## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1329**

- A BILL for an Act to provide for a legislative management study regarding the establishment of a government spending database; and to provide an appropriation. for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-44.4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the duties of the superintendent of public instruction and the establishment of a government spending database; to provide an appropriation; and to provide an effective date.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:
- 7 SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - GOVERNMENT SPENDING 8 **DATABASE.** During the 2025-26 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying-9 the feasibility of the establishment of a government spending database. The study must include: 10 A review of the training services necessary for school board members. 11 superintendents, principals, and business managers regarding the government-12 spending database, including best practices, personnel management, financial-13 operations, facility planning, and regulatory compliance. 14 The feasibility of establishing a database that compiles the following information for 15 each expenditure: 16 a. The amount paid. 17 b. The payment date. 18 c. The recipient name. 19 d. The paying entity. 20 e. The employee position, if for a personnel payment.

15	legislation necessary to implement the recommendations, to the seventieth legislative assembly.		
16	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL - CONSULTANTS FOR		
17	INTERIM STUDY - GOVERNMENT SPENDING DATABASE STUDY - ONE-TIME FUNDING.		
18	There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise		
19	appropriated, the sum of \$97,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the		
20	legislative council for the purpose of contracting with a consultant to assist in conducting a study		
21	regarding the feasibility of a government spending database, for the biennium beginning July 1,		
22	2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The funding provided in this section is considered a one-time		
23	funding item.		
24	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-44.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
25	and enacted as follows:		
26	Government spending database - Requirements - Superintendent of public		
27	instruction.		
28	1. As used in this section, "submitting party" means:		
29	a. A budget unit under section 54-44.1-04;		
30	b. A political subdivision;		
31	c. A school district; and		

1		d. An institution under the control of the state board of higher education.
2	2.	The superintendent of public instruction shall collect data from submitting parties and
3		establish and maintain a government spending database that is accessible without
4		cost through the internet and contains detailed expenditure data collected from
5		submitting parties. The data must be updated at least monthly.
6	3.	The database must include for each expenditure:
7		a. The amount paid.
8		b. The payment date.
9		c. The recipient name.
10		d. The paying entity.
11		e. The employee position, if for a personnel payment.
12		f. For a school district, with respect to educational materials:

- 3 section is considered a one time funding item.
- 4 **SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.** Section 1 of this Act becomes effective July 1, 2026.
