- 7 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 7 of section 11-09.1-05 of the North Dakota
- 8 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 7. Provide for all matters pertaining to county elections, except as to qualifications of electors and the limitations provided under section 2 of this Act.
- SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 16.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 13 Approval voting Ranked-choice voting Prohibition.
- 14 <u>1. For purposes of this section:</u>
- 15 <u>a. "Approval voting" means a method in which a qualified elector may vote for all</u>
- 16 <u>candidates the voter approves of in each race for public office, and the</u>
- 17 <u>candidates receiving the most votes are elected until all necessary seats are</u>
- 18 <u>filled in each race.</u>
- 19 <u>b.</u> "Ranked-choice voting" means a method in which a qualified elector may rank
- 20 <u>candidates in a race for public office in order of preference, and all submitted</u>
