## 2 Testimony in opposition

Chairwoman Larson and members of the Senate Judiciary committee, my name is Dr.
Aimee Copas, and I am the Executive Director for the North Dakota Council of
Educational Leaders representing school leaders across North Dakota.

We are here following NDSBA and NDSOS in opposition to SB 2188. Our opposition is 6 7 not intended to represent an opposition of parents to have all the rights they need to 8 have regarding their children. I am a mother. I desire these rights. As an educator, I'd like to share that I have all these rights in North Dakota directly in part to the wise 9 actions of the ND legislature over many years. Bills very similar to this have been put 10 11 forth in 26 states and have passed in few states that needed the addition to code such as Georgia, Louisiana, and Florida to name a few. However, in states where they have very 12 13 open sunshine laws and open doors to public schools similarly to North Dakota the need to amend their state laws has been determined to adequately cover the request from the 14 15 bill. Those before me provided greater detail so I will not belabor additional points of detail 16

While it is not uncommon for us to see bills introduced based on concern from national
narrative, it is important to reflect on what is currently in action in our state before
