- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 28-32-01 of
- 2 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to an exception to the Administrative Agencies Practice
- 3 Act; and to amend and reenact sections 54-59-09, 54-59-22, and subsection 2 of section

4 54-59-22.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to information technology standards and
5 services.

6 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA**:

- 7 SECTION 1. A new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 28-32-01 of the North Dakota
- 8 Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 9 <u>The information technology department with respect to administrative rules</u> 10 regarding the policies, standards, and guidelines developed under section

11 54-59-09.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-59-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 **54-59-09.** Information technology standards.

15 Based on information from state agencies and institutions, the department and the office of-

16 management and budget shall develop statewide information technology policies, standards,

17 and guidelines. The policies, standards, and guidelines must recognize the uniqueness of

18 certain agencies and state which agencies are included or exempted from the policies,

19 standards, and guidelines. The Quarterly and upon request, the policies, standards, and

20 guidelines must be reviewed by the state information technology advisory committee approved

21 by the legislative information technology committee. Each executive branch state agency and

institution, excluding the institutions under the control of the board of higher education, shall

23 comply with the policies and standards developed by the information technology department

24 and the office of management and budget unless the chief information officer exempts an

1 agency from the policies, standards, and guidelines to address situations unique to that agency. 2 Unless an exemption is granted by the chief information officer, each entity receiving wide area 3 network services provided by the department shall comply with the policies and standards 4 developed by the department with respect to access to or use of wide area network services. 5 The policies, standards, and guidelines developed under this section are exempt from the 6 rulemaking procedure in chapter 28-32. 7 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 54-59-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 54-59-22. Required use of electronic mail, file and print server administration, 10 database administration, application server, and hosting services. 11 Each state agency and institution, excluding the legislative and judicial branches, the 12 institutions under the control of the state board of higher education, the attorney general, the 13 veterans' home, and any entity exempted by the office of management and budget after-14 advisement by the information technology department, shall obtain electronic mail, file and print 15 server administration, database administration, storage, application server, and hosting services 16 through a delivery system established by the information technology department in conjunction-17 with the office of management and budget. The office of management and budget, after-18 receiving advice from the information technology department, shall establish policies and 19 guidelines for the delivery of services, including the transition from existing systems to 20 functional consolidation, with consideration given to the creation of efficiencies, cost-savings, 21 and improved quality of service. 22 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 54-59-22.1 of the North Dakota 23 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 24 2. The office of management and budget, after receiving advice from the information 25 technology department, shall establish policies and guidelines for the delivery of 26 desktop support services, including the transition from existing systems to functional 27 consolidation, with consideration given to the creation of efficiencies, cost-savings, 28 and improved quality of service. For purposes of this section "desktop support 29 services" means technical assistance and device management relating to the use of 30 personal computers and peripheral devices.
