- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 public instruction, the center for distance education, the state library, the school for the deaf,
- 3 and North Dakota vision services - school for the blind; to amend and reenact section
- 4 15.1-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the superintendent of
- 5 public instruction; to provide for a transfer; to provide a report; and to provide an exemption.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 8 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 9 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from other funds derived from special funds and 10 federal funds, to the department of public instruction, the center for distance education, the 11 state library, the school for the deaf, and North Dakota vision services - school for the blind for 12 the purpose of defraying the expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 13 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, as follows: 14 Subdivision 1.

SECTION 3. NEW AND VACANT FTE POOL - LIMITATION - TRANSFER REQUEST. The department of public instruction, center for distance education, state library, school for the deaf, and North Dakota vision services - school for the blind may not spend funds appropriated in the new and vacant FTE pool line item in section 1 of this Act, but may request the office of management and budget to transfer funds from the new and vacant FTE pool line item to the salaries and wages line item or the center for distance education line item within each respective subdivision in accordance with the guidelines and reporting provisions included in House Bill No. 1015, as approved by the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION -

electronic device storage grants - one-time funding. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,500,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of public instruction for the purpose of providing electronic device storage grants to school districts for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. Upon request of the board of a school district, the department shall reimburse the school district for the cost of acquiring secure containers for storing each student's personal electronic device in accordance with the school district's established plan. Reimbursements to school districts must be provided based on the cost of a selected approved product, but may not exceed thirty dollars per student subject to the school district's plan. The appropriation provided in this section is considered a one-time funding item.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$595,677,350, included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of

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1 public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30. 2 2027. 3 SECTION 6. OTHER FUNDS - FOUNDATION AID STABILIZATION FUND. The other 4 funds line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$219,250,000 from 5 the foundation aid stabilization fund for integrated formula payments, various program grants, 6 and a Native American program and textbook. 7 SECTION 7. OTHER FUNDS - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND. 8 The other funds line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of 9 \$10,000,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund for science center grants. 10 SECTION 8. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION 11 CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The superintendent of public instruction may 12 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education 13 contracts line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for paying grants for educational 14 services that were due in the 2023-25 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly 15 supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2025. To be reimbursed under this 16 section, claims must be properly supported and filed with the superintendent of public 17 instruction by June 30, 2026. 18 SECTION 9. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM. The sum of \$800,000, included in the 19 integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be 20 distributed to reimburse school districts or special education units for gifted and talented 21 programs upon the submission of an application that is approved in accordance with guidelines 22 adopted by the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction 23 shall encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts and 24 special education units. 25 SECTION 10. MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING - WITHHOLDING AND DISTRIBUTION. 26 State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of matching 27 funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for students participating 28 in the Medicaid program for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.

1	SECTION 11. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS - GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION.
2	The integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes
3	\$700,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing annual grants to regional education
4	associations, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. An annual
5	grant of \$50,000 is provided to each regional education association that exists as of July 1,
6	2025. Regional education associations that merge during the 2025-27 biennium are entitled to
7	the annual grants that would have been paid to each of the member associations.
8	SECTION 12. STUDENT MEALS - GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION. The grants - program
9	grants line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$4,500,000 from the general
10	fund for the purpose of providing grants to school districts to defray the expenses of providing
11	meals, free of charge, for all students enrolled in public or nonpublic school at or below
12	two hundred twenty-five percent of the federal poverty guideline, for the biennium beginning
13	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The superintendent of public instruction shall develop
14	guidelines and reporting requirements for the grants.
15	SECTION 13. PARAPROFESSIONAL-TO-TEACHER PROGRAM - GRANTS -
16	DISTRIBUTION. The grants - program grants line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act
17	includes \$3,000,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing grants to accredited
18	institutions of higher education to assist paraprofessionals to become qualified teachers, for the
19	biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The superintendent of public
20	instruction may award up to \$20,000 to each qualifying institution for program startup and other
21	administrative costs and the remainder of the appropriation may be used only for tuition and
22	scholarships for students enrolled in the program. The superintendent of public instruction may
23	establish policies and procedures to administer this program.
24	SECTION 14. NORTH DAKOTA GOVERNOR'S SCHOOLS - GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION
25	The grants - passthrough grants line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes
26	\$500,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing grants for North Dakota governor's
27	schools at North Dakota state university and university of North Dakota, for the biennium
28	beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.
29	1. The superintendent of public instruction shall conduct North Dakota governor's
30	schools once a summer alternating annually between North Dakota state university
31	and university of North Dakota.

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- 1 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall award the grants based on providing an 2 average cost of \$5,000 per student attending the schools each year not to exceed a 3 total of \$250,000 to each university for each year of the biennium. 4 3. The governor's schools program must provide programs related to science, 5 technology, engineering, mathematics, energy law, mental health, education, and 6 health sciences. 7 4. The superintendent of public instruction shall name codirectors at each university to 8 ensure continued collaboration of the schools at both campuses. 9 Funds may be used only for defraying expenses for students while on campus, 5. 10 including housing, dining, resident assistants, program directors, instructors, and 11 faculty research sponsors. 12 SECTION 15. EXEMPTION - INDIRECT COST RECOVERIES, GENERAL 13 EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT FEES, AND DISPLACED HOMEMAKER DEPOSITS. 14 Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-15, the department of public instruction may deposit indirect 15 cost recoveries in its operating account. In addition, any moneys collected by the department of 16 public instruction for general educational development fees and displaced homemakers 17 deposits must be deposited in the public instruction fund in the state treasury. Any funds 18 deposited in the public instruction fund may only be spent subject to appropriation by the 19 legislative assembly. 20 SECTION 16. EXEMPTION - TRANSFER - PUBLIC INSTRUCTION FUND - TRANSFER -21 **GENERAL FUND.** Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-11, if, after the superintendent of public 22 instruction complies with all statutory payment obligations imposed for the 2023-25 biennium, 23 from any moneys remaining in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of 24 section 1 of chapter 45 of the 2023 Session Laws, the lesser of \$11,165,000 or the remaining 25 amount must be continued into the 2025-27 biennium and the office of management and budget 26 shall transfer this amount into the public instruction fund for the purpose of providing program 27 and passthrough grants as appropriated in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act. The
 - SECTION 17. EXEMPTION UNEXPENDED APPROPRIATIONS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION. The following appropriations to the department of public instruction

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- are not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 and may be continued into the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027:
 - Any funds remaining from federal funds derived from the elementary and secondary school emergency education relief fund and any other federal funds appropriated in subdivision 2 of section 2 of chapter 28 of the 2021 Session Laws; and
 - 2. Any funds remaining from special funds from the public instruction fund in the state treasury, derived from reimbursements withheld from school districts' integrated formula payments for the purpose of information technology project upgrades to the state automated reporting system and the statewide longitudinal data system, appropriated in section 17 of chapter 549 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws.

SECTION 18. EXEMPTION - UNEXPENDED APPROPRIATION - STATE LIBRARY. The sum of \$150,000, appropriated from the general fund to the state library for building renovations in subdivision 3 of section 1 of chapter 45 of the 2023 Session Laws, is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this appropriation are available for building renovations during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.

SECTION 19. EXEMPTION - UNEXPENDED APPROPRIATIONS - SCHOOL FOR THE
DEAF. The sum of \$800,000, appropriated from special funds, derived from trust fund
distributions, rents, and service revenue, to the school for the deaf for boiler replacement,
pneumatic controls, and a fire alarm system in subdivision 4 of section 1 of chapter 45 of the
20 2023 Session Laws, is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended
funds from this appropriation are available for boiler replacement, pneumatic controls, and a fire
alarm system during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.

SECTION 20. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The grants line item in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,737,582 for aid to public libraries, of which no more than one-half may be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026.

SECTION 21. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-02-02. Salary.
