- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 25-13 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the certification and sale of assistance animals; to amend and reenact
- 3 section 25-13-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions associated with
- 4 assistance animals; and to provide a penalty.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 25-13-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 **25-13-01.1. Definitions.**

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- 9 For purposes of As used in this chapter "service:
- "Assistance animal" means an animal, other than a service animal, that works,
  performs tasks, or provides therapeutic emotional support for an individual with a
  disability.
  - 2. "Health care provider" means an individual or facility licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized by law to administer health care, for profit or otherwise, in the ordinary course of business or professional practice including a licensed medical doctor, physician's assistant, nurse practitioner, counselor, therapist, clinical social worker, or psychologist
- 18 3. "Health care services" means services rendered by a health care provider within the
  19 scope of the provider's license.

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<u>C.</u>

1 "Service animal" means anya dog or miniature horse trained to do work, perform 2 tasks, or provide assistance for the benefit of an individual with a disability. The term 3 includes a dog trained to provide assistance toassist an individual with a disability, pull-4 by pulling a wheelchair, lendlending balance support, retrieveretrieving dropped 5 objects, or provide providing assistance in a medical crisis. 6 <u>5.</u> "Therapeutic relationship" means the rendering of health care services by a health 7 care provider in good faith and with actual knowledge of an individual's disability and 8 the individual's disability-related need of an assistance animal. The term does not 9 include services provided by a person that issues a certificate, license, letter, or similar 10 document purporting to confirm the individual has a disability or a disability-related 11 need for an assistance animal without conducting an assessment of an individual's 12 disability or an individual's disability-related need for an assistance animal. 13 SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 25-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 14 and enacted as follows: 15 Health care provider documentation - Requirements - Prohibited acts - Penalty. 16 A health care provider may not produce documentation relating to an individual's need for an 17 assistance animal unless the health care provider: 18 Is actively licensed to practice medicine in the state; a. b. Is qualified and licensed to evaluate and diagnose disabilities and has performed a disability 19 assessment or clinical evaluation on the individual for which documentation is produced; 20 21 <del>c.</del>b. Has engaged with the individual in-person or remotely in at least two sessions 22 before issuing documentation determining the individual requires an assistance 23 animal; and 24 <u>d.c.</u> Performs a clinical evaluation of the individual no less than thirty days before 25 producing documentation regarding the individual's need for an assistance 26 animal. 27 <u>2.</u> Documentation issued by a health care provider regarding an individual's need for an 28 assistance animal must include: 29 The effective date of the documentation: a. 30 <u>b.</u> The license number of the health care provider;

The type of professional license held by the health care provider; and

1 Evidence establishing a therapeutic relationship with the individual no less than 2 thirty days before producing the documentation regarding the individual's need 3 for an assistance animal. 4 3. A health care provider may not knowingly represent or attempt to represent that an 5 individual has a disability requiring an assistance animal when an individual is not 6 disabled or does not need an assistance animal on account of the individual's 7 disability. 8 <u>4.</u> An individual may not knowingly represent or attempt to represent to a third party that 9 the individual has a disability requiring an assistance animal when the individual is not 10 disabled or does not require an assistance animal on account of the individual's 11 disability. 12 <u>5.</u> Any person in violation of this section is guilty of an infraction for a first offense and a 13 class B misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense. 14 This section may not be construed to restrict or modify any federal or state laws <del>6.</del> 15 relating to an individual's rights for reasonable accommodation and equal access to 16 housing, including rights afforded in accordance with the Fair Housing Act [Pub. L. 17 90-284; 82 Stat. 81; 42 U.S.C. 3601, et seq.] and the Americans with Disabilities Act 18 [Pub. L. 101-336; 104 Stat. 327; 42 U.S.C 12101 et seq.]. 19 **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 25-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 20 and enacted as follows: 21 Sale of assistance animals - Notice requirements - Penalty. 22 A person selling, advertising the sale of or providing an animal for use as an assistance 1. 23 animal, or providing a certificate or letter certifying an animal for use as an assistance 24 animal shall provide a written notice to the buyer or recipient of the animal stating the 25 assistance animal: 26 Does not have the special training required to qualify as a service animal; and <u>a.</u> 27 Is not entitled to the rights and privileges accorded by law to a service animal. 28 The written notice under subsection 1 must be printed in bold in at least twelve-point 2. 29 typeface. 30 A person violating this section is guilty of an infraction for a first offense and a class B <u>3.</u> 31 misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense.
