CHAPTER 63

HOUSE BILL NO. 1151 (Dornacker)

DISPENSING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON ELECTION DAYS

AN ACT to amend and reenact section 5-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to dispensing of alcoholic beverages on election days, and providing a penalty.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.) Section 5-02-05 of the 1971 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

5-02-05. DISPOSAL PROHIBITED ON CERTAIN DAYS - PENALTY.) Anyone who dispenses or permits the consumption of alcoholic beverages on licensed premises after one o'clock a.m. on Sundays, before eight o'clock a.m. on Mondays, or between the hours of one o'clock a.m. and eight o'clock a.m. on all other days of the week, or who so dispenses or permits such consumption on Memorial Day, Good Friday, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, or after six o'clock p.m. on Christmas Eve, or between the hours of one o'clock a.m. and eight o'clock p.m. on the day of any statewide, special, primary or general election is guilty of a misdemeanor.

CHAPTER 64

SENATE BILL NO. 2075 (Lips)

EMPLOYMENT OF UNDER-AGE MUSICIANS

AN ACT to amend and reenact section 5-02-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the employment of musicians under twenty-one years of age in establishments where alcoholic beverages are sold, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.) Section 5-02-06 of the 1971 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

5-02-06. PERSONS UNDER TWENTY-ONE YEARS PROHIBITED -PENALTY - EXCEPTIONS.) Any licensee who disposes alcoholic beverages to a person under twenty-one years of age or who permits such a person to remain on the licensed premises while alcoholic beverages are being sold or displayed is guilty of a misdemeanor, subject to the provisions of sections 5-01-08, 5-01-08.1, and 5-01-08.2. Any person under twenty-one years of age may remain in a restaurant where alcoholic beverages are being sold if accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, or if employed by the restaurant as a food waiter, food waitress, busboy, or busgirl under the direct supervision of a person over twenty-one years of age, and not engaged in the sale, disposition, delivery, or consumption of alcoholic beverages. Any establishment where alcoholic beverages are sold may employ persons from eighteen to twenty-one years of age to work in the capacity of musicians under the direct supervision of a person over twenty-one years of age.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.) This Act is declared to be an emergency measure and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
