## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>Child safety liaison work group.</u>
- 8 <u>1. As used in this section, "child protective services" means an "authorized agent" or the</u>
  9 <u>"department" as the terms are defined under section 50-25.1-02.</u>
- 10 2. A school district and the corresponding human service zone may designate
   11 representatives to form a child safety liaison work group.
- 12 <u>3. The child safety liaison work group:</u>
- a. Shall focus on child safety issues, including:
- 14 (1) The roles and responsibilities of child protective services and mandatory

  15 reporters:
  - (2) Opportunities for improved relations between the human service zone and school district; and
    - (3) The coordination of services for children and families.
- b. Must be proportional in member size to the need and population served, and
   have an equal number of representatives from the school district and human
- 21 service zone.
- 22 <u>c. Shall meet at least twice annually.</u>

1	<u>d.</u>	Shall report to the human service zone board, the school board, and the
2		children's cabinet by July thirty-first of each year. The report must include
3		recommendations, proposed solutions, progress, training needs, and identified
4		gaps in service coordination.

4. The human service zone is responsible for coordinating the child safety liaison work group meetings.
