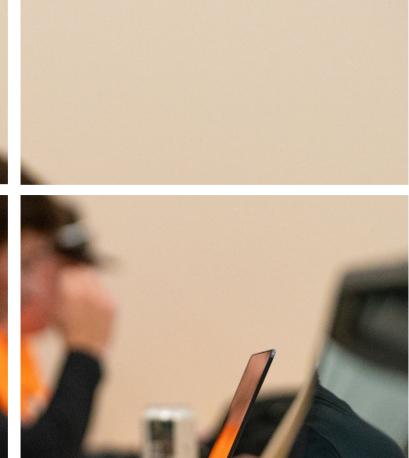

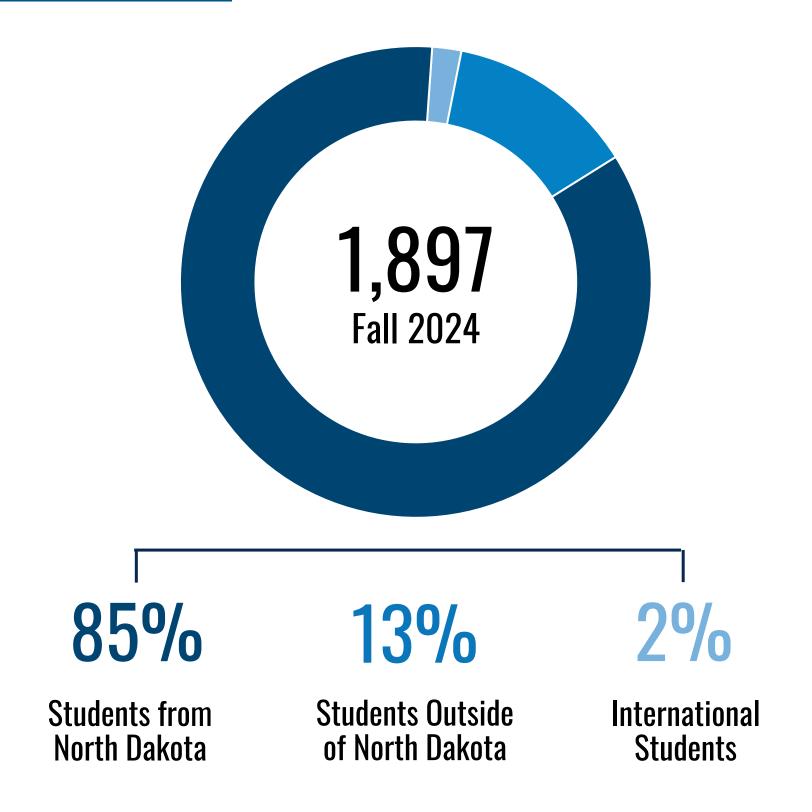


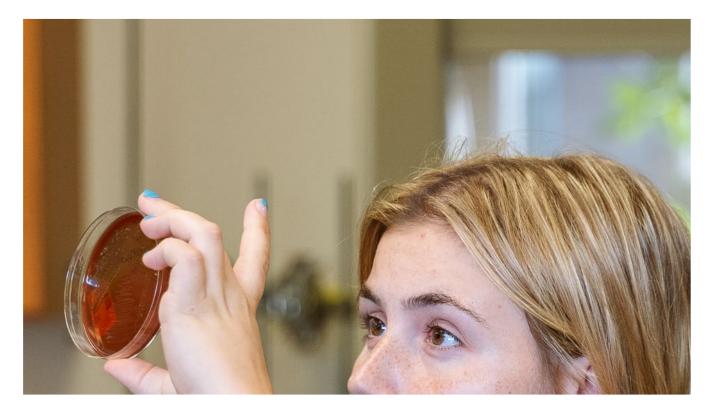
Lake Region State College is a student-centered, open-access, and comprehensive community college.

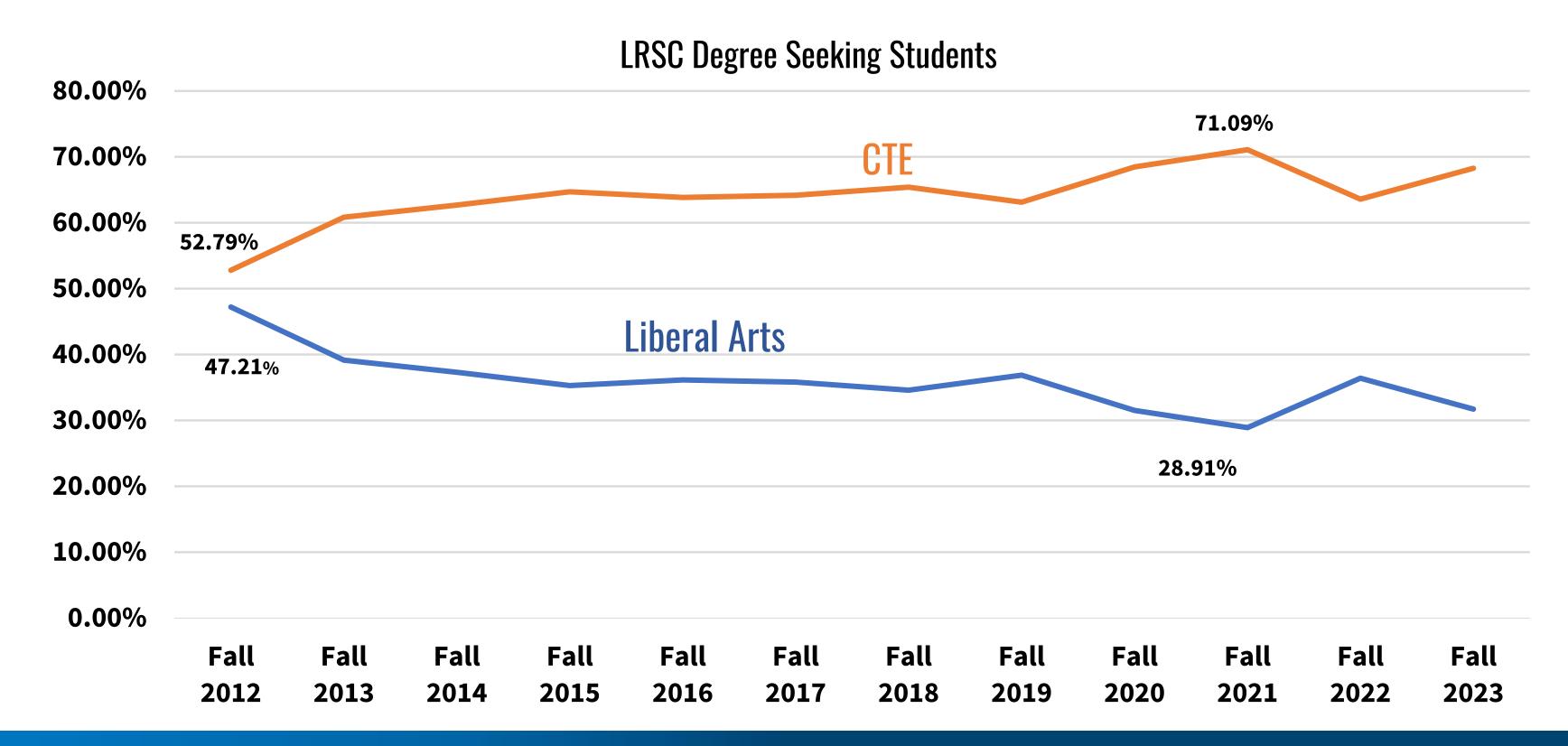




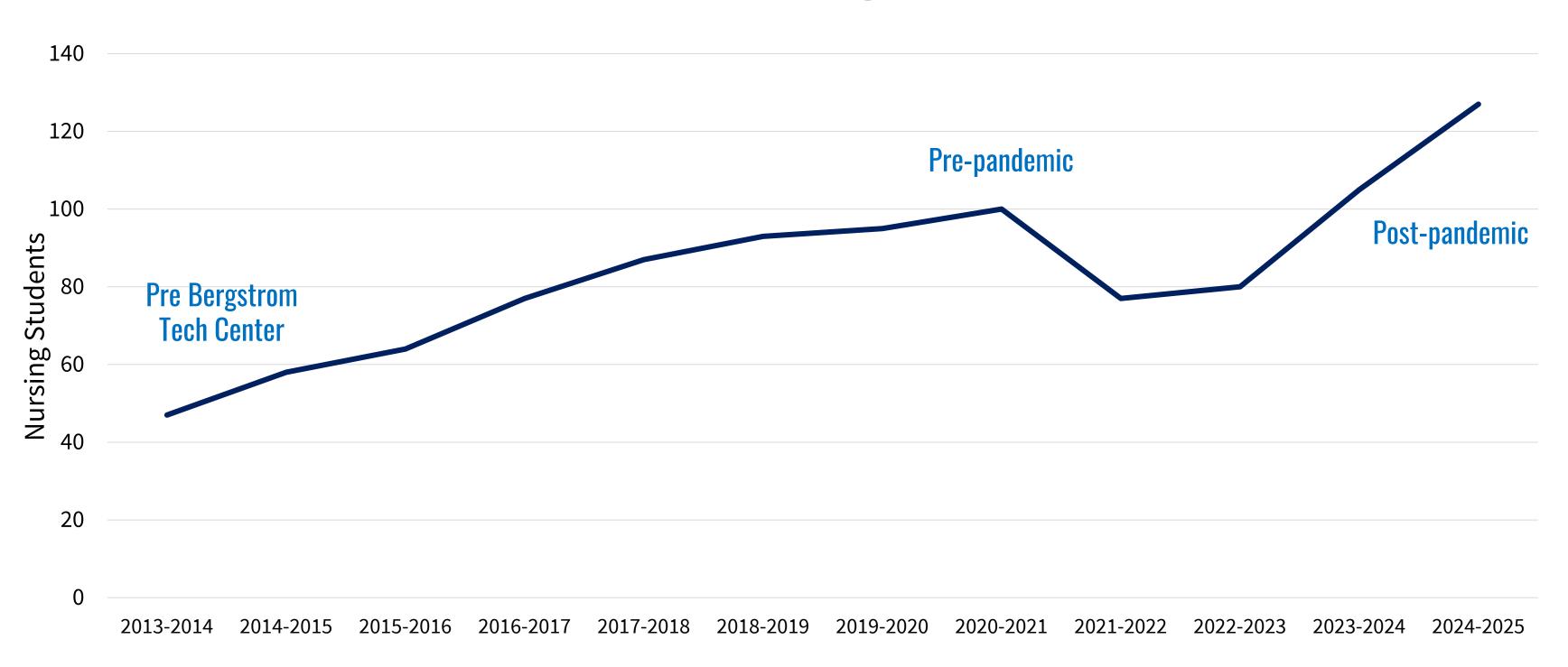




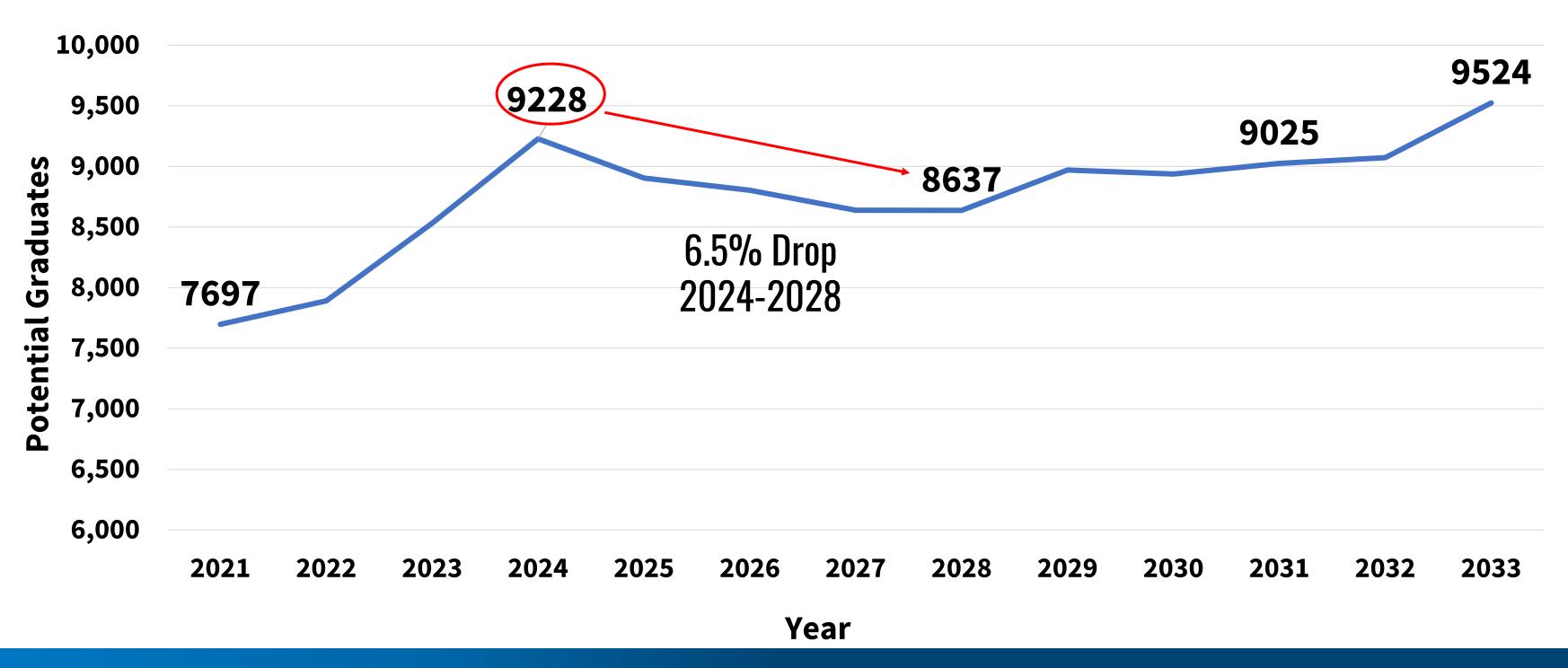
Academic Transfer vs. Career & Technical Education Majors

Healthy Composite Financial Index

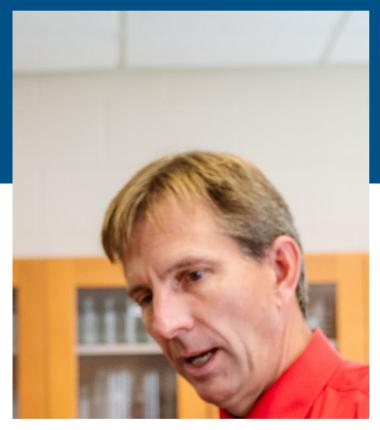

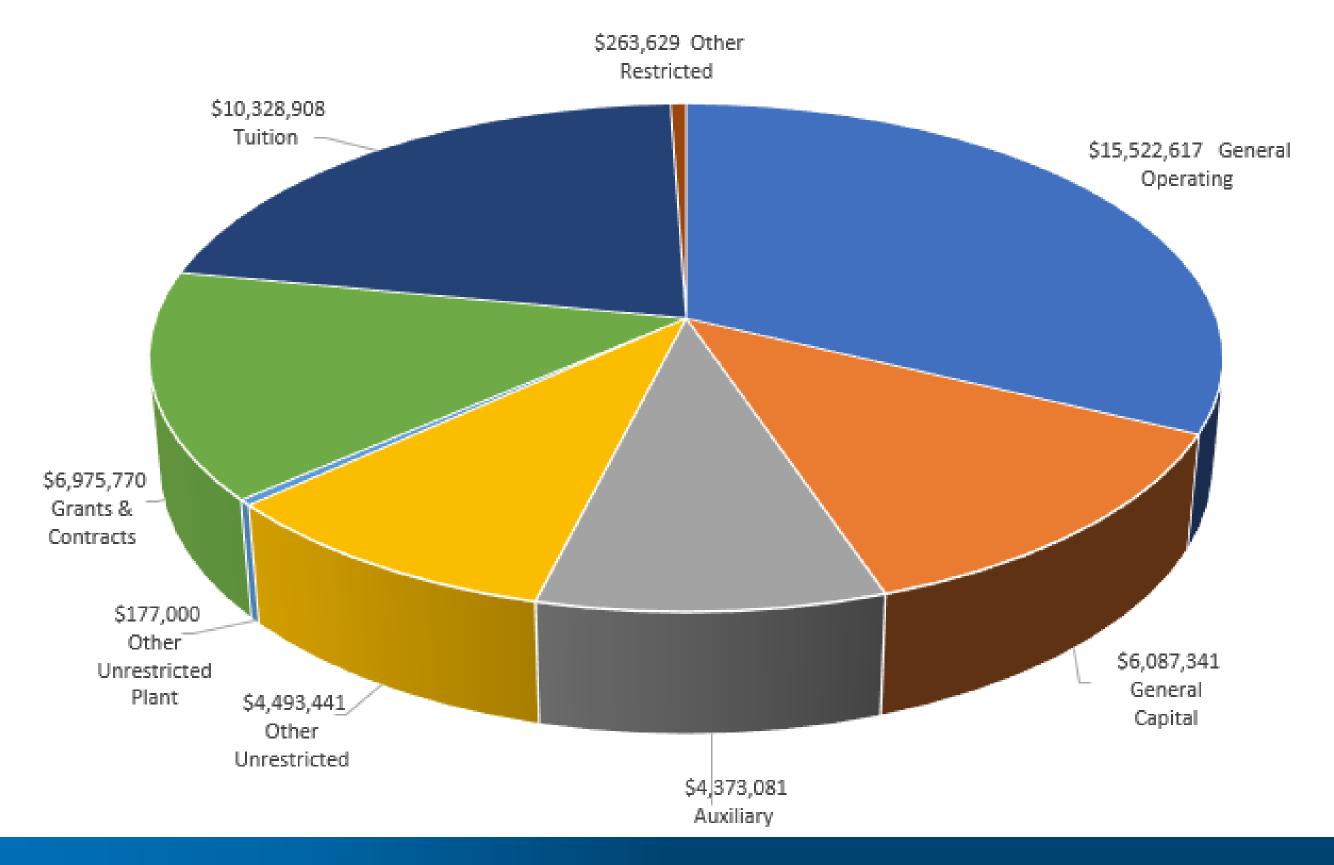

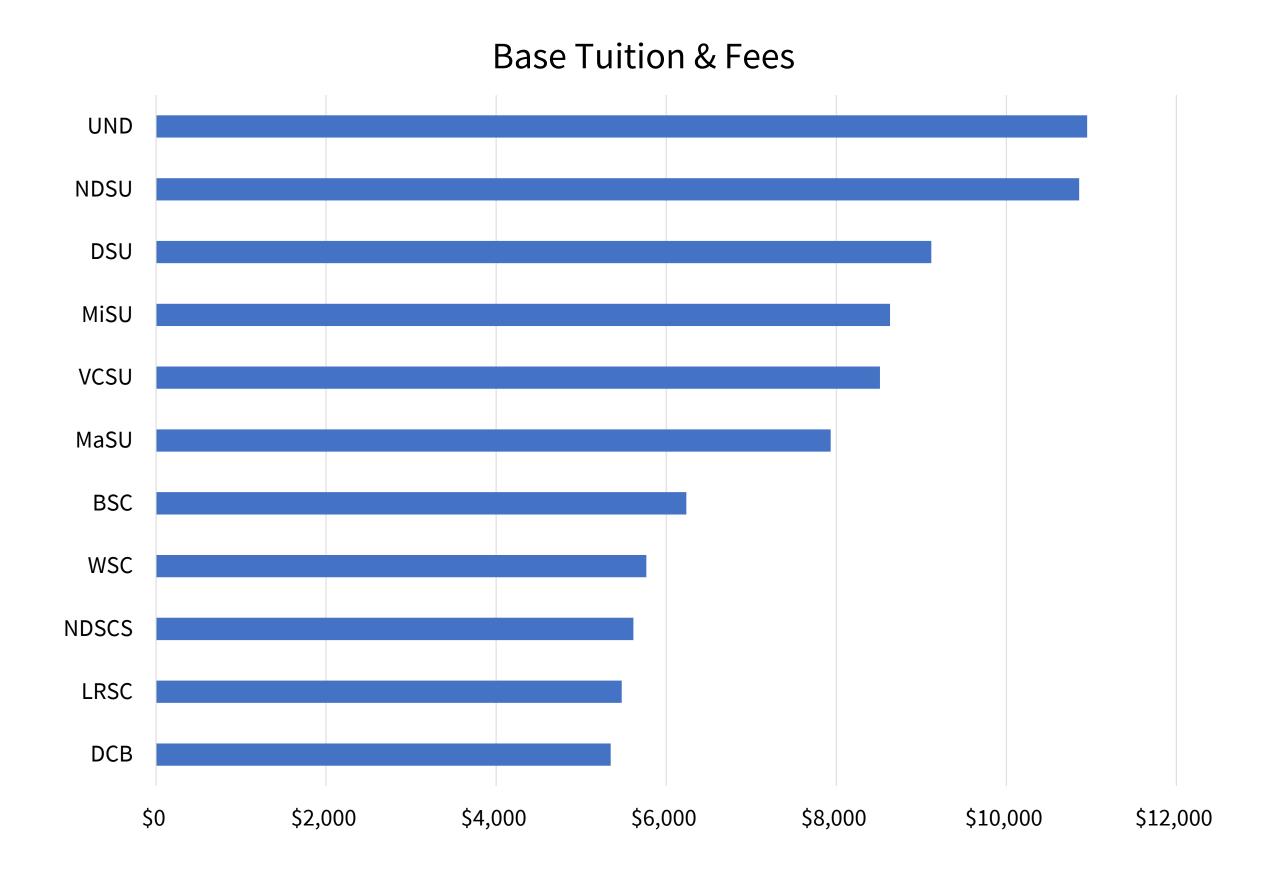

Capital Projects

Roof Restoration

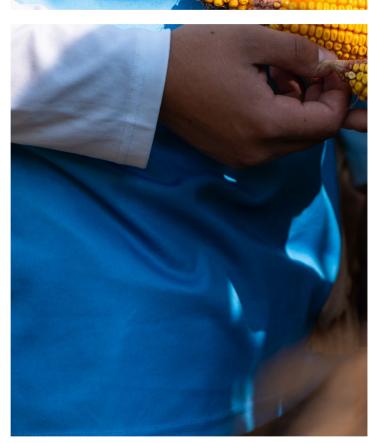
- Fluid Applied Roof Restoration: Targeting 29 roofs
 - 13 roofs by 2025-2027
 - 16 roofs by 2028-2030
- Current warranty ends 2027
- Superior membrane performance over low-cost replacement membranes more than doubles waterproofing.
- Restoration saves 30%
- Phase I (2024): Completed at a cost of \$626,000
- Request (2025-2027): \$3,200,000 for remaining work
- Cost Implications: Delay could add an additional \$3,300,000

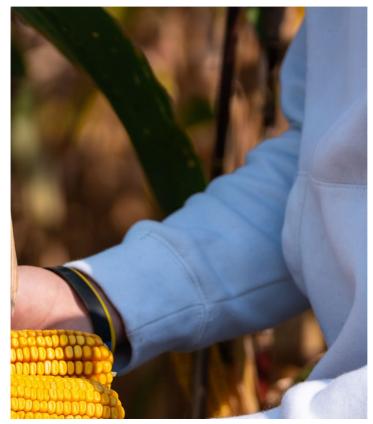


Hofstad Ag Center Parking

- Built for \$3 million; no parking included to reduce costs
- Hosts numerous ag and community events
- Joint venture with Devils Lake High School
- Parking remains a pressing need









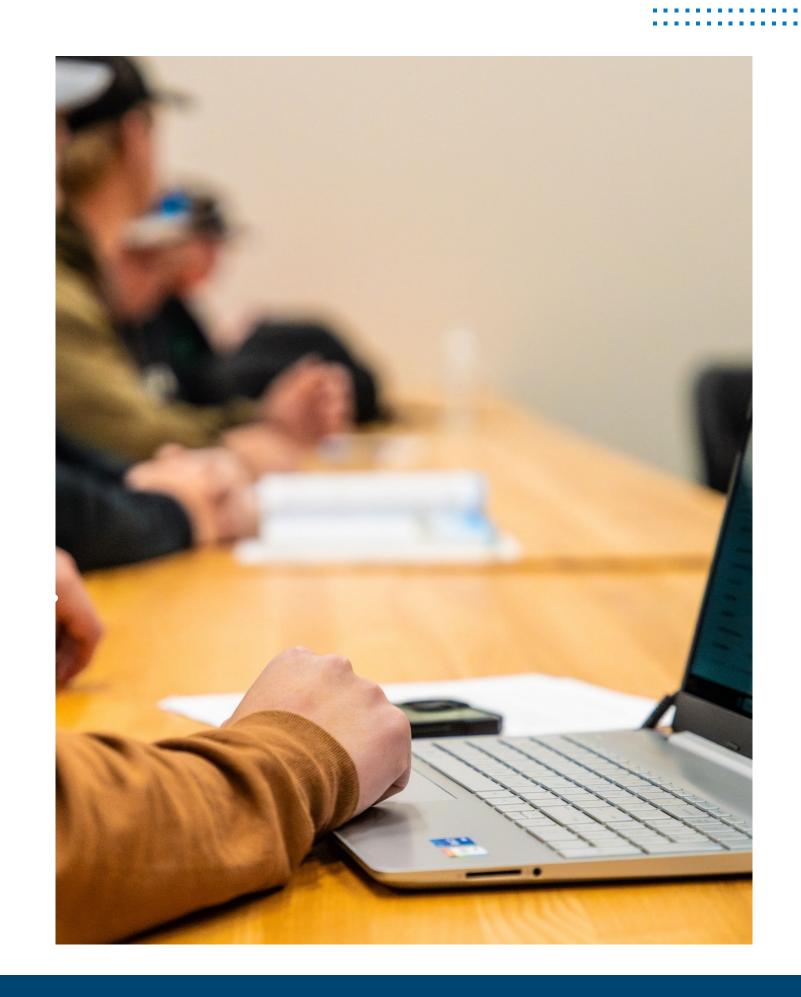


Parking, Curb & Gutter

- 2021-2023 Legislature: Original request of \$249,527 approved without funding; repair cost increased to \$1,610,921.
- 2023-2025 Legislature: Allowed Tier III funds to be used without match
 - This covered \$431,508 of the project (leaving \$1,179,413).
- 2025-2027 Request for the remainder of the project: \$2,527,141.
 - 26,940 Sq Yds of repair: \$1,179,413
 - Hofstad Parking Lot: 6,020 Sq Yds at \$1,247,635
 - North Hall Parking Lot: 410 Sq Yds at \$100,093 (16 additional parking spaces)

Voltage Project

- Otter Tail Power Company upgrading electrical distribution system within Devils Lake
- Upgrading from 4,160 V to 12,500 V
- LRSC must be prepared by 2027
- Customer-owned equipment needs to adhere to Otter Tail's new voltage requirements by 2027
- LRSC owns its own electrical system & metering
- 2025-2027 Request: \$360,200

Atrium/Corridor Renovation & Repair

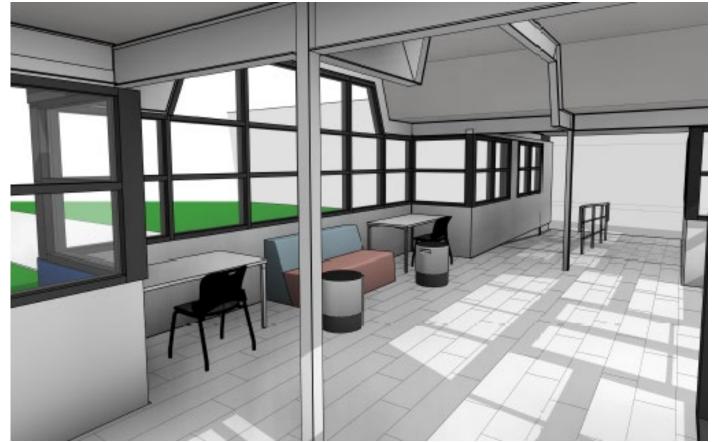
Built in 1969 (original windows & doors) to connect wings with main building

2025-2027 Request \$216,926

Listed as priority II

LRSC would like to include with the other repairs (priority I)

SBHE Initiatives supported by LRSC

- Inflation Factor Increase \$452,115 (last 4 years inflation increases total 19.4%)
- Providing state employees annual salary increases for each year of biennium
- Funding general and other fund related costs for the Actuarially Determined Employer Contribution (ADEC) and employee contribution increases related to the NDPERs Defined Benefit closure
- Challenge Grant Program continuation and funding up to \$50 million as proposed by the Governor last legislative session
 - Supports a reduced match for smaller institutions and flexibility in program uses

SBHE Initiatives supported by LRSC

- Capital Building Funds Program current (\$24M) or higher levels
 - Tier II and Tier III funds for 2025-27 biennium
- Funding the Workforce Education Innovation Program
 - Introduced by Rep. Schreiber-Beck
 - Passed by the 68th Legislative Assembly \$24 million
- Legislative action to create a Higher Education Stabilization Fund
