A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision i of subsection 1 of section 39-09-02 of theNorth Dakota Century Code, relating to speed limitations on multilane highways; and to providea penalty.for an Act to amend and reenact sections 39-09-02, 39-09-04, and 39-09-07.1 of the
North Dakota Century Code, relating to speed limitations on multilane highways, variable speed
limits, alteration of maximum speed limits on state highways, and speed zone reduction.
limitations; and to provide a penalty.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8	- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision i of subsection 1 of section 39-09-02 of the North-		
9	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
10	i. Seventy-five <u>Eighty</u> miles [120.70 <u>128.75</u> kilometers] an hour on-		
11	access-controlled, paved and divided, multilane interstate highways, unless-		
12	otherwise permitted, restricted, or required by conditions.		
13	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-09-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
14	amended and reenacted as follows:		
15	39-09-02. Speed limitations.		
16	1. Subject to the provisions of section 39-09-01 and except in those instances when a		
17	lower speed is specified in this chapter, it presumably is lawful for the driver of a		
18	vehicle to drive the same at a speed not exceeding:		
19	a. Twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] an hour when approaching within fifty feet [15.24		
20	meters] of a grade crossing of any steam, electric, or street railway when the		

1		driver's view is obstructed. A driver's view is deemed to be obstructed when at
2		any time during the last two hundred feet [60.96 meters] of the driver's approach
3		to such crossing, the driver does not have a clear and uninterrupted view of such
4		railway crossing and of any traffic on such railway for a distance of four hundred
5		feet [121.92 meters] in each direction from such crossing.
6	b.	Twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] an hour when passing a school during school
7		recess or while children are going to or leaving school during opening or closing
8		hours, unless a lower speed is designated or posted by local authorities.
9	C.	Twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] an hour when approaching within fifty feet [15.24
10		meters] and in traversing an intersection of highways when the driver's view is
11		obstructed. A driver's view is deemed to be obstructed when at any time during
12		the last fifty feet [15.24 meters] of the driver's approach to such intersection, the
13		driver does not have a clear and uninterrupted view of such intersection and of
14		the traffic upon all of the highways entering such intersection for a distance of two
15		hundred feet [60.96 meters] from such intersection.
16	d.	Twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] an hour when the driver's view of the highway
17		ahead is obstructed within a distance of one hundred feet [30.48 meters].
18	e.	Twenty-five miles [40.23 kilometers] an hour on any highway in a business district
19		or in a residence district or in a public park, unless a different speed is designated
20		and posted by local authorities.
21	f.	Fifty-five miles [88.51 kilometers] an hour on gravel, dirt, or loose surface
22		highways, and on paved two-lane county and township highways if there is no
23		speed limit posted, unless otherwise permitted, restricted, or required by
24		conditions.
25	g.	Sixty-five miles [104.61 kilometers] an hour on paved two-lane highways if posted
26		for that speed, unless otherwise permitted, restricted, or required by conditions.
27	h.	Seventy miles [112.65 kilometers] an hour on paved and divided multilane
28		highways, unless otherwise permitted, restricted, or required by conditions.
29	i.	Seventy-fiveEighty miles [120.70128.75 kilometers] an hour on
30		access-controlled, paved and divided, multilane interstate highways, unless
31		otherwise permitted, restricted, or required by conditions.

1	2.	The director may designate and post special areas of state highways where lower			
2		speed limits apply. Differing limits may be established for different times of the day			
3		within highway construction zones which are effective when posted upon appropriate			
4		fixed or variable speed limit signs.			
5	3.	The director may designate variable speed limit adjustment zones along the state			
6		highway system. The department may install variable speed limit signs in a variable			
7		speed limit adjustment zone. In each variable speed limit adjustment zone, the			
8		director, in coordination with the superintendent of the highway patrol, may use real			
9		time intelligent transportation systems to adjust the speed limit when a speed limit			
10		adjustment would provide for the safe and efficient movement of motor vehicles.			
11	4.	_Except as provided by law, it is unlawful for any a person to may not drive a vehicle			
12		uponon a highway at a speed that is unsafe or at a speed exceeding the speed limit			
13		prescribed by law or established pursuant to law.			
14	<u>4.5.</u>	In charging a violation of the provisions of this section, the complaint must specify the			
15		speed at which the defendant is alleged to have driven and the speed which this			
16		section prescribes is prima facie lawful at the time and place of the alleged offense.			
17	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-09-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
18	amende	d and reenacted as follows:			
19	39-0	09-04. Alteration of maximum speed limits on state highways.			
20	The maximum speed limits specified in section 39-09-02 may be altered on all or any part of				
21	the state highway system by an administrative order by the director after holding a public				
22	hearing has been held. Such The determination must be based on engineering and traffic				
23	investigations with primary consideration given to the establishment of reasonable and safe				
24	speeds, highway conditions, enforcement, and the general welfare. Speed limits established				
25	pursuant tounder this section shall beare effective only when appropriate signs giving notice				
26	thereof are erected and suchthe maximum speed limits may be declared to be effective at all				
27	times or at such<u>the</u> times as are indicated upon said<u>on the</u> signs. Differing limits may be				
28	established by the director for different times of the day, different types of vehicles, varying				
29	weather conditions, and other factors bearing on safe speeds , which shall be . Differing limits are				
30	effective when posted uponon appropriate fixed or variable signs. An administrative order is not				
31	required	to lower maximum speed limits temporarily due to unsafe conditions.			

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1	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 39-09-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	39-09-07.1. Speed zones - Reduction limitation.
4	1. Except for highway construction zones under subsections 2 and 3 of this section, no a
5	street, road, or highway in the state highway system or any other township, county, or
6	state road or highway may not be posted in a manner which reduces the maximum
7	speed limit on the street, road, or highway by more than twenty miles [32.19
8	kilometers] per hour between any two signs so posted in a speed zone.
9	2. The maximum speed limit reductions between two fixed or variable signs in a variable
10	speed limit adjustment zone may exceed twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] per hour
11	when speed limits are lowered temporarily by the director due to unsafe conditions.
12	<u>3.</u> The maximum speed limit reduction between any two signs posted in a highway
13	construction zone may not exceed thirty miles [48.28 kilometers] per hour.
