- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact four new sections to chapter 4.1-03 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the creation of districts, district commission member nomination and
- 3 election procedures, the costs of elections of district representative commission members, and
- 4 the referral of cattle assessments; to amend and reenact sections 4.1-03-01, 4.1-03-02,

5 4.1-03-03, 4.1-03-04, 4.1-03-12, and 4.1-03-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to

- 6 the definition of a cattle industry representative, the election and terms of members to the North
- 7 Dakota beef commission, commission vacancies, and requiring livestock auction markets and
- 8 livestock dealers to forward names of cattle sellers, and the elimination of the refund procedure
- 9 for assessments; to provide a penalty; and to provide an effective date.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 11 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-03-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 12 amended and reenacted as follows:

13 **4.1-03-01. Definitions.**

- 14 As used in this chapter:
- 15 1. "Beef producer" means any person that has an ownership interest in cattle.
- 16 2. "Cattle" means live domesticated bovine animals.
- 17 3. "Cattle feeder" means a person in the business of feeding cattle for the purpose of18 adding weight to the cattle prior to slaughter.
- 19 4. <u>"Cattle industry representative" means an individual who is or has been a beef</u>
- 20 producer, cattle feeder, dairy producer, or representative of a public livestock market in
- 21 <u>the state.</u>
- 22 <u>5.</u> "Commission" means the North Dakota beef commission.

- 1 5.6. "Dairy producer" means any person in the business of producing and selling milk from
 2 cows.
- 3 6.7. "Director" means the director of the North Dakota state university extension service.
- 4 <u>8.</u> <u>"Eligible voter" means a beef producer who is at least eighteen years of age.</u>
- <u>9.</u> "Livestock auction market" means a public market or private buying station in which
 livestock is offered for sale or sold.
- 7 7.10. "Livestock dealer" means a person that purchases cattle and is required to be licensed
 8 under chapter <u>36-044.1-83</u>.
- 9 8.11. "Participating producer" means a <u>beef</u> producer that has not obtained a refund of any
 10 assessment paid on the sale of cattle under this chapter for the preceding three-
- 11 yearsyear.
- 12<u>12.</u> "Public livestock market" means a livestock auction market, public market, or private13buying station in which livestock is offered for sale, auctioned, or sold and is required
- 14 to be licensed under chapter 4.1-27 or 4.1-28.
- 15 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-03-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 16 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 17 **4.1-03-02.** North Dakota beef commission Membership Qualifications.
- 18 1. The North Dakota beef commission consists of:
- 19 a. Three beef producers;
- 20 b. One cattle feeder;
- 21 c. One dairy producer;
- 22 d. One representative of a public livestock market; and
- 23 e. Three at-large representatives.
- 24 2. The governor shall appoint:
- 25 a. Each beef producer from a list of at least two names submitted by the North-
- 26 Dakota stockmen's association;
- 27 b. The cattle feeder from a list of at least two names submitted by the North Dakota
 28 stockmen's association feeder council;
- 29 c. The dairy producer from a list of at least two names submitted by the milk-
- 30 producers association of North Dakota;

1		d.	The representative of a public livestock market from a list of at least two names-
2			submitted by the North Dakota livestock marketing association; and
3		e.	The three at-large representatives.
4	3.	a. Th	e commission consists of one cattle industry representative elected from each of
5		the o	districts under section 6 of this Act. The chairman, vice chairman, and secretary-
6		trea	surer of the commission, serving on December 31, 2025, may continue to serve in
7		<u>their</u>	respective positions as provided under section 4.1-03-03.
8	<u>2.</u>	Eac	n member of the commission must:
9			(1)a. Be a United States citizen and a resident of this state;
10			(2)b. Physically reside in the district the member represents; and
11			c. Be an actively engaged in that phase of the cattle industry the member-
12			represents; and
13			(3) Have been actively engaged in that phase of the cattle industry for a period
14			of five years<u>representative</u>.
15	b.<u>3.</u>	Eac	n member of the commission, except<u>unless</u> the <u>member is a</u> representative of a
16		publ	ic livestock market, must be a participating producer.
17	c.<u>4.</u>	For	purposes of this subsection, "actively engaged" means that the individual:
18	(1	<u>)a.</u>	Has an ownership interest in ana cattle operation that is qualifies the individual as
19			a cattle industry representative;
20		<u>b.</u>	Is engaged in an activity of sufficient scope and significance as to constitute a
21			distinct activity; and
22	(2	<u>e)</u> .	Has and regularly exercises exercised direct control of the cattle operation for the
23			preceding year.
24	SEC		3. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-03-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	amende	d and	reenacted as follows:
26	4.1-0	03-03	. Term of office.
27	1.	The	Except as otherwise provided in this section, the term of office for each member is
28		thre	e years and begins on July<u>January</u> first. The terms must be staggered so that no
29		mor	e than three terms expire each year.

1	2.	The terms of all commission members, except the members serving as chairman, vice		
2		chairman, and secretary-treasurer of the commission on December 31, 2025, expire		
3		on December 31, 2025.		
4		<u>a.</u>	The chairman of the commission, serving on December 31, 2025, shall represent	
5			district six, as described under section 6 of this Act, until December 31, 2027.	
6		<u>b.</u>	The vice chairman of the commission, serving on December 31, 2025, shall	
7			represent district one, as described under section 6 of this Act, until	
8			<u>December 31, 2028.</u>	
9		<u>C.</u>	The secretary-treasurer of the commission, serving on December 31, 2025, shall	
10			represent district nine, as described under section 6 of this Act, until	
11			<u>December 31, 2026.</u>	
12		<u>d.</u>	The chairman, vice chairman, and secretary-treasurer of the commission, serving	
13			on December 31, 2025, each serving their respective term under this subsection,	
14			have the same rights, duties, and privileges as elected commission members.	
15	<u>3.</u>	<u>Bet</u>	ween October 1, 2025, and December 31, 2025, districts two, three, four, five,	
16		<u>sev</u>	en, and eight, as described under section 6 of this Act, each shall elect a	
17		<u>con</u>	nmission member with a term, beginning January 1, 2026. The initial terms of	
18		indi	viduals elected to begin serving as commission members on January 1, 2026, are:	
19		<u>a.</u>	One year for commission members representing districts two and five:	
20		<u>b.</u>	Two years for commission members representing districts three and seven; and	
21		<u>C.</u>	Three years for commission members representing districts four and eight.	
22	<u>4.</u>	<u>Bet</u>	ween October first and December thirty-first of the calendar year in which a	
23		<u>con</u>	mission member's term is to expire, the respective district shall elect an individual	
24		<u>to s</u>	erve as a commission member to represent that district for the succeeding term.	
25	<u>5.</u>	Am	nember of the commission may not serve more than two consecutive terms. If an-	
26		indi	vidual is appointed after August 1, 2009, to complete a vacancy, that <u>The</u> service is-	
27		not	counted as aof the initial term, for purposes of this section, unless the duration of	
28		that	service exceeds one year under subdivision a of subsection 3 for commission	
29		mer	mbers of districts two and five is not counted for purposes of this subsection.	
30	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-03-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
31	31 amended and reenacted as follows:			

1 4.1-03-04. Vacancy. 2 If a member's office is vacant, the position must be filled, for the remainder of the term, in-3 the same manner as the original appointment. A member's office is vacant if: 4 1. At any time during a member's term the member ceases to possess any of the 5 qualifications provided for in this chapter; 6 2. Any event enumerated in section 44-02-01 occurs; or 7 3. The commission determines that a member has failed to attend three consecutive 8 meetings of the commission without justificationa commission member fails to meet the 9 gualifications required to serve as a commission member under this chapter or a vacancy under 10 section 44-02-01 occurs, the commission, by majority vote, shall appoint a qualified cattle 11 industry representative for the remainder of the term. If an individual is appointed by the 12 commission to complete a vacancy, that service is not counted as years of service under 13 section 3 of this Act, unless the duration of that service exceeds one year. An individual 14 appointed under this section has the same rights, duties, and privileges as an elected 15 commission member. 16 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-03-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is 17 amended and reenacted as follows: 18 4.1-03-12. Collection of assessment. 19 1. Each livestock auction market and livestock dealer shall: 20 Collect the assessments due under this chapter by deducting the assessments a. 21 from any credit given or payment made to the seller of the cattle, at the time of 22 the transaction; and 23 b. Forward the assessments to the commission in accordance with section 24 4.1-03-13. 25 2. a. If a person sells North Dakota cattle outside this state or if a person sells North 26 Dakota cattle to an out-of-state buyer, the person shall forward any assessments 27 due under this chapter to the commission in accordance with section 4.1-03-13. 28 This subsection does not apply if the assessment has been paid to a brand b. 29 inspector in another state or to another gualified state beef council. 30 3. Any other person selling cattle in this state shall forward any assessments due under 31 this chapter to the commission in accordance with section 4.1-03-13.

1	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-03-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:

4.1-03-17. Permitted refunds of assessment - Refunds requiring certification by attorney general.

- a. When the attorney general certifies to the commission that refunds of
 assessments paid under subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 4.1-03-11 are no
 longer precluded by federal law, the commission may provide to producers refunds of
 assessments paid under subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 4.1-03-11.
- 9 b. Refunds of assessments paid under subdivision b of subsection 1 of section
 10 4.1-03-11 are available, subject to the requirements of this section.
- 2. a. To receive a permitted refund of any assessment paid in accordance with this
 chapter, a producer shall request a refund application from the commission within
 sixty days after the date of the sale. The request may be made orally, in writing,
 or in electronic form.
- 15b.The producer must complete the refund application and return the application to16the commission, together with a record of the assessment paid, within ninety17days after the date of the sale. The application may be returned to the18commission in person, by mail, or in electronic form. The commission shall then
- 19 refund the net amount of the assessment that had been collected.
- 20 c. If a request for a refund is not submitted to the commission within the prescribed
 21 time period, the producer is presumed to have agreed to the assessment.
- 22 SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 4.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
- enacted as follows:
- 24 <u>Geographical districts.</u>
- 25 <u>1.</u> <u>The state consists of the following districts:</u>
- 26a.District one: Barnes, Cass, Cavalier, Eddy, Foster, Grand Forks, Griggs, Nelson,27Pembina, Ramsey, Steele, Towner, Traill, and Walsh Counties;

 District two: Dickey, LaMoure, McIntosh, Ransom, Richland, and Sargent

 Counties;
- 30 <u>c.</u> <u>District three: Kidder, Logan, and Stutsman Counties;</u>
- 31 d. District four: Burleigh, Emmons, Sheridan, and Wells Counties;

1		<u>e.</u>	District five: Benson, Bottineau, McHenry, Pierce, Renville, and Rolette Counties;
2		<u>f.</u>	District six: Burke, Divide, McKenzie, McLean, Mountrail, Ward, and Williams
3			<u>Counties;</u>
4		<u>g.</u>	District seven: Billings, Dunn, Golden Valley, Oliver, and Mercer Counties;
5		<u>h.</u>	District eight: Adams, Bowman, Hettinger, Slope, and Stark Counties; and
6		<u>i.</u>	District nine: Grant, Morton, and Sioux Counties.
7	<u>2.</u>	<u>The</u>	e commission shall review the nine district boundaries and tally the number of cattle
8		<u>in e</u>	ach district at least once every seven years to ensure accurate producer
9		rep	resentation. If the commission determines the nine districts do not accurately
10		<u>rep</u>	resent cattle industry representatives in the state, the commission may enact a
11	redistricting plan to amend district boundaries, provided each district contains at least		
12		thre	e undivided counties. If two-thirds of the elected commission members vote in
13	favor of the proposed redistricting plan, the commission shall adopt the plan. If the		
14	commission adopts a redistricting plan, the commission shall submit a bill to the next		
15		legi	slative assembly to amend subsection 1 in a manner consistent with the results of
16		<u>the</u>	redistricting plan. The redistricting plan becomes effective on the date the
17		am	ended district boundaries under subsection 1 become effective.
18	SEC	стю	N 8. A new section to chapter 4.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
19	and ena	cted	as follows:
20	Dire	ector	of the North Dakota state university extension service - Nomination and
21	election	n of c	listrict commission candidates.
22	<u>1.</u>	<u>a.</u>	The director of the North Dakota state university extension service shall oversee
23			district representative commission member nominations and elections.
24		<u>b.</u>	Between October first and December thirty-first of each year, the director shall
25			conduct the nominating and election process to elect successors for districts with
26			terms expiring that fiscal year.
27		<u>C.</u>	The director shall notify all known cattle industry representatives in the respective
28			district and request nominations for district representative commission candidates
29			no fewer than forty-five nor more than sixty days before the district representative
30			commission election. The notice must be published in all official county
31			newspapers within the district or by reliable electronic means.

1		<u>d.</u>	To be eligible as a candidate in a district commission election, at least five cattle
2			industry representatives who reside in the district shall nominate the candidate in
3			writing. A cattle industry representative may not self-nominate.
4		<u>e.</u>	Upon receiving the district commission nominations, the director shall certify that
5			nominated candidates meet the requirements of section 4.1-03-02. The director
6			shall prepare the election ballots with the names of the certified nominated district
7			commission candidates. Each ballot also must include a statement indicating:
8			(1) The date, time, and location the director will open the ballots and tabulate
9			the results;
10			(2) The last date by which the ballots must be postmarked or filed with the
11			director; and
12			(3) Any cattle industry representative in the district may be present at the time
13			the ballots are opened and tabulated.
14		<u>f.</u>	The director shall hold the district commission election by mail paper ballot. The
15			director shall mail the ballots to each known cattle industry representative in the
16			district at least thirty days before the election.
17		<u>g.</u>	The director shall canvass the votes. The director shall notify the commission and
18			the governor that the election has taken place, and provide to the commission
19			and the governor the name and address and term of the newly elected district
20			representative commission member.
21	<u>2.</u>	<u>lf th</u>	e cattle industry representatives in a district fail to elect an individual, as required
22		<u>by t</u>	his section, the director shall notify the commission and the governor. The
23		gov	ernor shall appoint a cattle industry representative who meets the requirements of
24		<u>sec</u>	tion 4.1-03-02 to serve as the district commission member for the district. An
25		indi	vidual appointed under this subsection has the same rights, duties, and privileges
26		<u>as a</u>	an elected commission member.
27	<u>3.</u>	Eac	h eligible voter is entitled to one vote and must vote in the district in which the
28		vote	er's livestock operation headquarters is located. If an eligible voter has multiple
29		live	stock operation headquarters in more than one district, the eligible voter shall cast
30		<u>thei</u>	r vote in the district in which the voter physically resides.

Any cattle industry representative may be present at the time the ballots are 4 opened and tabulated. 5 The date selected by the commission for the opening and tabulation of the ballots <u>5.</u> 6 must be at least five days after the date by which the ballots must be postmarked or 7 filed with the commission. 8 The commission shall canvass the votes. If the majority of voting cattle industry <u>6.</u> 9 representatives vote in favor of the proposed change, the commission shall submit a 10 bill to the next legislative assembly to amend the statutory assessment in a manner 11 consistent with the results of the vote. 12 Assessment funds collected under this chapter may not be used to fund an election. 7. 13 All costs of holding an assessment referendum under this section are the responsibility 14 of the commission. 15 SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 2 of this Act becomes effective on January 1, 16 2026.
