- 2 Mandan Public Schools Dr. Jeff Fastnacht, Asst. Superintendent
- 3 Good morning, Chairman Elkin and members of the Senate
- 4 Education Committee.
- 5 It has been my pleasure over the past five years to have served as
- 6 the Assistant Superintendent for Mandan Public Schools. Over
- 7 this same period of time I have also served our profession as a
- 8 statewide leader as President of the North Dakota Association of
- 9 School Administrators (NDASA) and North Dakota Council of
- 10 Educational Leaders (NDCEL). I also had the privilege to serve
- on the State Board of Public School Education and the North
- Dakota Board of Career and Technical Education between 2018
- and 2022. I am speaking to you today in support of Amendment
- 1 of 2284, dealing with the composition of the State Board of
- 15 Public Education.
- 16 The State Board of Public School Education plays a vital role in
- setting the course for education in our state. Over the past five
- years it has expanded from a board dealing almost exclusively

with reorganizations and annexations, to now having a 1 supervisory role of Regional Education Associations (REAs) and 2 adopting the Learning Continuum. Within this session additional 3 duties including oversight of the Center for Distance Education 4 (CDE) are being proposed. The State Board and the Career and 5 Technical Education (CTE) Board, which are joined in law, work 6 on many detailed issues that affect our school districts. While 7 there is value in varied perspectives in making these decisions, I 8 would offer that many of these decisions require an understanding 9 of education, taxation, and governance that is inherent to the 10 experiences of a school district superintendent. Between these 11 boards this includes, but is not limited to, annexations and the 12 impact of large property transfers between districts, new courses 13 offerings and course requirements within CTC as well as the 14 recent proposal of a new funding formula. Again, I suggest that 15 the expertise of a school district superintendent and the 16 understanding of the nuance of these decisions is not just nice to 17 have, it is a necessity. 18

- North Dakota Century Code 15.1-01-01 appears to recognize the
- valuable role of the superintendent in the State Board. In fact,
- 3 subsection 3 clearly states that

The governor shall appoint new board members from a list
of names submitted by a committee consisting of the
president of North Dakota united, the president of the North
Dakota council of educational leaders, and the president of
the North Dakota school boards association. Two of the state
board members must be members of the North Dakota
school boards association

What is less clear is why this process has recently been changed 11 and no longer aligns with NDCC 15.1-01-01. In 2022, Dr. Steve 12 Holen, Superintendent in McKenzie County School District, and 13 I were at the end of our terms and subject to reappointment. As 14 is required, the Governor's Office made the decision to appoint 15 new members and neither Dr. Holen or I were reappointed. For 16 the sake of clarity, it is within the Governor's responsibilities to 17 either reappoint or make a new appointee. The concern is not if 18 Dr. Holen or I were reappointed, but rather that the process 19 outlined in 15.1-01-01(3) was not followed with the fidelity that 20

- should be expected with a process so clearly articulated in North
- 2 Dakota Century Code. In this case, no representatives were
- 3 offered by North Dakota United, North Dakota Council of
- 4 Educational Leaders or the North Dakota School Boards
- 5 Association. The selections were made from an application
- 6 process without input from the groups outlined in subsection 3.
- 7 This amendment is directing the representation on this critical
- 8 board. It replicates the requirement to have two NDSBA
- 9 representatives by now also requiring two NDASA
- 10 representatives. I feel this is a strong middle ground that still
- allows the Governor's Office to exercise choice for two members
- 12 through an application process that wouldn't contradict the
- process articulated in 15.1-01-01.
- 14 Chairman Elkin and members of the committee. Leadership
- matters and leaders that work daily in our schools have a unique
- perspective that should be represented on both of these boards.
