PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO FIRST ENGROSSMENT

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2003

Introduced by

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota 2 university system; to provide an appropriation to the Bank of North Dakota; to create and enact 3 four new sections to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to dual-credit 4 courses, the professional student exchange program, presidential searches, and the state 5 commissioner of higher education; to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 6-09-53, 6 subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 15-10-17, subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 7 15-10-48, subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 15-10-48.2, subdivision c of subsection 1 of 8 section 15-10-49, subsection 1 of section 15-10-75, subsection 1 of the new section to chapter 9 15-10, as created by section 1 of House Bill No. 1437, as approved by the sixty-ninth legislative 10 assembly, paragraph 3 of subdivision h of subsection 1 of section 15-18.2-02, subsection 2 of 11 section 15-18.2-03, subsection 1 of section 15-18.2-05, sections 15-54.1-02 and section 12 15-54.1-04, subsection 1 of section 15-62.4-01, subsection 2 of section 15-62.5-03, and section 13 54-44.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers and duties of the state 14 board of higher education, the economic diversification research fund, matching grants for the 15 advancement of academics, the workforce education innovation program, academic tenure 16 policy at institutions of higher education, state aid for institutions of higher education, university 17 system capital building funds, student financial assistance grants, the scholars program, and 18 the cancellation of unexpended appropriations; to amend and reenact sections 6 and 7 of 19 chapter 126 of the 2021 Session Laws, relating to transfers from the Bank of North Dakota to 20 the skilled workforce loan repayment program fund and the skilled workforce scholarship fund; 21 to amend and reenact subsection 17 of section 1 of chapter 550 of the 2021 Special Session 22 Session Laws, relating to funding for hyperbaric oxygen therapy; to amend and reenact

- 1 sections 7, 8, and 9 of chapter 3 of the 2023 Session Laws, relating to transfers from the Bank
- 2 of North Dakota to the skilled workforce loan repayment program fund, the skilled workforce
- 3 scholarship fund, and to the state board of higher education for dual-credit tuition scholarships;
- 4 to amend and reenact subsection 17 of section 1 of chapter 550 of the 2021 Special Session
- 5 Session Laws, relating to funding for hyperbaric oxygen therapy; to repeal section 15-10-74 of
- 6 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the naming of the Bismarck state college
- 7 polytechnic center; to authorize the state board of higher education to issue and sell bonds for
- 8 capital projects; to provide for a transfer; to provide for the conveyance of real property; to
- 9 provide for a legislative management higher education funding review committee; to provide for
- 10 a report; to provide legislative intent; and to provide an exemption; and to provide for application.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

12 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 13 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 14 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from other funds derived from special funds and 15 federal funds, to the state board of higher education and to the entities and institutions under 16 the supervision of the board for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state board of 17 higher education and the entities and institutions under the supervision of the board, for the 18 biennium beginning July 1, 2025 period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending 19 June 30, 2027, as follows:

SECTION 3. ADDITIONAL FEDERAL, PRIVATE, AND OTHER FUNDS -

17 **APPROPRIATION.** All funds, in addition to those appropriated in section 1 of this Act, from 18 federal, private, and other sources for competitive grants or other funds that the legislative 19 assembly has not indicated the intent to reject, including tuition revenue, received by the state 20 board of higher education and the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of 21 higher education, are appropriated to the board and those institutions and entities, for the 22 biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. All additional funds received under 23 the North Dakota-Minnesota reciprocity agreement during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, 24 and ending June 30, 2027, are appropriated to the state board of higher education for 25 reimbursement to institutions under the control of the board. 26 SECTION 4. USE OF EXTRAORDINARY REPAIRS FUNDING - MATCHING FUNDS. The 27 capital assets line items in subdivisions 2 through 12 of section 1 of this Act include funding

28 from the general fund for institution extraordinary repairs. An institution, excluding the university

- 29 of North Dakota and North Dakota state university, shall provide one dollar of matching funds
- 30 from operations or other sources for each one dollar of extraordinary repairs funding used for a
- 31 project. The university of North Dakota and North Dakota state university shall provide two

- 1 dollars of matching funds from operations or other sources for each one dollar of extraordinary
- 2 repairs funding used for a project.

3 SECTION 5. OTHER FUNDS - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND.


- 21 SECTION 6. TRANSFER NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OFFICE -
- 22 **BISMARCK STATE COLLEGE.** Of the funding appropriated in the system governance and
- core technology services line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, the state board of
- higher education shall transfer \$500,000 to the operations line item in subdivision 2 of section 1
- 25 of this Act by August 1, 2025. The North Dakota university system office may not assess
- institutions under the control of the state board of higher education to recover the cost of this
 transfer.

SECTION 7. TRANSFER - NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OFFICE - LAKE

29 **REGION STATE COLLEGE.** Of the funding appropriated in the system governance and core

30 technology services line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, the state board of higher

31 education shall transfer \$342,000 to the operations line item in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this


