## **Major Legislation Affecting the Department of Commerce**

Senate Bill No. 2032 consolidates the Department of Economic Development and Finance, the Division of Community Services, and the Tourism Department into a department of commerce administered by a commissioner of commerce; creates a North Dakota commerce cabinet; and allows for creation of a privately funded North Dakota economic development foundation.

House Bill No. 1095 increases per diem for members of the Agricultural Products Utilization Commission by \$12.50 per day, from \$50.00 to \$62.50 and authorizes the payment of per diem to commission members for conducting official commission business in addition to meetings. (Passed House)
