On behalf of Dickinson State University's Staff Senate, I am writing to express our strong support for the proposed funding allocations for Dickinson State University (DSU), including the \$48.5 million for critical renovations, the \$375,000 for campus safety improvements, and the \$1 million for the Theodore Roosevelt Center.
