- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-12-33 and 54-12-33.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to duties of the human trafficking commission and immunity for reporting
- 3 human trafficking; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide a contingent effective
- 4 date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-12-33 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 7 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 **54-12-33.** Human trafficking commission.
- The attorney general mayshall establish a human trafficking commission, comprised of
 designees from state, local, and tribal agencies which have contact with victims or
 perpetrators, nongovernmental organizations that represent or work with victims, and
 other organizations and individuals, including victims, whose expertise would benefit
- 13 the commission. The attorney general may establish the commission by appointing an-
- 14 existing statewide coalitionIn addition to the attorney general designees, the
- 15 <u>commission must include:</u>
- 16a.A legislator from the majority party, appointed by the chairman of the legislative17management;
- 18 b. A legislator from the minority party, appointed by the chairman of the legislative
 19 management;
- 20 c. An individual from the department of health and human services child and family
 21 services division, appointed by the commissioner of the department of health and
 22 human services;

15		b.	Promote awareness and provide information to education personnel and the
16			general public about human trafficking, victim remedies and services, and
17			trafficking prevention;
18		C.	Promote training on human trafficking prevention and victim services for state
19			and local employees and members of regulated occupations and professions
20			who may have recurring contact with victims or perpetrators;
21		d.	Promote training on human trafficking investigation and prosecution and on
22			missing and murdered indigenous people with the North Dakota state's attorney's
23			association, the North Dakota peace officers standards and training board, and
24			state and local law enforcement agencies;
25		e.	Present annually regarding human trafficking awareness and prevention at
26			professional development conferences directed toward teachers, administrators,
27			and support staff which are hosted by educational organizations in this state or by
28			the department of public instruction; and
29		f.	Facilitate annual prevention and awareness education for students on human
30			trafficking and exploitation; and

25	a	"Human trafficking" means human trafficking as defined in chapter 12.1-41.	
26	b	"Human trafficking commission" means the commission established under	
27		section 54-12-33.	
28	С	"Lodging establishment" means any hotel, motel, resort, building, or structure that	
29		is used to provide sleeping accommodations to transient guests.	
30	d	"Proprietor" means the person in charge of a lodging establishment and includes	
31		an owner, lessee, and manager.	

1		<u>e.</u> '	"Regulated occupation or profession" includes a profession regulated by the
2		9	education standards and practices board, an occupation or profession regulated
3		<u> </u>	under title 43, and an attorney licensed to practice law in this state.
4	2.	Withi	n ninety days of the effective date of this section, the<u>The</u> human trafficking
5		comn	nission shall establish an educational training program with a focus on the
6		accur	rate and prompt identification and reporting of, or response to, suspected human
7		traffic	king. To the extent possible, the human trafficking commission shall allow the use
8		of exi	sting training modules and materials. The training must include:
9		a. I	Human trafficking awareness;
10		b. I	How to recognize potential victims of human trafficking;
11		c.	How to identify activities commonly associated with human trafficking; and
12		d. I	Effective responses to human trafficking situations, including how to report
13		\$	suspected human trafficking to law enforcement.
14	3.	A pro	prietor may:
15		a. I	Provide each onsite employee with the training described in subsection 2.
16		b. I	In an employee roster or in each employee's personnel file, annually certify each
17		(employee has received the training approved by the human trafficking

19		с.	Conduct an ongoing awareness campaign for employees which addresses the
20		i	information described in subsection 2.
21	4.	A pro	prietor may post and maintain a poster approved and provided by the human
22		traffic	king commission which contains the information described in subsection 2. The
23		poste	er must include the contact information for an organization that provides
24		assist	tance and support services to human trafficking victims. The poster may be
25		visibl	y displayed at the lodging establishment's check-in area, lobby, or transient guest
26		servio	ces.
27	5.	<u>An er</u>	ntity that regulates an occupation or profession may accept the training described
28		<u>in sut</u>	osection 2 for continuing education credit.
29	<u>6.</u>	A pro	prietor or employee of a lodging establishment or a member of a regulated
30		<u>occup</u>	pation or profession who acts in good faith is immune from liability in any civil
31		actior	n for reporting suspected human trafficking activities but a member of a regulated

1		occupation or profession may be subject to disciplinary action for the reporting if the
2		reporting violates an applicable ethics regulation imposed by the member's regulated
3		occupation or profession.
4	6.<u>7.</u>	The human trafficking commission may seek, apply for, accept, and receive any
5		donation, gift, grant, or bequest offered or tendered from public or private sources for
6		the purpose of furthering the objectives of the human trafficking prevention training
7		and incentivizing proprietors and members of a regulated occupation or profession to
8		participate in the human trafficking prevention training. All moneys received or
9		accepted under this subsection are appropriated on a continuing basis to the human
10		trafficking commission.
11	SEC	CTION 4. CONTINGENT EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 2 of this Act becomes effective if
12	the new	section to chapter 15.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, as created by Senate Bill
13	No. 233	0, is approved by the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.
