-five thousand dollars because of bodily injury to or death of one person in any 27 one accident, and, subject to the limit for one person, in the amount of fifty thousand 28 dollars because of bodily injury to or death of two or more persons in any one 29 accident, and in the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars because of injury to or 30 destruction of property of others in any one accident.

"Railroad" means a carrier of persons or property upon cars, other than streetcars, 2 operated upon stationary rails. 3 <del>68.</del>69. "Railroad sign or signal" means any sign, signal, or device erected by authority of a 4 public body or official or by a railroad and intended to give notice of the presence of 5 railroad tracks or the approach of a railroad train. 6 <del>69.</del>70. "Reconstructed vehicle" means any vehicle, of a type required to be registered, 7 materially altered from its original construction by the removal, addition, or substitution 8 of new or used essential parts. 9 "Recreational vehicle" means any motorcycle not qualified for registration, off-highway <del>70.</del>71. 10 vehicle, snowmobile, vessel, or personal watercraft. The term does not include an 11 electric bicycle. 12 <del>71.</del>72. "Residence district" means territory contiguous to a highway not comprising a 13 business district, when the frontage on such highway for a distance of three hundred 14 feet [91.44 meters] or more is occupied mainly by dwellings, or by dwellings and 15 buildings in use for business. 16 "Revocation" means that the operator's license is terminated and may not be renewed <del>72.</del>73. 17 or restored, except on application for a new license presented to and acted upon by 18 the director after the expiration of the period of revocation. 19 <del>73.</del>74. "Right of way" means the privilege of the immediate use of a roadway. 20 <del>74.<u>75.</u></del> "Road tractor" means every motor vehicle designed and used for drawing other 21 vehicles and not so constructed as to carry any load thereon either independently or 22 any part of the weight of a vehicle or load so drawn. 23 "Roadway" means that portion of a highway improved, designed, or ordinarily used for <del>75.<u>76.</u></del> 24 vehicular travel, exclusive of the berm or shoulder. In the event a highway includes two 25 or more separate roadways, the term "roadway" as used herein refers to any such 26 roadway separately but not to all such roadways collectively. 27 <del>76.</del>77. "Saddle mount" means placing the front wheels of the drawn vehicle upon the bed of 28 the drawing vehicle. 29 <del>77.</del>78. "Safety zone" means the area or space officially set aside within a highway for the 30 exclusive use of pedestrians and which is so plainly marked or indicated by proper 31 signs as to be plainly visible at all times while set aside as a safety zone.

- 78.79. "Salvage certificate of title" means a document issued by the department for purposes
   of proof of ownership of a salvage or destroyed vehicle and not acceptable for motor
   vehicle registration purposes.
- 4 <del>79.</del>80. "Schoolbus" means a motor vehicle designed or used to carry more than ten 5 passengers in addition to the driver, and is used for the purpose of transporting 6 preprimary, primary, or secondary school students from home to school, from school to 7 home, or to and from school-related events. For the purposes of chapter 39-21, 8 "schoolbus" means any motor vehicle that is owned or leased by a public or 9 governmental agency and used to transport preprimary, primary, or secondary school 10 students to or from school or to or from school-related events, or is privately owned 11 and operated for compensation to transport preprimary, primary, or secondary school 12 students to or from school or to or from school-related events. Schoolbus does not 13 include a bus used as a common carrier.
- 80.81. "Semitrailer" includes every vehicle of the trailer type so designed and used in
  conjunction with a truck or truck tractor that some part of its own weight and that of its
  own load rests upon or is carried by a truck or truck tractor, except that it does not
  include a "housetrailer" or "mobile home".
- 18 81.82. "Sidewalk" means that portion of a street between the curb lines, or the lateral lines of
  a roadway, and the adjacent property lines, intended for use of pedestrians.
- 20 82.83. "Solid tire" includes every tire made of rubber or other resilient material other than a
  21 pneumatic tire.
- 83.84. "Special mobile equipment" means every vehicle not designed or used primarily for
  the transportation of persons or property and only incidentally operated or moved over
  a highway.
- 84.85. "Specially constructed vehicle" means any vehicle which was not constructed
  originally under the distinct name, make, model, or type by a generally recognized
  manufacturer of vehicles.
- 28 <u>85.86.</u> "Stand" or "standing" means the halting of a vehicle, whether occupied or not,
  29 otherwise than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in receiving
- 30 or discharging passengers.

86.87. "State" means a state, territory, or possession of the United States, the District of
 Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, or a province of the Dominion of
 Canada.

4 87.88. "Stop", when required, means complete cessation from movement.

- 88.89. "Stop" or "stopping", when prohibited, means any halting, even momentarily, of a
  vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other
  traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic-control sign or
  signal.
- 9 89.90. "Street" means the entire width between boundary lines of every way publicly
  10 maintained when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of
  11 vehicular travel.
- 12 <u>90.91.</u> "Superintendent" means the superintendent of the North Dakota state highway patrol,
  13 acting directly or through authorized employees of the superintendent.
- 14 <u>91.92.</u> "Suspension" means that the operator's license is temporarily withdrawn but only
  15 during the period of the suspension.
- 16 92.93. "Through highway" means every highway or portion thereof on which vehicular traffic
  17 is given preferential right of way, and at the entrances to which vehicular traffic from
  18 intersecting highways is required by law to yield right of way to vehicles on such
  19 through highway and in obedience to either a stop sign or yield sign, when such signs
  20 are erected by law.
- 21 <u>93.94.</u> "Trackless trolley coach" means every motor vehicle which is propelled by electric
  22 power obtained from overhead trolley wires but not operated upon rails.
- 94.95. "Traffic" means pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, streetcars, and other
   conveyances either singly or together while using any highway for purposes of travel.
- 25 95.96. "Traffic-control signal" means any device, whether manually, electrically, or
- 26 mechanically operated, by which traffic is alternately directed to stop and to proceed.
- 96.97. "Trailer" includes every vehicle without motive power designed to carry property or
  passengers wholly on its own structure and to be drawn by a motor vehicle, except
  that it does not include a "housetrailer" or "mobile home", which terms mean a vehicle
  as defined in this subsection which is designed and intended for use as living or

sleeping quarters for people and which is not used for commercial hauling of
 passengers.

3 97.98. "Travel trailer" means a vehicular unit mounted on wheels, designed to provide
4 temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use, and of such size or
5 weight as not to require a special highway movement permit when towed by a
6 motorized vehicle.

- 7 <u>98.99.</u> "Truck" includes every motor vehicle designed, used, or maintained primarily for
  8 transportation of property.
- 9 <u>99.100.</u> "Truck camper" means a portable unit that is constructed to provide temporary living
  quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use; consists of a roof, floor, and sides;
- and is designed to be loaded onto and unloaded from the bed of a pickup truck.
   100.101. "Truck tractor" includes every motor vehicle designed and used primarily for drawing
- other vehicles and not so constructed as to carry a load other than a part of the weightof the vehicle and load so drawn.
- 15 <u>101.102.</u> "Urban district" means the territory contiguous to and including any street which is built
- 16 up with structures devoted to business, industry, or dwelling houses situated at
- intervals of less than one hundred feet [30.48 meters] for a distance of a quarter of a
  mile [402.34 meters] or more.
- 19 102.103. "Used vehicle" means a motor vehicle which has been sold, bargained, exchanged,
   20 given away, or the title to which has been transferred to another, by the person who
- first acquired it from the manufacturer or importer, dealer, or agent of the manufactureror importer.
- 103.104. "Vehicle" includes every device in, upon, or by which any person or property may be
   transported or drawn upon a public highway, except devices moved by human power
   or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks. The term does not include an
   electric bicycle.

An 13 application for an identification card must be made on a form furnished by the director. 14 Within thirty days from receipt of a complete application that includes the applicant's 15 social security number, unless the applicant is a <u>lawfully present</u> nonimmigrant who is 16 not eligible for a social security number, the director shall determine whether to issue 17 and, if appropriate, issue a nondriver photo identification card to an applicant. The 18 director may not withhold the issuance of a nondriver color photo identification card 19 without reasonable cause. If the applicant is under the age of eighteen or at least the 20 age of eighteen and under the age of twenty-one, the photo must be against the same 21 color background required on a motor vehicle operator's license for an operator of that 22 age. Subject to section 39-06-19, identification cards expire eight years from the date 23 of issue and may be renewed. The application must contain other information as the 24 director may require to improve identity security. 25 2. The director shall issue a nondriver color photo identification card to any lawfully 26 present resident who at the time of application is not a citizen of the United States and 27 who fulfills the requirements of this section. The identification card must be designed
- in a manner to clearly make the card distinguishable from a similar card issued to a
  citizen of the United States and resident of this state. The card may be replaced with a
  card issued to a citizen of this country and resident of this state only when proof of

- United States citizenship is provided by the individual and any applicable replacement
   fee listed in section 39-06-49 is paid.
- 3. To confirm the identity, date of birth, and legallawful presence of the applicant, the
  director or examining officer shall require satisfactory evidence be provided by the
  applicant. Satisfactory evidence includes a certified copy of the applicant's birth
  certificate or other evidence reasonably calculated to permit the determination of the
  date of birth, identification, and legallawful presence of the applicant by the director or
  examining officer. The director may require an applicant for an identification card to
  provide a social security card and proof of residence address.
- The application fee is listed in section 39-06-49. Except for a duplicate or replacement
   card, the director may not charge a fee to provide a nondriver photo identification card
   to an eligible applicant.
- 5. Any information obtained by the director from an applicant for the issuance, renewal,
  or replacement of an identification card may not be released unless allowed under
  section 39-16-03.
- 16 6. The director may advertise the availability and the use of the card.
- Identification cards issued under this section are sufficient identification for all
   identification purposes, except the cards issued to residents who are not citizens of
   the limited Otates are not citizen for summary of particular.
- 19 <u>the United States are not identification for purposes of voting</u>.

20		older is twelve midnight on the anniversary of the birthday in the second subsequent
21		year ending in an odd numeral. The expiration date of a noncommercial operator's
22		license for an individual whose birth occurred in a year ending in an even numeral is
23		twelve midnight on the anniversary of the birthday in the third subsequent year ending
24		in an even numeral, except for an individual who, at the time of renewal, is
25		seventy-eight years of age or older is twelve midnight on the anniversary of the
26		birthday in the second subsequent year ending in an even numeral.
27	3.	The expiration date of a commercial operator's license for an individual whose birth
28		occurred in a year ending in an odd numeral is twelve midnight on the anniversary of
29		the birthday in the second subsequent year ending in an odd numeral. The expiration
30		date of a commercial operator's license for an individual whose birth occurred in a

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1 2 year ending in an even numeral is twelve midnight on the anniversary of the birthday in the second subsequent year ending in an even numeral.

AnA lawfully present individual who has a valid, unexpired nonimmigrant visa or 4 nonimmigrant visa status for entry into the United States, a pending application for-5 asylum in the United States, a pendingfully adjudicated grant of asylum in the United 6 States, or an approved application for temporary protected status in the United States, 7 approved deferred action status, or a pending application for adjustment of status to 8 that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence or conditional permanent 9 residence status in the United States will be issued a temporary operator's license or 10 nondriver photo identification card. The temporary operator's license or identification 11 card is valid only during the period of time of the applicant's authorized stay in the 12 United States or, if there is no definite end to the period of authorized stay, a period of 13 one year. The license or card may be renewed only upon presentation of valid and 14 satisfactory documentary evidence that the status has been extended.

15 5. An applicant for renewal must present the application with the fee for renewal of 16 license to the director not before ten months prior to the expiration date of the 17 operator's license. The director may require an examination of an applicant as upon 18 an original application. The director may require an applicant for renewal or a 19 substitute to provide documentation that confirms to the satisfaction of the director the 20 true identity, date of birth, and legallawful presence of the applicant and provide a 21 social security card or other satisfactory evidence of a social security number and 22 proof of residence address, if not previously completed or if there are changes to the 23 information already on file. The director may not issue a distinguishing number that is, 24 contains, can be converted to, or is an encrypted version of the applicant's social 25 security number.

6. The director may not renew an operator's license if the license has been suspended
under section 14-08.1-07. Upon the recommendation of the court, the director may
issue a temporary permit to the licensee under section 39-06.1-11 if the temporary
permit is necessary for the licensee to work and the court has determined the licensee
is making a good-faith effort to comply with the child support order.

1	7.	An applicant for renewal of an operator's license must provide a certificate of
2		examination from the driver licensing or examining authorities or a statement as to the
3		corrected and uncorrected vision of the applicant from a licensed physician or an

5		examination equipment at each location where a license may be renewed.

15	10.	A noncommercial applicant for an operator's license may not renew by mail or

18	SEC	TION 8. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
