1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota 2 university system; to provide an appropriation to the Bank of North Dakota; to create and enact 3 four new sections to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to dual-credit 4 courses, the professional student exchange program, presidential searches, and the state 5 commissioner of higher education; to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 6-09-53, 6 subdivision 1 of section 15-10-17, subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 15-10-48, 7 subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 15-10-48.2, subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 8 15-10-49, subsection 1 of section 15-10-75, subsection 1 of the new section to chapter 15-10, 9 as created by section 1 of House Bill No. 1437, as approved by the sixty-ninth legislative 10 assembly, paragraph 3 of subdivision h of subsection 1 of section 15-18.2-02, subsection 2 of 11 section 15-18.2-03, subsection 1 of section 15-18.2-05, section 15-54.1-04, subsection 1 of 12 section 15-62.4-01, subsection 2 of section 15-62.5-03, and section 54-44.1-11 of the North 13 Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers and duties of the state board of higher education, 14 the economic diversification research fund, matching grants for the advancement of academics, 15 the workforce education innovation program, academic tenure policy at institutions of higher 16 education, state aid for institutions of higher education, university system capital building funds, 17 student financial assistance grants, the scholars program, and the cancellation of unexpended 18 appropriations; to amend and reenact sections 6 and 7 of chapter 126 of the 2021 Session 19 Laws, relating to transfers from the Bank of North Dakota to the skilled workforce loan 20 repayment program fund and the skilled workforce scholarship fund; to amend and reenact 21 sections 7, 8, and 9 of chapter 3 of the 2023 Session Laws, relating to transfers from the Bank 22 of North Dakota to the skilled workforce loan repayment program fund, the skilled workforce 23 scholarship fund, and to the state board of higher education for dual-credit tuition scholarships;

to amend and reenact subsection 17 of section 1 of chapter 550 of the 2021 Special Session
Session Laws, relating to funding for hyperbaric oxygen therapy; to repeal section 15-10-74 of
the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the naming of the Bismarck state college
polytechnic center; to authorize the state board of higher education to issue and sell bonds for
capital projects; to provide for a transfer; to provide for the conveyance of real property; to
provide for a legislative management higher education funding review committee; to provide for
a report; to provide legislative intent; to provide an exemption; and to provide for application.

#### 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 10 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 11 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from other funds derived from special funds and 12 federal funds, to the state board of higher education and to the entities and institutions under 13 the supervision of the board for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state board of 14 higher education and the entities and institutions under the supervision of the board, for the 15 period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2027, as follows:

The North Dakota university system office may not assess 4 institutions under the control of the state board of higher education to recover the cost of this 5 transfer. 6 SECTION 7. TRANSFER - NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OFFICE - LAKE 7 **REGION STATE COLLEGE.** Of the funding appropriated in the system governance and core 8 technology services line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, the state board of higher 9 education shall transfer \$342,000 to the operations line item in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this 10 Act by August 1, 2025. The industrial commission shall transfer to the North 14 Dakota university system office a total of \$1,500,000 from the current earnings and 15 accumulated undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota during the biennium beginning 16 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, as requested by the commissioner of higher education. 17 The other funds line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 includes \$1,500,000 for the North Dakota 18 university system office for dual-credit tuition scholarships. 19 SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION - BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA - TRANSFER -20 STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - ECONOMIC DIVERSIFICATION 21 **RESEARCH FUND.** The office of management and budget shall transfer \$8,000,000 from the 22 strategic investment and improvements fund to the economic diversification research fund, the 23 sum of which is appropriated to the Bank of North Dakota for the purpose of providing grants to 24 institutions under the control of the state board of higher eduction, for the biennium beginning 25 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, as requested by the commissioner of higher education. 26 SECTION 10.
