1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota 2 university system; to provide an appropriation to the Bank of North Dakota; to amend and 3 reenact subsection 2 of section 6-09-53, subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 15-10-48, 4 subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 15-10-48.2, subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 5 15-10-49, subsection 1 of section 15-10-75, paragraph 3 of subdivision h of subsection 1 of 6 section 15-18.2-02, subsection 2 of section 15-18.2-03, subsection 1 of section 15-18.2-05, 7 sections 15-54.1-02 and 15-54.1-04, subsection 1 of section 15-62.4-01, and section 54-44.1-11 8 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the economic diversification research fund, 9 matching grants for the advancement of academics, the workforce education innovation 10 program, state aid for institutions of higher education, university system capital building funds, 11 student financial assistance grants, and the cancellation of unexpended appropriations; to 12 amend and reenact sections 6 and 7 of chapter 126 of the 2021 Session Laws, relating to 13 transfers from the Bank of North Dakota to the skilled workforce loan repayment program fund 14 and the skilled workforce scholarship fund; to amend and reenact subsection 17 of section 1 of 15 chapter 550 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws, relating to funding for hyperbaric 16 oxygen therapy; to amend and reenact sections 7, 8, and 9 of chapter 3 of the 2023 Session 17 Laws, relating to transfers from the Bank of North Dakota to the skilled workforce loan 18 repayment program fund, the skilled workforce scholarship fund, and to the state board of 19 higher education for dual-credit tuition scholarships; to authorize the state board of higher 20 education to issue and sell bonds for capital projects; to provide for a transfer; to provide for the 21 conveyance of real property; to provide for a legislative management higher education funding 22 review committee; to provide for a report; to provide legislative intent; and to provide an 23 exemption.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

2 **SECTION 1. ADDITIONAL FEDERAL, PRIVATE, AND OTHER FUNDS -

18 **APPROPRIATION.** All funds, in addition to those appropriated in section 1 of this Act, from 19 federal, private, and other sources for competitive grants or other funds that the legislative 20 assembly has not indicated the intent to reject, including tuition revenue, received by the state 21 board of higher education and the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of 22 higher education, are appropriated to the board and those institutions and entities, for the 23 biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. All additional funds received under 24 the North Dakota-Minnesota reciprocity agreement during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, 25 and ending June 30, 2027, are appropriated to the state board of higher education for 26 reimbursement to institutions under the control of the board. 27 SECTION 4. USE OF EXTRAORDINARY REPAIRS FUNDING - MATCHING FUNDS. The

capital assets line items in subdivisions 2 through 12 of section 1 of this Act include funding
from the general fund for institution extraordinary repairs. An institution, excluding the university
of North Dakota and North Dakota state university, shall provide one dollar of matching funds
from operations or other sources for each one dollar of extraordinary repairs funding used for a

- 1 project. The university of North Dakota and North Dakota state university shall provide two
- 2 dollars of matching funds from operations or other sources for each one dollar of extraordinary
- 3 repairs funding used for a project.

18 SECTION 6. TRANSFER - NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OFFICE -

19 BISMARCK STATE COLLEGE. Of the funding appropriated in the system governance and

20 core technology services line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, the state board of

- 21 higher education shall transfer \$500,000 to the operations line item in subdivision 2 of section 1
- 22 of this Act by August 1, 2025. The North Dakota university system office may not assess
- institutions under the control of the state board of higher education to recover the cost of thistransfer.

25 SECTION 7. TRANSFER - BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA PROFITS - STATE BOARD OF

26 HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS. The industrial commission shall transfer to the North

- 27 Dakota university system office a total of \$1,500,000 from the current earnings and
- 28 accumulated undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota during the biennium beginning
- July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, as requested by the commissioner of higher education.
- 30 The other funds line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 includes \$1,500,000 for the North Dakota
- 31 university system office for dual-credit tuition scholarships.

1 SECTION 8. APPROPRIATION - BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA - TRANSFER -

2 STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - ECONOMIC DIVERSIFICATION

RESEARCH FUND. The office of management and budget shall transfer \$8,000,000 from the
strategic investment and improvements fund to the economic diversification research fund, the
sum of which is appropriated to the Bank of North Dakota for the purpose of providing grants to
institutions under the control of the state board of higher eduction, for the biennium beginning
July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, as requested by the commissioner of higher education.

8 SECTION 9. TRANSFER - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND -

9 UNIVERSITY SYSTEM CAPITAL BUILDING FUND. The office of management and budget

10 shall transfer \$31,500,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund to the

11 university system capital building fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending

12 June 30, 2027, as requested by the commissioner of higher education. Funding transferred

13 pursuant to this section is to be allocated to each institution as follows:

 SECTION 11. CAMPUS CAPITAL PROJECTS - PROJECT MANAGEMENT. During the

biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, each capital project authorized by
the state board of higher education must have adequate project management oversight by
either an institution official or a representative of an external entity. An institution may seek
assistance from the university system office for project management oversight of a capital
project.

10 SECTION 12. BOND ISSUANCE AUTHORIZATION - PURPOSES. The state board of 11 higher education, in accordance with chapter 15-55, may arrange for the funding of projects 12 authorized in this section, declared to be in the public interest, through the issuance of 13 self-liquidating, tax-exempt evidences of indebtedness under chapter 15-55, during the 14 biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. Evidences of indebtedness issued 15 pursuant to this section are not a general obligation of the state of North Dakota. Any 16 unexpended balance resulting from the proceeds of the evidences of indebtedness must be 17 placed in a sinking fund to be used for the retirement of indebtedness. The evidences of 18 indebtedness may be issued and the proceeds are appropriated in section 1 of this Act for the 19 following capital projects: 20 North Dakota state university - university village \$54,000,000 21 North Dakota state university - memorial union 50,000,000 22 Dickinson state university - Woods hall, agriculture and technical education 12,500,000 23 building, and rodeo arena projects 24 Minot state university - student center 3,100,000 25 Total special funds \$119,600,000 26 SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 6-09-53 of the North Dakota Century 27 Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 28 2. In consultation with representatives of North Dakota state university and the university 29 of North Dakota, the Bank, in consultation with the state board of higher education, 30 shall award grants to institutions under the control of the state board of higher

31 education. The sum of five millionseven million two hundred thousand dollars must be
