- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 49 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to strict liability and a wildfire mitigation plan of a qualified utility; and to provide

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 49 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 6 enacted as follows:
 - Definitions.

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- 8 <u>As used in this chapter:</u>
 - 1. "Hazardous vegetation" means plants, such as trees, shrubs, and grass, which are dry, diseased, dead, or in close proximity to power lines and could come into contact with power lines, especially in dry and windy conditions, and lead to electrical faults or wildfires.
 - 2. "Qualified utility" means an electric public utility, rural electric cooperative, municipal electric utility, municipal joint action agency, or electric transmission provider as defined in section 49-03-01.5.
 - 2.3. "Wildfire mitigation plan" means a plan submitted to the commission or the qualified utility's board of directors in accordance with this chapter.

If an electric public utility or electric transmission provider submits a wildfire 15 mitigation plan, the plan must be updated and resubmitted to the commission every 16 threetwo years. 17 <u>2.</u> A rural electric cooperative, municipal electric utility, or municipal joint action agency 18 may submit a wildfire mitigation plan to its board of directors. The electric cooperative, 19 municipal electric utility, or municipal joint action agency shall publish on its website all 20 wildfire mitigation plans within thirty days of approval from its board of directors. If a 21 rural electric cooperative, municipal electric utility, or municipal joint action agency 22 submits a wildfire mitigation plan, the plan must be updated and reapproved by the 23 board of directors every threetwo years. 24 <u>3.</u> The preparation and publishing of, and compliance with, the qualified utility's wildfire 25 mitigation plan constitutes prima facie evidence a rebuttable presumption that the 26 qualified utility exercised a reasonable standard of care. 27 Annual report. 28 An electric public utility or electric transmission provider with a wildfire mitigation plan 1. 29 on file may submit an annual report detailing the utility's compliance with the plan to
