Sixty-ninth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, January 24, 2025

The Senate convened at 12:30 p.m., with President Pro Tempore Bekkedahl presiding.

The prayer was offered by Pastor Allen Finger, Bismarck Baptist Church, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senator Larson.

A quorum was declared by the President Pro Tempore.

MOTION

SEN. KLEIN MOVED that SB 2311 be returned to the Senate floor from the **Education Committee** for the purpose of withdrawal, which motion prevailed.

REQUEST

SEN. BARTA REQUESTED the unanimous consent of the Senate to withdraw SB 2311. There being no objection, it was so ordered by the President.

CONSIDERATION OF AMENDMENTS

SB 2113, as engrossed: SEN. HOGAN (Human Services Committee) MOVED that the amendments (25.8094.02001) be adopted and then be REREFERRED to the Appropriations Committee with DO PASS, which motion prevailed on a voice vote.

Was read the first time and referred to the Workforce Development Committee.

FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILL

HB 1038: A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the department of commerce for an uncrewed aerial vehicle replacement program and a state radar data pathfinder program; to provide for a report; and to declare an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry** and **Business Committee**.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Klein's motion.
