



#### **Centers of Excellence**

Sections 6 through 9 of the bill provide for the centers of excellence program being recommended by the Governor. Section 9 includes the statutory provisions for the centers of excellence program. Section 7 authorizes the department to borrow up to \$50,000,000 from the Bank of North Dakota and provides a continuing appropriation to the department to spend the amount borrowed for grants to centers of excellence. Section 8 allows the department to carry over any unspent amounts of the \$5 million general fund appropriation for centers of excellence grants into the 2007-09 biennium.

#### Major Related Legislation

**Senate Bill No. 2032** - This bill addresses a number of economic development and business climate issues, including the creation of a centers of excellence commission, and appropriates \$1,038,103, of which \$938,103 is from the general fund to the Department of Commerce for economic development programs.

Senate Bill No. 2051 - This bill provides for economic development accountability reporting.

House Bill No. 1185 - This bill continues the department's rural growth incentive grant program that under current law will be discontinued on July 31, 2005.
