Madam Chair Roers and members of the Senate State and Local Government Committee, For the record, my name is Landon Bahl, and I have the honor of representing the citizens of District 17 in the North Dakota House of Representatives.

I stand before you today to introduce House Bill 1408, which proposes transitioning the North Dakota Legislature to annual sessions beginning in 2027. This bill takes a proactive approach to modernizing our legislative process while preserving the integrity of our existing framework.

Key Provisions of House Bill 1408:

- Maintains the 80-day legislative limit, this bill does not increase total session days but instead distributes them more effectively over two years.
- Shifts the legislature to annual sessions starting in 2027.
- Limits each year's session to 70 calendar days, with adjournment likely by early March.
- Provides flexibility in structuring sessions under the jurisdiction of legislative management per the amendment passed out with my testimony.
- Results in a fiscal note reduction for the biennium.

Broader Positive Impacts of House Bill 1408:

- Enhances fiscal and economic responsiveness by allowing more timely decision-making.
- Addresses the challenges of term limits by helping legislators gain experience more efficiently, ensuring continuity of governance.
- Strengthens the legislative branch to ensure it remains an equal branch of government, which would further preserve institutional knowledge and improve policymaking.
- Improves interim committee effectiveness through enhanced research, analysis, and public engagement, leading to more well-developed and thoroughly vetted policies.
- Attracts high-quality legislative candidates by making public service more accessible. Annual sessions would allow more North Dakotans, especially those unable to commit to four months at a time to serve, fostering a more experienced, diverse, and representative legislature.

Madam Chair Roers and members of the committee, House Bill 1408 strengthens our legislative process, improves decision-making, and ensures long-term efficiency in government. I urge you to support this effort to build a more effective and accountable legislature for the people of North Dakota.

 11 December following the election of the<u>its</u> members thereof for organizational and
 12 orientation purposes and shall thereafter recess until the time provided in
 13 subsection 2.
- 14 2. The legislative assembly shall reconvene at twelve noon<u>annually for a number of days</u>
 15 to be determined by the legislative assembly, but the number of days must be
 16 <u>scheduled within a seventy calendar day period each year, subject to subsection 3.</u>
- 17 <u>a. Each year, the legislative assembly shall convene</u> on the first Tuesday<u>Monday</u>
 18 after the third day in January of the year following the organizational session as
 19 provided in subsection 1 or at twelve noon on a date selected by the legislative 20 management but not earlier than January second nor later than January eleventh-

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1		of the year following the organizational session and, following. At the close of	
2		business of the regular session, the legislative assembly shall adjournrecess	
3		subject to subsection 3.	
4		b. The first week of each year the legislative assembly is convened, it shall convene	
5		<u>on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. Thereafter, the</u>

7		and Thursday. The legislative assembly shall convene on Friday only as
