1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota 2 university system; to provide an appropriation to the Bank of North Dakota; to amend and 3 reenact subsection 2 of section 6-09-53, subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 15-10-48, 4 subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 15-10-48.2, subdivisions a and c of subsection 1 of 5 section 15-10-49, subsection 1 of section 15-10-75, paragraph 3 of subdivision h of 6 subsection 1 of section 15-18.2-02, subsection 2 of section 15-18.2-03, subsection 1 of section 7 15-18.2-05, sections 15-54.1-02 and 15-54.1-04, subsection 1 of section 15-62.4-01, and 8 section 54-44.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the economic diversification 9 research fund, matching grants for the advancement of academics, the workforce education 10 innovation program, state aid for institutions of higher education, university system capital 11 building funds, student financial assistance grants, and the cancellation of unexpended 12 appropriations; to amend and reenact sections 6 and 7 of chapter 126 of the 2021 Session 13 Laws, relating to transfers from the Bank of North Dakota to the skilled workforce loan 14 repayment program fund and the skilled workforce scholarship fund; to amend and reenact 15 subsection 17 of section 1 of chapter 550 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws, relating to 16 funding for hyperbaric oxygen therapy; to amend and reenact sections 7, 8, and 9 of chapter 3 17 of the 2023 Session Laws, relating to transfers from the Bank of North Dakota to the skilled 18 workforce loan repayment program fund, the skilled workforce scholarship fund, and to the state 19 board of higher education for dual-credit tuition scholarships; to authorize the state board of 20 higher education to issue and sell bonds for capital projects; to provide for a transfer; to provide 21 for the conveyance of real property; to provide for a legislative management higher education 22 funding review committee; to provide for a report; to provide legislative intent; and to provide an 23 exemption.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

18 **APPROPRIATION.** All funds, in addition to those appropriated in section 1 of this Act, from 19 federal, private, and other sources for competitive grants or other funds that the legislative 20 assembly has not indicated the intent to reject, including tuition revenue, received by the state 21 board of higher education and the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of 22 higher education, are appropriated to the board and those institutions and entities, for the 23 biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. All additional funds received under 24 the North Dakota-Minnesota reciprocity agreement during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, 25 and ending June 30, 2027, are appropriated to the state board of higher education for 26 reimbursement to institutions under the control of the board. 27 SECTION 4.
