- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 4.1-31-05.1 and 19-02.1-12.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the labeling and misbranding of cell-cultured protein.for an Act

3 to provide for a legislative management study regarding the regulation of cell-cultured protein.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-31-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is-
6	amended and reenacted as follows:

20	[21 U.S.C. 451 et seq.].

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1	<u>b.</u> <u>"Deceptively</u> similar" means packaging that could mislead a reasonable person to-
2	believe the product is a meat food product.
3	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 19-02.1-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is-
4	amended and reenacted as follows:

8	protein as a meat food product. A cell-cultured foodprotein product:
9	a. May not be packaged in the same, or deceptively similar, packaging as a meat-

11	b. Must be labeled as a cell-cultured food productin compliance with the Fair
12	Packaging and Labeling Act [Pub. L. 89-755; 15 U.S.C. 1451 et seq.] and the
13	labeling requirements of the food and drug administration.

15	a reasonable person to believe the product is a meat food product:
16	a. "Cell-cultured protein" means a food product developed in a labratory and grown
17	from a sample of animal cells from a species other than those species regulated
18	under the Federal Meat Inspection Act [21 U.S.C. 601 et. Seq.] or the Poultry
19	Products Inspection Act [21 U.S.C. 451 et seq.], including all seafood other than
20	siluriformes, fish, and game meat .
21	<u>b.</u> <u>"Deceptively similar" means packaging that could mislead a reasonable person to</u>
22	believe the product is a meat food product.

24	food animal, agricultural animal food product, or a harvested animal, which does
25	not include cell-cultured protein.
26	SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - REGULATION OF
27	CELL-CULTURED PROTEIN. During the 2025-26 interim, the legislative management shall
28	consider studying cell-cultured protein and the status of litigation in federal and state courts to
29	prohibit cell-cultured protein. The study must include the outcome of litigation in other states and
30	an analysis of the regulatory landscape, stakeholder impact, and feasibility of adopting a
31	prohibition on cell-cultured protein in the state. The legislative management shall report its

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- 1 findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the
- 2 recommendations, to the seventieth legislative assembly.
