- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-36-08 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the school construction assistance revolving loan fund; and to declare an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-36-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 15.1-36-08. School construction assistance revolving loan fund - Bank of North 7 Dakota - School construction projects - Continuing appropriation.

- The school construction assistance revolving loan fund is a special revolving loan fund
 administered by the Bank of North Dakota. The fund consists of all moneys
 appropriated or transferred to the fund by the legislative assembly, all interest or other
- earnings of the fund, and all repayments of loans made from the fund.
- Moneys in the fund, interest upon the moneys in the fund, and payments to the fund of
 principal and interest are appropriated to the Bank of North Dakota on a continuing
- basis for the purpose of providing low-interest school construction loans and for paying
 administrative costs, in accordance with this section.
- 16 3. ToFor a school construction project not located on an air force base, to be eligible for a
 17 loan under this section, the board of a school district shall:
- a. Propose a new construction or remodeling project with a cost of at least
 one million dollars and an expected utilization of at least thirty years;
- b. Obtain the approval of the superintendent of public instruction for the project
 under section 15.1-36-01;

3		f.	Any other criteria established by the superintendent of public instruction, after
4			consultation with an interim committee appointed by the legislative management.
5	5. 7.	If the	e superintendent of public instruction approves the loan, the Bank of North Dakota
6		shal	l issue a loan from the school construction assistance revolving loan fund. For a
7		loan	made under this section:
8		a.	If the school construction project totals less than seventy-five million dollars, the
9			maximum loan amount for which a school district may qualify is fifteen million
10			dollars. However, if a school district's unobligated general fund balance on the
11			preceding June thirtieth exceeds the limitation under section 15.1-27-35.3, the
12			loan amount under this section may not exceed eighty percent of the project's
13			cost up to a maximum loan amount of twelve million dollars;
14		b.	If the school construction project totals seventy-five million dollars or more, the
15			maximum loan amount for which a school district may qualify is thirty million
16			dollars. However, if a school district's unobligated general fund balance on the
17			preceding June thirtieth exceeds the limitation under section 15.1-27-35.3, the
18			loan amount under this section may not exceed eighty percent of the project's
19			cost up to a maximum loan amount of twenty-four million dollars;
20		C.	If the school construction project is on an air force base, the maximum loan
21			amount for which the school district may qualify is the lesser of twenty percent of
22			the project cost or twenty million dollars;
23		<u>d.</u>	The term of the loan is twenty years, unless the board of the school district
24			requests a shorter term in the written loan application; and
25	e	<u>l.e.</u>	The interest rate of the loan may not exceed two percent per year.
26	•	<u>e.f.</u>	A district with a school construction loan secured on the open bond market may
27			apply to refinance the loan when callable with the school construction assistance
28			revolving loan fund under this subsection.
29		f.	A district that qualifies for a loan under subdivision a, which was approved for a
30			loan of up to ten million dollars for a construction project bid after January 1,
31			2021, and before June 30, 2024, may apply for a loan in an amount equal to the

1			difference between fifteen million dollars and the amount of the approved loan.		
2			Districts qualifying under this subdivision may submit an application for additional		
3			funding to the superintendent of public instruction before August 1, 2023.		
4		g.	A district that qualifies for a loan under subdivision b, which was approved for a		
5			loan of up to ten million dollars for a construction project bid after January 1,		
6			2021, and before June 30, 2024, may apply for a loan in an amount equal to the		
7			difference between thirty million dollars and the amount of the approved loan.		
8			Districts qualifying under this subdivision may submit an application for additional		
9			funding to the superintendent of public instruction before August 1, 2023.		
10	6.<u>8.</u>	The	Bank may adopt policies and establish guidelines to administer this loan program		
11		in a	ccordance with this section. The Bank of North Dakota may use a portion of the		
12		inte	rest paid on the outstanding loans as a servicing fee to pay for administration costs		
13		whic	ch may not exceed one-half of one percent of the amount of the interest payment.		
14		The	Bank of North Dakota shall deposit principal and interest payments made by		
15		sch	ool districts for loans under this section in the school construction assistance		
16		revo	olving loan fund. The fund must be audited annually pursuant to section 6-09-29,		
17		and	the cost of the audit must be paid from the fund.		
18	18 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
