

1 HB 1271 – Retired Teachers Returning with no contribution to TFFR

- 2 Testimony in opposition
- 3 Chairman Heinert and members of the House Education committee, my name is Dr.
- 4 Aimee Copas, and I am the Executive Director for the North Dakota Council of
- 5 Educational Leaders representing school leaders across North Dakota.
- 6 I am here to testify in opposition to BH 1271. There are currently three bills in different
- 7 committees that all focus on ways to allow retired teachers to return to work and receive
- 8 their retirement benefit. SB2258 and its sister bill HB 1219 both provide for a fiscally
- 9 responsible way for retired teachers to return to the profession due to teacher shortage
- issues and to not negatively impact their retirement nor tremendously impact the TFFR
- fund and its progress toward being fully funded. The bill before you today has good
- 12 intention to allow teachers back into the classroom but is NOT a bill that is fiscally
- 13 responsible way to do so. In this bill teachers return, retirement continues as in this bill
- before you today, BUT neither the employer or employee contribute to the fund. This
- 15 would dismantle and destroy the TFFR fund and in my opinion is not a fiscally
- responsible use of taxpayer dollars. According to the RIO office, we are set to have TFFR
- fully funded by 2048. If this bill passes, it will make it impossible for the fund to ever
- 18 be fully funded.
- 19 Because there are two other bills that provide the option for retired teachers to return
- 20 and they are both fiscally sound approaches, we'd ask that you give this bill a do not pass
- 21 and consider the others as viable options.
