



Major Related Legislation

Section 3 of Engrossed House Bill No. 1007 provides for a performance audit of the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Administrative Committee on Veterans Affairs to be conducted during the 2003-05 biennium.

Section 4 of Engrossed House Bill No. 1007 provides for the Administrative Committee on Veterans Affairs to develop and implement a strategic plan for the Veterans Home and to present status reports to the Budget Section during the 2003-04 interim.

House Bill No. 1029 - This bill requires a veteran's service-connected compensation to be included in the veteran's contribution to the cost of care at the Veterans Home.

House Bill No. 1095 - This bill provides that the Veterans Home general fund appropriation may be expended only with the approval of the director of the Office of Management and Budget, who may issue approvals on an individual expenditure basis or by allocations from the general fund appropriation. Currently, general fund money appropriated by the Legislative Assembly are transferred periodically to the Veterans Home operating fund whenever the fund's balance requires supplementation. The funds once transferred to the operating fund are not available as general fund turnback at the end of the biennium.

Senate Bill No. 2299 - This bill provide for the establishment of a seven-member governing board for administration of the Veterans Home. The governing board is responsible for appointing an administrator for the Veterans Home who will serve at the pleasure of the board.
