- Add 0.5 FTE for brand marketing boosts an existing role to full-time (In Exec Budget / removed by Senate)
- Restores one-time funding for digital interactive initiative to \$425k (\$425k in Exec Budget / \$0 in Senate)
- 7. Adjusts one-time funding for historic building improvements to \$2.5m (was \$6,751,000 in Exec Budget and \$4.5 in Senate) (from SIIF)
- 8. Adjusts one-time funding for improving exhibit engagement to \$375k (was \$670k in both Exec & Senate) (\$300k from SIIF and \$75k from donations from foundation)
- Reduce one-time funding for 250<sup>th</sup> Celebration in 2026 to \$250k (reduced from \$1m in exec budget and \$750k in Senate version)
- 10. Add spending authority for a new federal contract: \$400k (from US Army Corps of Engineers \$1m over five years). Breakdown: \$200k for wages, \$30k for capital assets, \$170k for operating expenses.
- 11. Correction in Section 7: remove overstrike on 36 CFR 800
- 12. Add study of 55-02-07 (protection of historical sites/artifacts)
